Our classrooms are filled with children who are black, white, Hispanic, Asian and mixed race. We have twins. We have only children. We have children who live in big families and children who live with a single parent. We have families who have large homes, and others who are living with extended family. We have Christians, Muslims, Hindus and non-believers. We have children with autism, we have children who can't speak. We have children who run fast and others who trip over their feet. We have budding artists and others who scribble. We have children who memorize scripture and others who have never heard the name of Jesus (before coming to KKCP!)

So, guess what this rag tag group of children does - every single day. They. Play. Together. No telling others they don't belong. No shaming for the kind of car they arrived in or the shoes they wear. No mocking of accents or lack of speech or what's in their lunches.

They come to school every day to play with their friends and to learn about Jesus. And it's a beautiful thing. And sometimes they get frustrated with each other, but their teachers give them words to move toward peace. And sometimes they get angry when they can't do something. And a friend comes over to help them and they work together, and there is peace.

Peace is a beautiful experience in preschool. It gives me hope for the next generation. We teach these little ones each day that God has created them in His image - every single one of them. Every single one of us!

Romans 12:18 tells us "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone." Sure, it's a lot easier to hop online do some quick shopping for gifts for loved ones, but it is so worth the effort to work together to live in peace. As we move through Advent, my prayer is that we would let the little children lead us by example, striving to live together in peace.
