

ORDINANCE NUMBER 3 - 2026

**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITTING PARKING ON SUNRISE DRIVE AND
DECLARING AND EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, road crews and residents have observed traffic congestion on Sunrise Drive Eastward from its intersection with Grandview until it dead-ends near 228 Sunrise Drive Shreve, Ohio 44676.

WHEREAS, this congestion has prevented street crews to adequately perform work and residents to utilize the street, can obstruct emergency services to this area, and has obstructed residential access to this street.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Shreve, Wayne County, Ohio, as follows:

Section 1: The Village hereby establishes a parking ban on Sunrise Drive between Grandview and Parcel No. 20-1063 as shown below:



Section 2: Parking on the street shall be prohibited for periods of time exceeding four hours and anyone parking on the street must remain accessible in the event the Village needs their vehicle moved to conduct Village business.

Section 3: The following progressive policy shall be employed for cars parked on the street in violation of this Ordinance:

- (a) For first time offenders, a warning ticket shall be left on the vehicle;
- (b) For any subsequent offense, the vehicle may be towed at the owner's expense.
- (c) If, at any time and without prior warning, the vehicle obstructs Village business and the owner refuses to move the vehicle or is otherwise unreachable, the vehicle may be towed at the owner's expense.

For purposes of calculating when an offense occurs, a new offense shall be deemed to occur for every event occurring 48-hours after the initial warning—including if the vehicle remains unmoved. The initial warning does not expire or reset.

If a warning is issued, it shall be deemed effective against the registered owner and his/her immediate family and/or household. Any future offence arising from any of these individuals shall be handled in accordance with subsection (b) above.

Section 4: That this Ordinance is in the best interests of the Village of Shreve and its residents.

Section 5: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance.

Section 6: That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 7: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the Village's residents to, among other things, allow the Village to effectively abate and remediate fire-damaged properties within the Village. Provided this Ordinance receives the required affirmative votes of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be enforced immediately upon its passage. This Ordinance is necessary to ensure traffic safety, access to emergency services, and accessibility by Village maintenance crews.
