AROUND THE GROUNDS - REFLECTIONS ON THE SEASON

Ringwood Town v AFC Stoneham 18 February 2025. A three-man team headed west on a cold Tuesday night to take in Wessex League 1 Ringwood Town's Southampton Senior Cup quarter-final against high-flying Premier Division AFC Stoneham.

Despite the best efforts of the satnav to take us down ever-narrower New Forest country lanes we arrived in plenty of time at the Ringwood Community Hub. It has a different look and feel to many Wessex League venues with a new and impressive pavilion housing the clubhouse and dressing rooms and bright floodlights cutting through the winter night. There's a small stand on the far side of the pitch from the pavilion and dugouts.

Ringwood have been based at their Long Lane ground since the middle of the last century but the ground has been completely transformed over the last few years to provide a modern sporting and social facility, both for the town's football team and residents of Ringwood and the surrounding area.

The multi-million pound investment in the new facilities has come from New Forest District Council, Ringwood Town Council, AFC Bournemouth Community Sports Trust, Ringwood and District Round Table and a grant from the Football Foundation (the FA, Premier League and government charity). The new pavilion was officially opened in November last year.

There's a fair bit of AFC Bournemouth branding around the ground, as it's home to the Premier League club's community sports activities and various Cherries' teams, including their Women's National League side. On the far side of the pavilion is a 3G pitch for Ringwood's reserve and youth sides, first used in February 2023.

Stoneham put in a dominant performance to run out 5-0 winners. First half strikes by Mat Bainbridge and Ash Pope were followed up by further goals from Dan Miller, Oli Jenkins and Jamie Johnston in the second period to delight their noisy band of ultras in the crowd of 120.

The Purps advanced to a semi-final with Hampshire League Broughton, which they won comfortably to set up a St Mary's showdown with Millbrook, where Stoneham took the trophy with a 3-0 win.

Ringwood could hold their heads up though after a spirited performance and who knows, their new-look surroundings could prove the inspiration for a promotion push this season and a return to the Wessex Premier for the first time since 2008.

A LIMITED FUTURE FOR THE FAREHAMS?

(Sportsman Gossip, Portsmouth News 17/3/1967)

Where does the future lie for teams such as Fareham, who stand head and shoulders above most of their rivals in the Hampshire Football League?

Fareham who look certainties to win the Hampshire League for the 5th year in a row are too far away to gain admission to the big metropolitan area amateur leagues and the Western League, quite apart from the fact that the general standard is little higher than Hampshire League level involves too much costly travelling.

Perhaps the stimulus for the ambitious Fareham Town will spring from the FA's investigation of regional leagues. It is recognised that when clubs are consistently successful, fresh avenues should be open for them to progress and this is not peculiar to the Southern League clubs who seek admission to the Football League. The idea us to devise a scheme by which all the leagues of the country are closely connected through a

The idea us to devise a scheme by which all the leagues of the country are closely connected through a system of promotion and relegation, providing in theory at least a chance for any club to reach the top. The pattern already exists and a lot of goodwill the idea could be turned into reality.

Wessex League

Regional Leagues will be an important item on the agenda when Hampshire Football League clubs shortly hold a meeting to discuss problems and the future.

Mr Fred Tyler (Secretary of the Hampshire FA) considers that the outlet for top Hampshire League Clubs would be a Wessex League covering Hampshire, Sussex, Dorset, Wiltshire, Berkshire and perhaps part of Surrev.

Within this area are sufficiently strong clubs to form an interesting and crowd pulling competition, perhaps with promotion to the Southern League as the next step up the soccer ladder.

A Wessex League would certainly add zest to Hampshire Football and lead to a general raising of standards of football in the county.

Long time members of the Combined Counties League, Hartley Wintney have been at Step Four since 2017 and the Rec may have their work cut out on the day.

BAFFINS MILTON ROVERS also welcome old friends with SHAFTESBURY travelling down to Portsmouth. The home side look like being a force in the League this season and could well make FA Cup progress as well. At this stage last season MILLBROOK journeyed to TADLEY CALLEVA and won by the odd goal in five. Now, through a quirk of the draw, they have a chance to repeat the result, again in north Hampshire. ALTON, currently in the Combined Counties League, will welcome WINCANTON TOWN to Anstey Park. The Somerset side had a difficult first season in the Wessex League with a lot of travel and this could be a difficult afternoon for them on the artificial turf.

Newly promoted EAST COWES VICS head for BASHLEY, Champions of the Wessex League in its first three seasons. They have generally found life at the higher level difficult but may well come out on top on their own ground. HAMBLE CLUB have shown themselves to be difficult to beat in various Cup Competitions of late and a win at PAULTON ROVERS may not be beyond them. Paulton, based at Midsomer Norton, finished mid-table in the Western League Premier Division last season after relegation from the Southern League. AFC STONEHAM are another to face ex-Wessex League opponents with FLEET TOWN their visitors. Fleet have never settled in the Wessex League, finding themselves in the Combined Counties for a sixth consecutive term, but they could find Stoneham a difficult proposition.

BOURNEMOUTH travel to BRADFORD TOWN, near Trowbridge, and will have every chance against a side who have fluctuated between the Western and Hellenic Leagues over recent seasons. An all-Wessex tie sees PORTLAND UNITED travel along the South Coast to HYTHE & DIBDEN and with both Clubs not having the best of seasons last time round, home advantage may tell. BEMERTON HEATH HARLEQUINS voluntarily ended their spell in the Southern League and have been drawn away to CHRISTCHURCH. With no indication to date of the Salisbury side's current squad, prediction is difficult and the Hurn Bridge side have a chance, at time of writing the venue for this tie is yet to be confirmed.

MONEYFIELDS versus BROCKENHURST would have been a Wessex League fixture in the past but the Portsmouth side have climbed the ladder in recent seasons and should be too strong for the Badgers. SHERBORNE TOWN meet up with old Western League rivals when they make the 30 mile trip to Southern League WESTBURY UNITED. The Zebras have often proved difficult to beat since joining the Wessex League and will be fancying their chances over the ninety minutes. Newly returning PETERSFIELD TOWN after a season of Sussex by the sea travel to former members THATCHAM TOWN, who are in the Combined Counties South for the first time this season following relegation from the Southern League. Lastly an all Wessex tie as newly promoted NEW MILTON TOWN travel to ANDOVER NEW STREET. Both sides come into the game on the back of successful seasons and home advantage may just be the difference.
