LEAGUE HISTORY

Many of the football leagues around the country have long and rich traditions and histories, however the Wessex League is a relatively recent addition to the NLS structure at Steps 5-6.

For many years clubs wishing to progress from County football had to apply to join their local semi-professional league. In the case of Hampshire League clubs this meant an application to the Southern League.

The gap both in playing standards and facilities was great and most clubs were unable to make the change. All this changed in the late 1980's when both the Southern League and Western League expanded and took in many county league teams.

Hampshire lost such old established clubs as Fareham Town, Basingstoke Town, Andover, Salisbury and Gosport Borough. The loss of so many top class clubs obviously weakened the Hampshire League and even today this loss has not been made good.

When the promotional pyramid was finally approved in the early 1980's, football clubs had a direct path via promotion to the Football League for the first time ever. It was obvious however that a majority of the Hampshire League clubs even if they gained promotion could not attain the standards of the Southern League and as a consequence an additional feeder league between the two was required.

Various schemes were launched for a Hampshire Premier League but none came to fruition. Finally in the summer of 1986 the formation of a Wessex League was discussed. It was proposed to draw clubs from the Hampshire, Dorset, Berks and Bucks, Sussex and Wiltshire FA's. After long discussions the full Football Association approved the league.

Although most of the founding members of the Wessex League were drawn from Hampshire, the new League covered a considerable area outside of the county. The seventeen founding members of the League which kicked off in August 1986 were: AFC Totton, Bashley, Bournemouth, Brockenhurst, Eastleigh, Havant Town, Horndean, Lymington Town, Newport IOW, Portals Athletic, Portsmouth Royal Navy, Road Sea Southampton, Romsey Town, Sholing Sports, Steyning Town, Thatcham Town and Wellworthy Athletic.

The most surprising move was made by Road Sea Southampton who took the

decision to drop down from the Southern League, a decision taken because the travelling costs in the Southern League had become too much for them to undertake. It was an understandable choice when one considers that playing in the higher standard often involved trips to places like Dover, Sheppey, Hastings or Folkestone on a cold Wednesday night.

Bashley were first champions of the new League, with Brockenhurst finishing last. Season 1987/88 saw the number of teams increase from 17 to 19 as two of the founder members left, both in unfortunate circumstances. Road Sea Southampton folded after their main backer financially Peter Price decided to withdraw his support and in similar fashion, Portals Athletic were unable to continue as the Company which owned their ground sold it, leaving them with no home and no alternative but to pull out. Four new teams were found however, Christchurch from the Hampshire League, Wimborne Town from the Western League, East Cowes Victoria from the Hampshire League and Folland Sports from the Hampshire League. The champions once again were Bashley, with Lymington finishing bottom of the pile.

In its third year of existence, the league was gaining in prestige and this was reflected by the fact that 17 of the 19 clubs remained in the League. The two exceptions were Steyning Town who withdrew because the distances grew too difficult for them and the two clubs based in the town of Lymington decided to merge into one stronger one so Wellworthy Athletic and Lymington Town became AFC Lymington. Bashley achieved an amazing third consecutive title triumph with Portsmouth Royal Navy the unlucky last place finishers.

1990/91 saw the league reach previously untouched heights. 20 clubs participated as Newport were surprisingly accepted to join the Southern League despite only finishing second the year before, but two new teams, Swanage Town & Herston came from the Western League and Ryde Sports from the Hampshire League.

After an exciting season Havant Town were acclaimed as champions and immediately announced that they were joining the Southern League, the third year in a row that the Wessex League has provided the Southern League with a club.

In 2004, the league absorbed most of

the clubs from its feeder league, the Hampshire League, which formed a new Division Two and Division Three. In 2006 the divisions were renamed as the Premier Division and Divisions One and Two. At the end of the 2006-07 season, Division Two was disbanded, and most of the clubs formed a new Hampshire Premier League.

Champions of the Wessex League who meet the relevant ground and financial requirements are eligible for promotion to the Southern League Division One South & West.

Champions in 2021/22 were Hamworthy United, who also embarked on an excellent run in the FA Vase reaching the semi-final stage - and they were joined in promotion to the Southern League by runners-up, Bashley.

