DID YOU KNOW



Did you know, there is a lot of preparation, and thought, that goes into each service at The Redeemer? Every Wednesday afternoon, the clergy and program staff have a Liturgy Meeting. They review and discuss the previous Sunday (what worked, what didn't, what they can do better), make final plans for the coming Sunday's liturgies and think about upcoming special liturgies. The services just don't "happen": The weekly scripture readings are assigned using the Revised

Common Lectionary ,which is used by most all Christian denominations as a cyclical guide for biblical readings, hymns and anthems are selected to embellish the readings, relevant prayers are added, eucharistic prayers and service music chosen and the sermon brings all these elements together. All these extensive preparations are orchestrated to facilitate the congregation's ability to worship.
