SUNDAY 24 AUGUST

Isuzu FA Vase First Round Qualifying- AFC Aldermaston 0-0 Bristol Telephones [3-2 on penalties]

WHAT better way to spend your birthday than with a little FA Vase action on a sunny Sunday afternoon? A crowd of 80 convened in Waterside Park, the home of Thatcham Town, as AFC Aldermaston welcomed Bristol Telephones in the first round qualifying. Whoever triumphed in this game would be dreaming of ten more victories to lift the trophy at Wembley on May 17th, 2026.

The sun streamed down for this 2pm kick-off, and once again the playing surface was showing signs of the lack of water this year. After a shaky start by both teams, it is Bristol Telephones who fashion the first real chance when their number 9 breaks down the left before a searching low cross across the box beats the keeper but neither number 8 or 10 can connect and ultimately fail to get a shot on target from a very acute angle. (Sorry for lack of names, a team sheet has proved impossible to track down). As early as the seventh minute Aldermaston's Lewis Small is proving a handful with an exceptionally long, and accurate, throw-in-something Aldermaston use to good effect throughout the game.

A chance for each team follows, before on 16 minutes Kartel Forde fails to head back to his own keeper from a quick Bristol breakaway. Number 10 nips in and takes the ball, but shoots in to Sam Baldock in goal, who responded well to the threat.

As the half goes on The Atom Men grow in confidence and the pressure starts to build. Something has to give, as they try to split the visitor's defence. They have a number of good chances but it remains goalless at the break.

Still the home team starts the second half brightly too - on 50 minutes a teasing corner makes a defender head it when the keeper could have claimed, another corner - this time no one connects, but Small is again causing havoc with his resulting long throws. A needless foul relieves the pressure, and Bristol Telephones are let off the hook. 56 minutes played and it is Aldermaston breathing a sigh of relief - a deep free-kick for the visitors on the right ends up missing everyone, including the keeper, and the ball finds its way in to the net. An offside flag is raised, no goal. Moments later Telephones have a corner, number 5 can't quite get his head to it, number 6 smashes the ball goalwards, but over.

By the time the clock reaches 75 minutes the home team have started to live a little dangerously allowing the visitors a succession of half chances. Indeed, 7 minutes later Telephones have the best chance of the game - a long throw by their number 3 is cleared by Sam Baldock, only for substitute number 17 to shoot, forcing Baldock to make a smart save. Bristol Telephones have one cleared almost off the line just before the end, and a massive penalty shout turned down on 91 minutes.

And so to penalties - Bristol Telephones go first and each team scores their first spot-kick. Then it turns in to the Sam Baldock show. He saves Telephones second well and then their third with an especially fine save. Telephones bring it back to 2-3 with their fourth, before Josh Lambden steps up to put the hosts through - but he hits the post! Telephones send up their captain to keep them in the competition, he runs up confidently but puts his effort over the crossbar and in to the bushes in the field behind the goal. AFC Aldermaston are ecstatic and proceed with a 2-3 win on penalties. Sam Baldock walks away the hero, and deservedly the man of the match.

VICS welcomed local rivals Cowes to Beatrice Avenue for this League Cup first round tie. Manager Alex Smith still having to juggle his side with Liam Newbold, Raff Boyd-Kerr, Aedan Coode, Kudzi Mazambara, Harrison Yates and Jake Wright all carrying injuries, but Liam Triggs and Jordan Chapman were both fit to start. very good crowd of 487 made the trek to East Cowes in anticipation of another great game between these two Wessex premier league sides.

Cowes had the first sniff of goal on 5 minutes Jared Tout-Waters forced Alex Ram into a decent save. Connor Kelly had to be alert to save an effort from Connor Kelly on 10 minutes.

