### Register for Church School!

We are excitedly gearing up for the start of the Church School year. This year, having the most up to date classroom rosters is important as we work to keep everyone safe and healthy. #### **New Format**

This year we are trying something a little different - all our church school classes (ages 3-grade 5) will hear the same lesson each week. We will kick off the new program year together by introducing the kids to our new large group format. Each week we will gather together for a short liturgy consisting of songs, prayers and lessons. This time together serves as the foundation for the work each class will do diving deeper into the morning's Biblical or theological lesson. The goal of this new format is not only to bring a greater synergy between grade levels, but to also foster a sense of community that has been missing in the last year. We will do this together (socially distanced) and then we will break out into their separate classes for age specific discussions and reinforcement activities.
