This season, the Cup has gained a new title and will be known as the *Francis Hillier Premier Cup* going forwards. The holders, Weston-super-Mare, are one of the five teams to receive a bye this season, but after fielding an ineligible player in the Quarter Final were removed from the competition. ## HEDGE END RANGERS- CLUB HISTORY



Hedge End Rangers has a long footballing heritage linked to the town of Hedge End, Hampshire. The club's roots can be traced back to the original Hedge End Football Club, formed around 1910. The team spent many years competing in the Southampton League, winning the Senior Division 1 title in 1966 and later gaining promotion to the Hampshire League in 1991 after winning another top-flight championship.

The original club enjoyed success during the early 1990s, winning Hampshire League Division 3 in 1993 and the Hampshire Intermediate Cup in 1994. However, following relegation and a loss of players, the club withdrew from competition during the 2003–04 season. In 2005, football in the town was revived through a partnership with Hedge End Rangers, a junior club established in 1974. The newly formed Hedge End Rangers senior side rejoined the Southampton League and quickly progressed through the football pyramid. They finished runners-up in the “Hampshire League 2004” winning the league title in 2010/11, earning promotion to the Hampshire Premier League.

One of the club's notable achievements came in 2014 when they reached the Southampton Senior Cup Final at St Mary's Stadium. Although they were defeated 5-0 by Sholing Reserves, the appearance marked an important milestone in the club's development.

Following a difficult period that resulted in relegation and withdrawal from the Hampshire Premier League in 2018/19, the club rebuilt successfully. In 2023/24, Hedge End Rangers won the Southampton Senior League Cup and finished runners-up in the Southampton League Premier Division, losing the title on goal difference, securing a return to county-level football.

The club continued its rise, earning promotion through the Hampshire Premier League and, in 2025, entering a ground-sharing agreement with Sholing. This helped support another promotion, taking Hedge End Rangers into the Wessex League Division One for the first time in their history and marking the club's highest-ever level of competition.

## BLANDFORD UNITED- CLUB HISTORY



Blandford United is based in Blandford Forum Dorset, playing their home games at the Recreation Ground, Park Road, Blandford.

Alongside its first team, they boast a reserve team playing in the Dorset League and an affiliated youth section across all age groups.

It is steeped in history being formed in 1882 as one of the inaugural members of the South Hants & Dorset Football Association, which became part of the Dorset FA in 1887. In 1896 the club became founder members of the Dorset League and continued

to play in this league, only breaking for the two world wars.

Success has followed the club throughout, even reaching the third qualifying round of the FA Cup in the 1920/21 season after beating East Cowes Victoria 3–2 in the preliminary round. In the 1934/35 season the club won the Dorset Senior Cup for the first time, beating Weymouth 2–1 at Dorchester after a drawn match, and at time of writing is the only time the club has picked up that silverware.

In 1957 the club left the Dorset league, to play in the Dorset Combination League (now Dorset Premier League) which had just been created, and the club went on to win the league that season. Further league wins followed in 1969/70, 1974/75, 1982/83 and 1991/92. Cup wins were also collected in the Dorset Combination Cup in 1973/74, 1975/76, 1977/78 and 1978/79.

In recent years, a resurgence has been seen by the Royals fans, who regularly turn out with 300+ strong crowds. This has given the club a platform to make the required ground improvements in order to be considered for step 6 football. After finishes in the Dorset Premier League of 5th, 3rd and 4th, the 2025/26 season saw the Royals crowned champions of the Dorset Premier League. Promotion to the Wessex League Division One followed for the first time in their history.

Here is some more of the clubs FA Cup story, bearing in mind the competition has seen several structural changes in the early rounds down the years, plus details of their outings in the FA Vase.

## SANDHURST TOWN- CLUB HISTORY

The club was formed in 1910 and played in the Reading & District League until 1979 apart from a short spell in the East Berkshire Football League. In 1979, the Club was elected into the Aldershot & District Football League. 1984 saw the Club finish as runners-up from whence they became founder members of the Chiltonian Football League and a stepping-stone toward becoming a senior club.

The best season in the Chiltonian Football League was in 1986/87 when they finished in second place. In 1990 the Club applied for membership of the Combined Counties Football League and was granted senior status by the Berks & Bucks County Football Association. The first two seasons were disastrous finishing in bottom place on each occasion and only escaped relegation back to the Chiltonian Football League at the end of the second season due to the resignation of another member club. However, the form of the Club improved dramatically thereafter over several years with managers Peter Browning and subsequently John Underwood bringing the club cup and league success.

The first ground used by the Club was a field adjacent to the Bull & Butcher public house that may well have been used as the club headquarters. After a few years, a move was made to the Memorial Park where the Club remained until the 1996 close season, apart from a couple of seasons during the 1950s spent on a nearby pitch in St. John's Road.

The introduction of the National Lottery prompted an immediate bid for funding for a new ground in Bottom Meadow adjacent to the Memorial Park. With support and backing through additional matched funding from Bracknell Forest Borough Council and Sandhurst Town Council, the Club was successful in the first round of allocations by the National Lotteries Charities Board. The new facilities opened in August 1997 at a cost of £265,000. The club celebrated its Centenary season in 2010/11 winning the Combined Counties League Cup final and getting through to two other semi-finals.



In 2022 the club celebrated 110 years of football in the community. The Covid-19 pandemic brought the 2021 season to a premature close and anniversary celebrations/events were cancelled. However, there was a lot of positive and exciting things happening in the background at the club. Aimed at ensuring the longevity of the club for a further 100 years and beyond, a major relaunch of the club was completed, namely significant improvements, upgrades, of the facilities at Bottom Meadow, placing a major emphasis going forward on the values of education and further enhancing the social and community value of sport in Sandhurst and throughout Bracknell Forest. Our state-of-the-art 3G pitch, the first of its kind in the UK, which was completed during the summer of 2023.

In 2022/23, the Fizzers collected the Combined Counties Division One title and gained promotion to the Combined Counties Premier South. Club ambitions remained high. However, ownership and operational changes in the running of Bottom Meadow hampered progress and the club could not muster enough points to avoid relegation back into Combined Counties Division One. At the end of 2024/25.
