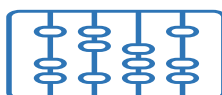

VELOCITY WESSEX LEAGUE CUP FINAL- Hamble Club 3-2 AFC Stoneham

Wessex League Cup Final: third year in a row for Hamble Club with one victory and one defeat – and for the second year in a row, a match against the league champions who were looking for the league and cup double. For the Purps, the first of four cup finals as their closing games of the season over the next two weeks, culminating at Wembley...

A brilliantly entertaining, brilliantly intense game, worthy of a cup final – edged by the Monks who twice came from behind before claiming the trophy for the second time in three years. Hamble almost made the perfect start: 30 seconds on the clock, a chipped pass over the top to Braydon Douglas, in behind the defence, lobbed keeper Callum Lee – bounced back off the bar. Early warning!

Douglas continued to be the obvious out-ball, even after Stoneham settled and worked their way comfortably into the game – three further times that he was sent clear down the right, one near post shot and two crosses which were scrambled away. But on 15 minutes, the Purps took the lead with a wonderful

goal, Duarte Martins securing the ball down the left wing and a perfect pass laid back to Tyrrell SAMPSON, who took the ball into the box and shot across Newman into the far corner. Any thoughts that the pattern was set were quickly dispelled – the Monks came straight back, Taylor put in a cross which was only half-cleared to the edge of the box and Matt CASEY rifled into the roof of the net to level things up on 17. Overall, Stoneham were enjoying more of the possession and staying calm on the ball, but Hamble had their outlets, especially Douglas, and both teams were keeping each other honest. Almost a second for Stoneham on 27 – a deep free kick from Fee to the back post, superb leap and downward header from Martins, brilliantly saved by Henry Newman. The Purps were having to stay switched on in defence but they were coping pretty well and they did duly re-take the lead from a corner – this wasn't a beautiful goal, players and ball in a ruck inside the box, both sides claiming for fouls before MARTINS poked home. Martins might then have slid Sampson in on goal but his pass was short... up the other end, Douglas again, excellent challenge from Cade Dyer led to a corner, cleared up field by Stoneham to Fee who took the ball down, beat his man and played what looked like the perfect cross to Sampson, whose shot whistled over. It would have been another belter of a goal, but not to be.

OK, second half – Hamble Club locked on from the start, coping well with some lovely flowing football from Stoneham which brought no clear chances. Even so, the Monks needed a spark and on 58 minutes they brought on Chase Michel – and within a minute he had them level, another great run by my man of the match Braydon Douglas, Miller should have done better but Douglas whipped in a great cross and MICHEL was brave and got the connection inside the six-yard box. Three minutes later, Michel again, drifting past players and cutting inside, taken out on the edge of the box: DOUGLAS stepped up and scored from 20 yards to put the Monks in front. It looked pretty central but there didn't seem to be a deflection – either way, 3-2, half an hour to play.

The wonder is that there were no more goals, Hamble should have had one within two minutes when Douglas put in another outstanding cross and Michel this time made no contact as the ball whistled through everything. More flowing football from Stoneham, this time inspired by sub Lewis Nagle – Sampson's shot went just wide of the far post. 74 minutes, a header from Dan Miller hit the inside of the post and seemed to bounce back into Newman's grateful arms... five minutes to go, Martins hooked a shot from the edge of the box which went just over the bar... but by now Stoneham were getting a bit frantic and had forgotten to play, which was just fine by the resilient Monks. And then the dramatic final note – three minutes into stoppage time, one last desperate attack, Callum Laycock seemed to have levelled things up for Stoneham but there were loud complaints from the Monks and after consulting with his assistant, referee Kettley disallowed the goal and showed Laycock a red card. Too far away for me to see – and the assistant on our side also had no idea what had happened – but it transpired that he had used his hand to put the ball in the net. Hamble saw out the remaining minutes and that was that.

