TUESDAY 12 AUGUST- WESSEX LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION

Bournemouth 1-0 Brockenhurst

POPPIES v Badgers in the sunshine this evening, and something of a reunion: four starters and one sub for the Poppies having played for Brock in recent memory.

It wasn't the greatest match ever witnessed in the Wessex and – perhaps because of the familiarity – it seemed remarkably tetchy, both on the pitch and in the dugouts. A very early alarm for Brock when a cross from the left within the first 30 seconds saw Valero have to palm away a ball that was probably heading

into the net, but the game settled and the two teams were mostly pretty evenly matched. That's probably a kind way of saying that neither was quite hitting its straps.

Jake Adams, so recently a Badger, beat a couple of players as he cut in from the right but the ball ran away from him... then he took a free kick wide on the left which went through a crowd before finally being cleared... at the other end, another former Badger Jonny Davis was having an excellent game at centre back for the Poppies, snuffing out any hint of danger... until on 28 minutes, the best Brock move of the game, excellent pass from Burgess, Rossi brought the ball down inside the box but was off-balance and his shot was off target.

Ten minutes later a sharp Poppies break, initiated by Meddah, out to Adams, but his cross was too deep and Simpson could only attempt an overhead kick: on target but lacking power, caught by Valero. Neither side had really come close.

A bright start to the second half from the Badgers, within 30 seconds Rossi got to the byline and putting in a dangerous cross which evaded everyone – and suddenly, the Poppies were ahead. One long ball forward and SIMPSON, on the very edge of offside, ran through unchallenged before shooting over Valero into the far corner. An excellent finish, and now the hosts had something to hold onto. They'd also worked out that the long ball forward was a good tactic, which they employed a lot more often for the remainder of the game.

The closest Brock came to an equaliser was four minutes later when Brooks found space for a powerful cross-shot and Davis made an outstanding clearance right in front of goal; two minutes later, Luke Gray matched it, somehow clearing a free kick behind for a corner, itself not comfortably dealt with... What remained, for 35 minutes, were half-chances and scrambles at both ends. Crosses too high, passes when shots might have been a better option. The kindest thing to say about the last ten minutes is that "the game got stretched", with no real pattern or shape to it.

One good shot on target from Batley, playing as a makeshift striker, well hit but straight at Plunkett... into injury time, a good Poppies move between Roberts and Adams, shot well saved by Valero and the rebound blazed high and wide. A final corner for the Badgers – not properly cleared – clipped over the bar, and that was that.

TUESDAY 12 AUGUST- WESSEX LEAGUE DIVISION ONE

Hamworthy United 1-2 Blackfield & Langley

MANAGER Micky Hubbard kept faith with the starting eleven that performed with such conviction in their opening fixture against Fawley AFC two Saturdays ago. With Fawley's neighbours Blackfield & Langley now providing the opposition, all omens pointed to a routine home win, especially as the visitors were still looking for their first points after two games. As is more the norm now, United could also boast a very strong bench. After a rather sloppy start by both teams, it was the "Watersiders" who were to break the deadlock on 22 minutes in curious fashion. The Hammers' normally reliable keeper Will Butler dwelt too long dealing with a routine back pass from captain Louis Bragginton. He was then forced into a hasty clearance as Ewang Derick put him under pressure. Unfortunately, the ball rebounded straight into the path of Richard BAKARY who took it slightly wide, before slotting home from an acute angle off the near post, and agonizingly just inside the far post.

Although that goal did shake up United somewhat, the next major chance again befell the visitors in the 35th minute. This time Butler redeemed himself with a fine double save, from a clean through Bakary set up by a defence piercing ball by Joe Burton. Hamworthy did finally start to create some better chances late in the half. Brandon Williams was put through but fired well over the bar. Micky Hubbard's well flighted free-kick also passed just wide. However, this had been frankly a poor first half showing by the Hammers. They also curiously lacked the urgency which was so evident in their first game. and tended at times to play far too deep. Their shooting, mostly from distance was also too often off target.

Whatever was said at half time, United certainly came out with much more intent after the break. They were back on level terms just five minutes in, with a well worked goal. Jake Streams slipped the ball to Bailey ROWE on the left, who turned his defender, and waltzed past a couple of others, before firing an unstoppable curling shot into the bottom far corner.

The chances continued to come. Deem headed Hubbard's free kick just over the bar. and shortly later Hubbard's corner from the right was headed only inches wide of the far post by Bragginton. However, despite their mounting pressure as the half progressed, the Hammers just could not find that second goal. Alas for the hosts, it was the Watersiders who were to have the last say on 84 minutes with another quality goal. On a rare Blackfield break captain Jake Bartlett crossed the ball over from the right. This was met by a superb half volley across the goal by substitute Ashton GOODGER that this time gave Butler no chance.

Again, United pulled out all the stops as they fought for what should have been a deserved second equaliser, but with Blackfield keeping all their men behind the ball there was no way through. The visitors had battled all game which Hamworthy had not and earnt the three points they got at the end of it. One early defeat will not mar United's season, but this will have served as a wake-up call on Micky Hubbard's troops to play the football they are capable of from the word go.

