Faith In Action News

Faith in Action Visits Glass to Glass Recycling

Clad with our hard sole boots, orange hard hats, yellow vests and protective glasses, three members of Faith in Action went on an outside tour of the Glass-to-Glass Recycling facility by Wadsworth & Dillon Road in Broomfield on Nov. 4. We continue to learn and visit places on caring for our planet.



Celene Peck-Andreano is the Business Development Manager, who gave us lots of information on glass recycling in general and specifics to the Glass-to-Glass Processing Facility that she oversees, before we toured outside. The following is some information that she shared with us. In Colorado, only 11% of glass is recycled, which is one of the lowest in the country (Google stated up to 16% is recycled). The national average for glass recycling is 35%.

One of the benefits of glass recycling is that glass can be recycled an unlimited number of times, without loss of quality. Virgin raw materials including sand, silica and limestone from the mines in Wyoming require a melting temperature of 2800 Degrees F! Processed recycled bottles melt at a lower temperature of 1500 degrees F, saving energy costs and greenhouse gas emissions. It is best to collect glass that will be recycled in glass bins, but if

there is no access to local glass bins, you can place glass in a single stream bin, which allows collecting all single stream items in a bin, as plastic, cardboard, newspapers, etc. There are six glass bin facilities in the Denver area. The Lakewood Recycling Center is at 1068 Quail in Lakewood. Can Denver residents use this Center?

Celene spoke of the two melting facilities that are part of this glass recycling process and circular economy right here in Colorado; Rocky Mountain Bottle Company in Wheat Ridge and O-I in Windsor. It takes about 30 days for one bottle to travel the circular economy from consumer back to consumer in our state. In the Denver area, Republic and Waste Management collect and recycle our waste and recyclables and send their post-consumed and presorted recycling materials to Glass to Glass for additional sorting to yield, "cullet," which is sent to RMBC and OI to remelt into bottles.



The outside tour was interesting; we saw lots of glass in various stages of "flint" and other forms. Celene was enthusiastic with her information and the sustainability of glass. Working the Draft Detector!

After reading about the draft detector (aka Draft Check Meter!) available from Xcel Energy through many local libraries, I signed up. It did not take long to be notified that one was available and waiting at my library.



It comes in a satchel with the detector (charged and ready) and instructions on use. There is also a video on the Xcel site on how to use it. It's very straight forward.

So, I chose an interior wall to set the temperature I expect around the condo and a variance of 1 degree Fahrenheit and began checking all the windows and outside doors and wall intersections that are exterior. It came as no surprise that several leaked since the caulking was 20 plus years old. What was the surprise? The amount of the temperature variance! No wonder I am chilly sitting at my desk, next to the window!!

So, clearly to me, this was worth the effort to detect leaks, I now have a repair list based on data from the worse "offenders." All hardware stores carry "adhesive caulk" to be used all over the house. No special tool required, although a caulk gun does make the job go faster. So, the next sunny, warm day my "to-do list" is prepared! (S Rousso)







