WITH second placed Fleetlands having dropped just two points in their last seven games, improving Hamworthy United would certainly have their work cut out in front of a fair crowd of 122. They were at least boosted by the return of Josh Malpas, who was unavailable last week. An unwell Louis Bragginton however sadly had to miss out, as did Bailey Rowe, still not recovered from his ankle injury. Tom Lanham was also welcomed back among the subs after his long-term knee injury.