Vics took the lead on 14 minutes, a powerful effort from Liam Triggs stretched Ed Hatt, the rebound fell to Scott Jones whose effort was blocked but Jacob REYNOLDS was first to the ball to fire home from 6 yards. Jordy Cook had an effort that went wide on 27 minutes. The game was pretty even at this point, both sides playing some good football. George Carter-Knight met a beautiful Scott McFarlane cross, on the volley on 38 minutes only to see Ram pull off a great save.

Cowes had work to do in the second half and Tout-Waters effort on 47 minutes sailed just wide, 4 minutes later though the Yachtsmen were level, George CARTER-KNIGHT's 20 yard looping effort flew past Ram in Vics goal.

Scott Jones effort on 61 minutes was just over the crossbar, a minute later and Jacob Reynolds was sin binned for something he said to the official. The game went a bit flat with Vics having to contain the 11 of Cowes.

The best chance of the game fell to Jacob Reynolds in the 81st minute, a great cross into the box picked out the Vics goalscorer all alone 6 yards out, with time and space he chose the header and Hatt saved easily.

The game was on a knife edge now 90 minutes on the watch, but Cowes worked one very late opening and Fin PHILLIPS calmly placed the ball wide of Ram into the Vics net.

HAMBLE CLUB against BAFFINS MILTON ROVERS would have been a difficult result to predict last season but the Portsmouth club seem a shadow of their former selves so far this time round. LAVERSTOCK & FORD always doughty Cup fighters should be too strong for TOTTON & ELING at The Dell but MILLBROOK will not find a seemingly rejuvenated FOLLAND SPORTS easy opposition at Test Park.

Two more "local ties" and EAST COWES VICTORIA reward for a comeback victory over Brockenhurst is a long and difficult trip to SHERBORNE TOWN while lastly WHITCHURCH UNITED, unbeaten to date as this is written, entertain BOURNEMOUTH and may well fancy their chances.

That leaves eight matches where our Clubs face "foreign" opposition making prediction difficult largely through lock of knowledge on the writer's part. FRIMLEY GREEN will no doubt be meeting up with old opposition from their Combined Counties days when they travel to Addlestone, near Weybridge to meet Abbey Rangers, who currently top the Combined Counties Premier Division South with 12 points from five games. COVE SPORTS entertain former Wessex League side Alton who lie second to Abbey Rangers in the League and could have the upper hand on the day.

AFC ALDERMASTON, after their Sunday victory, head for Wiltshire and Devizes Town who finished third in Western League Division One last season and have 11 points from their first five outings this term. Aldermaston incidentally have never progressed further than this stage of the Vase. CHRISTCHURCH have something of a "banana skin" trip to Infinity. Their hosts had a rather chaotic attempt at the Wessex League, in 2021/22 but after re-grouping in the Hampshire Premier League they now play in the Southern Combination – the old Sussex League - Division One and with numerous ex-Wessex players in their line-up are acquitting themselves well on their now home ground in Sidlesham.

AMESBURY TOWN are also heading for Sussex, and coincidentally only four miles from Sidlesham to face Selsey, also members of the Southern Combination League and currently with just one point from their opening four League fixtures. Amesbury are enjoying a good season so far and must have a fair chance of progressing.

HAMWORTHY UNITED will also be on the road heading for another former Wessex League side in Warminster Town. The Wiltshire side moved across to the Western League in 2012/13 and have since largely figured in Division One and at present have garnered eight points from their opening six fixtures. HAMWORTHY RECREATION have home advantage with Midhurst & Easebourne heading to the Magna Road ground, the visitors have only two points from five games so far in the Southern Combination Premier.

Last up is NEWPORT who, like East Cowes Vics, have a long and awkward trip to Dorset and, in their case, Sturminster Newton United. Their opponents are in just their second season in both the Western League and the FA Vase after being long time members of the Dorset Premier League and head the table with 12 points from 5 matches- and give the impression of being a well-run club "on the up", Newport defeated Pagham on penalties in the last round, meaning that all three of our Island sides progressed to this round by the penalty route. Must surely constitute a record of some sort!
