ANDOVER New Street booked themselves a place in the Premier Division play-off final, edging a penalty shoot-out 4-3 against AFC Stoneham.

After the first six spot kicks had all been successfully converted, Jim Orvis saw his shot saved by Andover keeper Jonathan Hill and Duarte Martins hit the post for Stoneham, with Cameron Thatcher's strike proving decisive, prompting wild celebrations for New Street with their travelling fans.

It was Martins who had almost clinched the tie for the Purps on 80 minutes when his shot from just six yards out, after an Owen Fee shot had been parried, somehow found the arms of keeper Hill.

Both sides made three changes from their 2-2 draw at Foxcotte Park just three days earlier; Jenkins, Wells and Nagel coming into the Stoneham side, with Hassell, Holmes and Gee returning for the Street.

The first half remained a tight fought and sometimes feisty affair with the speedy Williams causing the Stoneham defence problems and the Purps Lewis Nagle worrying New Street with some purposeful overlapping runs down the left.

And it was one of Nagle's runs that led to the opening goal. After he was fouled, Fee whipped in the free kick, and with three Stoneham players converging on the near post it was Oliver JENKINS who tucked the ball home for 1-0.

Right on half-time New Street's Williams forced a save from Stoneham keeper Callum Lee, with the same players involved in the first meaningful action of the second half,

Stoneham then exerted some serious pressure on the New Street goal in search of a second, with a corner hitting the top of the bar, a Dan Miller header well saved and Mat Bainbridge shooting just wide.

But in an increasingly untidy game it was New Street who hit back against the run of play, Jake CARSWELL rocketing the ball home from outside the box to make it 1-1.

It really was up for grabs now and both sides had chances in the remaining twenty minutes. As well as Martin's close-range effort, New Street's Kimron Quashie sliced a clearance over his own bar and Stoneham captain, Alex Welch had a shot pushed behind, whilst the Andover side continued to look dangerous.

Both sides began to look resigned to penalties as the clock ticked down to 90 minutes, with Stoneham making two late subs with the spot-kick decider in mind. There was still time for a strong Stoneham shout for a penalty as Sampson went down in the box and a late New Street clearance heading out of the ground and somewhere towards Swaythling.

After four minutes of added time, referee Cameron Davis blew for full time, leaving the 505 strong crowd to brace themselves for penalties, with New Street's greater accuracy from the spot earning them a trip to Fareham and the chance to cap off a momentous season with a play-off final victory.

THERE was a buzz around Cams Alders on Wednesday night, as Fareham Town hosted Hamble Club in the second playoff semi-final of the week. 698 spectators turned out on a beautiful evening, and the conversation was all about who would be hosting Andover New Street in the final on Saturday. Both teams finished the season on 23 wins, the Creeksiders with the better goal difference. Fareham had triumphed in both league games, while Hamble had won a cup encounter less than a month before.

The first half started with both teams eager to set the pace early on, then on the 14th minute Sam Godfroy and Charlie Cooper combined for a lovely move on the right for Fareham, but creating only a half-chance which comes to nothing. Straight away Hamble are on the counter, forcing a decent save from Declan McCarthy.

A moment of real class broke the deadlock on 23 minutes, with Callum NEIL controlling a high ball with his first touch on the move and then chipping it over the oncoming Hamble keeper.

When planning their pre-season campaigns, clubs need to bear in mind we **may** have opening fixtures in the week prior to the Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round, no indication as yet as to those opening dates, we'll pass that on as soon as we know- so in the interim please bear in mind the season start date for 2024/25 was at the end of July.
