MI Portland Downtown values and builds relationships. Relationships are how we came through the Ice Jam together. During Covid-19 no established businesses were lost, and several gained funding through support and relationships built by the DDA. Relationships are how we raised \$253,000 in public donations for the Toan Park renovations. Most recently, DDA Relationships helped raise the Plaza RAP Grant from \$140,000 to \$200,000. These are just the highlights, relationships connect us, grow and strengthen our downtown daily.