A four-way tussle made the 2022/23 Premier Division title race one of the most absorbing in Wessex League history, with Horndean prevailing on the final night, to pip long-time leaders, AFC Portchester. Bemerton Heath Harlequins were also promoted by virtue of their superior PPG. In Division One, two former Premier Division sides made a return to the top-tier - Andover New Street the champions, and Petersfield Town - coming through two penalty-shoot out victories in the play-offs.

In 2023/24, Moneyfields produced one of the best playing records at Step 5 across the country to claim their first Premier Division title, under the League's new sponsorship of Velocity Sports. Shaftesbury joined Moneys in promotion after overcoming AFC Stoneham in the play-offs, while Hamworthy Recreation completed a League and Cup double in taking the Division One crown alongside the Dorset Senior Cup.

Andover New Street produced a club-best record in reaching the FA Vase semi-finals in 2024/25 - in a year which saw AFC Portchester become Premier Division champions and neighbours, Fareham Town return to Step 4 as play-off winners. Meanwhile New Milton Town were crowned champions of Division One having just avoided the drop only 12 months prior.

AFC Stoneham put previous play-off heartbreak behind them to run out worthy Premier Division champions in 2025/26, with Portland United also heading up to Step 4 for the first time via the play-offs. Fleetlands were crowned champions of Division One.

HAMBLE CLUB

More than one year has been traced for the formation of HAMBLE CLUB but it is 1969 that is presently deemed to be correct. Formed as Hamble FC they made steady progress through the Southampton Junior Leagues before merging with a Sunday team, called Hamble Club and adopted their name in 1981.

From the senior divisions, Hamble Club were promoted to the Hampshire League in 1993. They moved from their Mount Pleasant base to the Old College Fields and made a further move to what was then known as the Shell-Mex Ground during the 2002/03 season which remains their present home.

Wessex members between 2004 and 2007, Hamble became Hampshire Premier League founders but they failed to complete the 2012/13 season and had to start a division lower. But this heralded the start of an upturn as they gained four promotions in five years, including one in their first season back in the Wessex League in 2017.



The club was established in 1969, originally as a youth team. In 1993 they joined Division Three of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Three champions in 1996/97, earning promotion to Division Two. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with Hamble becoming members of the new Division Three.

In 2006 the division was renamed Division Two, but at the end of the 2006–07 the division was disbanded and the club became founder members of the Hampshire Premier League.

Hamble pulled out of the Hampshire Premier League during the 2012/13 season. Although they were readmitted the following season, they started in the newly formed second tier of the league, Division One.

The club were Division One runners-up in 2013/14 and were promoted to the Senior Division and went on to win the Senior Division in 2014/15.

After finishing third the following season they were promoted to Division One and then were Division One champions in 2016/17, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

Further silverware followed in 2023/24, when the club won the Wessex League Cup for the first time, beating AFC Portchester in the final at the Wicor Recreation Ground.

Progression continued in to 2024/25 as The Monks reached the play-off final following a Wessex-high finish of fourth - but just came up short with defeat against Fareham Town at Cams Alders.

2025/26 brought a third consecutive League Cup Final for the club, who finished runners-up in the Premier Division, behind today's opponents, AFC Stoneham.

