CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Preschool/Lower Elementary - Rm 221 (age 3 to grade 3)

Today we will look at the calendar of the church year and understand what the different colors (green, white, purple, and red) mean.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

DID YOU KNOW



Did you know there is a plaque in the church, to the left of the organ, memorializing John Borland Thayer, who was a victim of the Titanic disaster? John Thayer was an executive with the Pennsylvania Railroad, lived in Haverford and was a member of The Redeemer. What the plaque does not mention, and you might not know, is John Thayer's wife, Marian and their 17-year old son, John Thayer Jr. (Jack) and Marian's maid, Margaret Flemming, were all on board as first class passengers and survived the sinking of the Titanic. The two women were placed in a lifeboat and Jack Thayer jumped into the frigid water and managed to find, and then climb on top of an overturned lifeboat where he spent the night. The Thayer family is all buried in the
