Real Presence - Changes and Clarifications after 18 Months of Pandemic
In the Episcopal Church, "real presence" often refers to our understanding of the
nature of Eucharist. In classic Anglican mode, the elements of bread and wine are not
literally changed into the body and blood of Christ; they remain bread and wine — but
Christ is made fully present in them. Throughout the periods of quarantine, restrictions,
prohibitions, and protocols that we've endured, real presence has taken on additional,
broader significance, most of all in how we can be most fully present to one another.
How we answer this has implications for how we design and carry out our programs. As
the initial forum of the new program year, we'll look at a number of things learned by
our pandemic experience, which will include a portion of time for questions and answers.

DID YOU KNOW

Did you know The Redeemer's physical campus benefits the broader community? In a sense the buildings are an outreach program too. We host homeless families through IHN, Red Cross Blood drives, garden clubs, an election polling site, benefit concerts, adult forum speakers, 12 Step recovery programs, a hostel for out-of-town college students, food collections, dog-walkers, comfort facilities for postal workers, and the Christmas Bazaar. In addition, many neighborhood children have learned to bike, scooter, skateboard and drive in our parking lot while Lower Merion police use it as a location between calls. Like many other community programs, the church has had to adapt during COVID and when the time is right, The Redeemer can return to sharing its physical structures with even more programs in our community.

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

New Format

This year we are trying something a little different - all our church school classes (ages 3-grade 5) will hear the same lesson each week. We will kick off the new program year together by introducing the kids to our new large group format. Each week we will gather together for a short liturgy consisting of songs, prayers and lessons. This time together serves as the foundation for the work each class will do diving deeper into the morning's Biblical or theological lesson. The goal of this new format is not only to bring a greater synergy between grade levels, but to also foster a sense of community that has been missing in the last year. We will do this together (socially distanced) and then we will break out into their separate classes for age specific discussions and reinforcement activities.

Lesson for the Day

Welcome and Introductions

This morning we start off by emphasizing the importance of community by taking time to play some ice breaker games to get to know more about one another.

Preschool (age 3 to Kindergarten)

This morning we will use the break out time to acquaint themselves with their new space, classroom manners and hands-on materials.

Lower Elementary (grades 1 to 3)

Today we will take the tim to tour our new space and to get to know a little bit about one another beyond just names.

Upper Elementary (grades 4 & 5)

Today we will take a brief tour of the new building and begin to establish the informal rapport that is so vital to the way this age group.

Confirmation

Our Confirmation class will gather for their first meeting this Sunday in the Youth Cottage immediately following the 9:30am service. Teachers and confirmands will spend time getting to know one another and getting a lay of the land.

6th-7th Grade

Our 6th-7th graders will meet in the parish house library immediately following the 9:30am service. Please come join us as we get to know one another and get a feel for the year ahead.