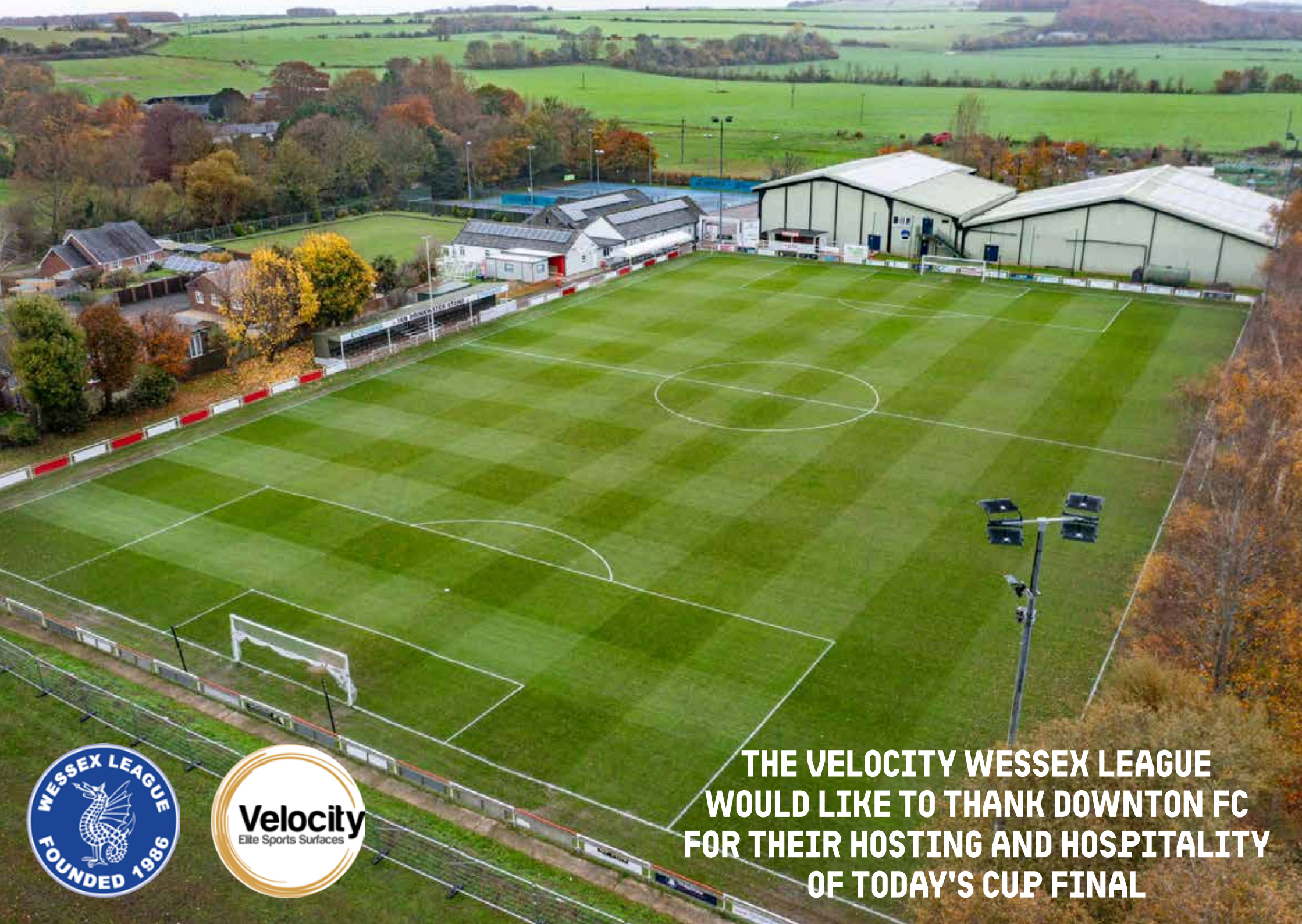
MICHAEL - Our very own kitman has brought much needed professionalism to our changing room and a couple ear tricks (ask him)

AFC STONEHAM

AFC Stoneham enter the 2025/26 season with more than 140 teams and 1,700 players.

The club was founded in 1919 as Royal Engineers (Ordnance Survey Office) FC by soldiers returning from the First World War, although records show Ordnance Survey Royal Engineers played The Gentlemen of Tenby as early as 1888. The club joined the Southampton Junior League in 1919 and began a long association with the Civil Service Ground. Nicknamed 'The Mapmakers', they are believed to have merged with the Post Office team after moving there, forming Southampton Civil Service in 1923/24 and finishing fourth in the West Division.

Royal Engineers (OSO) split from Southampton Civil Service the following year, beginning a rivalry that developed while both clubs shared the Civil Service Ground. In 1929, the club simplified its name to Ordnance Survey.

Success was limited in the early decades, although the reserves won the Southampton Junior 'B' Cup in 1937. After a spell in Sunday football from 1960 to 1966, the club returned to Saturday football and rejoined the Southampton Junior League. Progress was swift, with promotion to the Premier Division in 1973. The club won Senior Division One in 1982/83 and 1992/93, while the reserves lifted the Junior 'A' Cup in 1993. By then, the club had expanded to include a third XI and veterans side.



