PORTLAND PROGRESS

Work continues on the new water treatment lines along Grand River Avenue, Water Street, Two Rivers Park, and the Bandshell, as well as ongoing progress at the Plaza.

Kent Street is blooming with new planters and garden beds, thanks to the Garden Club's gracious addition of this area to their project list.

Water Street has now reopened, and efforts are underway to remove the Grand River Avenue lane shift within the next few weeks.

The large concrete structure near the west end of the retaining wall is scheduled for removal later this week or early next. Georgetown will remove the remaining building foundation alongside the remaining concrete on site, then transition to park restoration.

MWT Construction is expected to begin plaza work once these tasks are complete, potentially starting the week of July 21. Plaza completion is anticipated between late August and mid-September.