WEDNESDAY 13 AUGUST- VELOCITY WESSEX LEAGUE CUP FIRST ROUND

New Milton Town 0-7 Hamworthy Recreation

REC stormed through to the next round of the League Cup with this seven goal demolition of New Milton. Rec scored early and never looked back, adding a second soon after. The hosts had a good spell late in the first half and Rec were grateful to keeper, Shane Murphy for a great save, before two goals from new signing, Tom Blair, right on half time put Rec in a commanding position, adding three more after the break. After just 3 minutes Rec were in front and it was skipper, Tom COOPER who got his head to a great inswinging corner from Josh Toop. New Milton rallied and Thornton fired over the bar and McGrath had a low shot deflected for a corner. But it was Rec looking the better side and Regan Mason was unlucky with a 25 yarder tipped over by home stopper, Dixon.

Moore's free-kick was saved by Murphy, before Rec doubled their lead, on 22. Ash Pope's corner was misscued into his own net by Foden. Rec were well on top and Eddie Hodge just failed to get on the end of a Pope cross.

New Milton then had their best spell and Thornton had his angled shot saved by Murphy and McCarthy-Gardiner's goalbound shot was brilliantly tipped away by the Rec keeper, the ball running to Moore, whose shot clipped the bar.

But it was Rec who produced killer blows, right on 45 minutes. Max Wilcock burst down the right and played in BLAIR to tap in his first goal for the club, from close-range and straight from the re-start the same player hit a right-foot beauty beyond Dixon for the fourth.

However it was AFC Stoneham who took an early lead, as Duarte Martins has a shot saved, Ryan CLUETT, who had an excellent game as right wing-back, slots home the loose ball under pressure. Five minutes played, AFC Stoneham 1-0 Paulton Rovers.

There is at times a fairly stiff breeze blowing diagonally across the pitch and a number of times deep crosses hold up in the wind causing some difficulty for the visitors' defence. Numerous times the hosts go close, with more good work from Cluett, and Lewis Nagle performing the same role on the left. The Purps look strong in the middle too, and captain Alex Welch has a number of half-chances in the air and with his feet. Oliver Jenkins is also playing well, but all the while Rovers, and especially Jaiyeoba, are trying hard to make something happen without quite fashioning any really noteworthy chances.

This booking happens after a fairly long delay, with around ten minutes to play, and although nothing ever gets out of hand you can feel the game take on a much keener edge from this point.

Rovers are throwing everything forward for the last few minutes - an appeal for a possible penalty goes unheeded, the goalie is going up for corners, Stoneham fans are seriously worried. In the 7th minute of added time a ferocious shot really causes a stir, it looks goal-bound but in the end it doesn't even go out for a throw in let alone a corner.

And then it is all over, Stoneham progress to the next round, while Paulton Rovers will feel that a replay was on the cards towards the end of the game. Dan Miller deserves a mention for the hosts, in particular his aerial prowess at both ends served Stoneham very well, in fact he hit the post with a header in the second half. Player of the match in my view would go to Ryan Cluett, not just for the goal, for a very good performance all round.

KEVIN DAWTRY

Sad news from Fawley AFC this week, letting us know that Kevin Dawtry, a former player and Manager there in the Wessex League, passed away on Wednesday after losing his battle with cancer.

Kevin was a former professional with Southampton, AFC Bournemouth and Crystal Palace.

He grew up a stones throw from Fawley's ground and after his professional career he played all of his football locally. He was also manager at Totton & Eling for a few years.

He was recognised as a good coach as well as a gifted footballer and will be missed by all that knew him across the Waterside and beyond.

On behalf of the League I extend sincere condolences to family and friends at this difficult time.

ONLY THE CAPTAIN

As part of the recent changes to the Laws of the Game (2025/26) approved by IFAB in March, the "*Only the Captain*" protocol will be applied across all competitions in England starting from the new season.

Purpose and Rationale

The protocol is designed to strengthen respect between players and referees by formalising that only the team captain may approach the referee to discuss key decisions. The aim is to reduce incidents of mobbing, dissent, and intimidation of match officials-improving the environment for everyone involved in the game.

Key Points

- Normal, respectful interactions with referees are still permitted; however, dissent (by word or action) remains a yellow card offence- even for captains.
- Only the captain from each team is allowed to approach the referee on major decisions.
- Captains are responsible for ensuring teammates stay away from the referee during these moments.
- Referees may delay the restart to allow captains to communicate messages back to their teams if necessary.

Additional Details

- If the goalkeeper is the team captain, an outfield player must be nominated to fulfil this role for referee interactions.
- A "captain-only zone" of 4 metres will be established around the referee; no other players are permitted within this area.
- Any non-captain entering this zone should be cautioned for dissent by action. If multiple players enter, at least one must be cautioned, and the incident will be reported to the relevant authorities.
- Competition organisers are encouraged to introduce sanctions for repeated breaches across the season.

National Implementation

This protocol will be implemented consistently across:

- All professional competitions
- The National League Pyramids
- County FA-administered football

The approach is to create alignment and consistency from the top tiers to grassroots, improving behaviour towards match officials at every level.

Education and Communication

The new initiative is currently being rolled out to referees, County FAs, Referee Development Officers, and other stakeholders to ensure clear understanding and consistent application.

All leagues have been instructed to send communication to clubs to ensure teams are fully aware of the expectations and can prepare accordingly.

Although IFAB have included an arm signal to initiate the protocol at these levels, in England we will not adopt this. Referees will manage the protocol themselves, using their existing match management skills.

THE LAST WORD

A good return for the League in the Emirates FA Cup this afternoon.