The first team won the Southampton Senior League Premier Division in 1996/97, returning to county football. They narrowly missed promotion in 1997/98, but finished runners-up in 1998/99 and were promoted to the newly formed Hampshire League Division One.

Recognising the importance of youth development, the club introduced a youth structure in the late 1990s, beginning with an Under-16 side and followed by an Under-18 team in 1998. The U18s won Southampton Youth Division Three in their first season. Although 1998/99 was successful on the pitch, it marked the end of an era as the Civil Service Ground closed. With support from the local council, the club relocated temporarily to Lordshill Recreation Ground before moving to Stoneham Park in 2002.

Life in Hampshire League Division One proved difficult and the club were relegated in 1999/00. After several mid-table finishes, they joined Wessex League Division Three in 2004/05. In 2006, the club adopted the name Stoneham. A year later, they became founder members of the Hampshire

Premier League and, after adding 'AFC' in 2007, won the league title in 2007/08, narrowly missing a league and cup double.

Further success followed in 2011/12 after a move to Jubilee Park. The reserves completed a league and cup double, the U16s won their league for a third consecutive season, and the first team lifted the Southampton Senior Cup for the first time, beating Bush Hill at St Mary's Stadium. The club also merged with Granley Rovers, bringing a full youth section into the club from minnows to veterans.

In 2012/13, AFC Stoneham retained the Southampton Senior Cup with victory over Brockenhurst on penalties. In 2015, the club earned promotion to the Wessex League and won the Hampshire Premier League Cup for a second time. They finished eighth in their first Wessex League Division One season, which also saw the launch of the club's first ladies' team in Hampshire Women's Division One.

The 2016/17 season saw the installation of floodlights and the club's first FA Vase campaign, with victories over Malmesbury Victoria and Longlevens before defeat to Shaftesbury. The first team again finished eighth in Wessex Division One. In 2017/18, they improved to fifth and reached the Russell Cotes Cup final, losing narrowly to Andover Town after memorable wins over AFC Portchester and AFC Totton.

The 2018/19 season was one of the finest in the club's history. The first team went 20 league matches unbeaten, reached the Southampton Senior Cup final, and were crowned Wessex Division One champions. The club also made its FA Cup debut, recording notable wins over AFC Portchester and Westfield before losing to Cirencester Town in front of more than 350 supporters. As the lowest-ranked side left in the competition, the club received national media attention and a visit from the FA Cup itself.

Promotion to the Wessex Premier League followed, but the club's first season at that level was curtailed by the Covid-19 pandemic, with Stoneham sitting

second when the season was declared null and void. In January 2020, the club moved into its new £10 million home, while retaining Chestnut Avenue until its closure later that year.

Due to the pandemic, 2025/26 will be only the club's fifth full season in the Wessex Premier League. Recent campaigns have brought consistent success: fifth in 2021/22, third in 2022/23 with 95 points and a Russell Cotes Cup triumph, second in 2023/24 with another 95 points before defeat in the play-off final, and second again in 2024/25 with 91 points.

The 2023/24 season brought a record FA Cup run to the Second Qualifying Round, including a remarkable comeback from 4-1

down to beat Basingstoke Town 5-4. That earned a glamour tie away to Yeovil Town in front of 2,500 supporters — a day that underlined the magic of the FA Cup.

The 2024/25 season brought three cup finals, with victories over Millbrook in the Southampton Senior Cup and AFC Portchester in the Hampshire Senior Cup. The club also reached the Fifth Round Proper of the FA Vase, their best run in the competition to date.

AFC Stoneham enter the 2025/26 season with optimism, ambition and a continued commitment to growth across both the adult and youth sections.

Tom is a versatile player who can play in Centre Midfield or on the right-hand side at fullback or midfield and has been with Stoneham since September 2023. Prior to that, Tom played for Chipstead FC from 2007. Tom's claim to fame is introducing the boys to their changing rom anthem by VegeDream!

Mat is a Centre Midfielder and vice-captain of AFC Stoneham. He has been at Stoneham for seven years, previously playing for Totton & Eling, Stoneham 18s and Eastleigh. Mat likes to challenge his fellow players and staff alike with thought provoking questions such as, "Would you rather fight one horse sized duck, or ten duck sized horses?"

RYAN CLUETT