ALDERSHOT SENIOR CUP FINAL- Westfield 1-0 Yateley United

IT was a dull evening at the Recreation Ground for the Aldershot Senior Cup final. The contestants were Westfield, from the Isthmian League South Central, and Yateley United, from Wessex Division 1, or step 4 against step 6 in the National League System. Both teams had differing outcomes from play-off finals over the previous weekend, the Woking-based side failed in theirs whilst United were successful. Westfield are no strangers to this final, making their third appearance in four seasons (winners in 2024) whilst the only time Yateley had been represented in the final was in 1975, when Yateley FC (one of the component parts of the present-day United side) were defeated.

Following a delay to the kick-off, oddly due to minor repairs to the pitch, the game got under way and United defender Josh Blackwood got in a fine intervention as Trey Masikini was put in a good position. Westfield had started the better of the teams and they took the lead on 19 minutes when MASIKINI had space wide left, moved inside and still unchallenged, took a shot from around 25-yards that curled inside the far corner.

Westfield then embarked on a fine passing move, easily into double figures, which resulted in Andy Crossley's ball into the box being headed over by Tom Smith.

Yateley, coming into this having won an impressive 15 consecutive games, were struggling to make an impact but defender Callum Scott did well to intercept as Aderi Dede tried to work a shooting chance. Yateley got forward occasionally and they almost levelled when they won a free kick on the left and Harvey Seeman's lovely delivery was just a fraction too high for both Tyler Robinson and Blackwood at the back post. United tried to get level before the break but 'Field defender Manolis Gogonas got in a fine interception as Lynford Sackey's cross intended to find Nathan Connolly. Following that, Connolly shot at the keeper having been set-up by Robinson whilst Callum Wright received the ball from a defensive header but his rushed effort cleared the bar.

Yateley keeper Henry Pidgeon made a smart save to tip behind from Dede, who shortly after fired a decent chance over. Blackwood then defended well for Yateley, first to deny the troublesome Dede and then to clear a Michael O'Connor corner. As Westfield searched for a second goal Dylan Merchant headed just wide. Yateley's Robinson appeared to be onside but would have been disappointed to have skied a decent shooting chance.

Those in the ground gave a collective gasp as United's Lewis Wilson put in a dangerous tackle in midfield and this resulted in an inevitable straight red card to make their task more difficult. Late on, both Dede and Billy Montague put chances wide which could have put the result beyond doubt. They almost paid for that too, all outfield players forward for a stoppage time Yateley free kick and in the melee a shot went through bodies and rebounded from the post and in the final throes more good defending by Westfield kept the ball out.

This was always going to be a tough task for United but they showed battling qualities and resilience against a quality opponent and it was a fair outcome. So, from the likes of Hill, Bassett and Bathurst from the Yateley FC team of '75 to the United side of today, the outcome, a 1-0 defeat, was just the same. It appears unlikely that a Yateley side will take quite so long to get to this final again and perhaps United will lift this most impressive old trophy on that next occasion.

RUSSELL-COTES BENEVOLENT CUP FINAL- AFC Stoneham 5-2 Fareham Town

AFC Stoneham demolished Fareham Town to win this season's Russell-Cotes Cup, in the second of their four cup finals in 12 days, with four-goal Callum Laycock their hero. Stoneham put out a strong side, whilst Fareham had a number of regulars missing and it showed on the night.

It was all Stoneham in the first few minutes, although Fareham's Matt Pates had the first chance when his early cross-shot was comfortably saved by Callum Lee. Laycock and Tyrrell Sampson then had shots saved by Fareham keeper Dan Bennett.

There was a lengthy stoppage after a clash of heads which led to Fareham's Jake Walker having to be substituted. The Purps were now well in the ascendancy, apart from the occasional Fareham attack, with Sampson seeing his shot saved by Bennett. And it was five on 75 minutes when Annetts pass found LAYCOCK who fired into the top corner of the net from 25 yards for his fourth.

Sampson had another shot saved when through on goal but it was the Creeksiders who grabbed a consolation when a corner was spilled by Lee, a follow-up effort hit the bar and Ethan JONES nodded in the rebound.
