GAIA's Global Health 25th Anniversary

Although we have discontinued our African Children's Mission, we are very much a part of GAIA'S GLOBAL HEALTH. Many parishioners have traveled to Malawi, with their own money, with two, Prill Bradshaw and the late Stephen Billings, visiting three times. For over ten years, ACM supported many of GAIA's projects. Twenty-five years ago, The Rev. William Rankin and Dr. Charlie Wilson founded GAIA, during the height of the AIDS epidemic. At that time 340,000 Americans were infected with HIV/AIDS but there were 17 million in Malawi. Through 25 years of work and supporters like The Redeemer's ACM, the AIDS Epidemic has decreased with education, guidance and finances. This year the U. S. government USAID stopped all donations to Malawi and other deserving countries. DID YOU KNOW

Did you know, as we approach the new Stewardship season, there is a lot to celebrate from Stewardship 2025? 331 Redeemer households supported the campaign. 26 of those donors were new, or returned, pledges. The dollars increased by 11% over the previous year. 50% of the households increased their pledges. One of the goals for Stewardship 2026 will be to ask the 34% of participants who did not change their support to consider an increase, if possible. The Redeemer will celebrate its 175th Anniversary in the fall of 2026 and we are reminded that past Stewardship support has enabled all we do as a church community today, and we are stewards of Redeemer's future.
