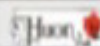

It's with sadness and regret that we have to tell you that the B.I.T.P.C. will close down its organisation on the 31st December 2022. It has been obvious over many months now that the running of the club was proving to be difficult. The loss to the Board of Directors of Lion Peter Carter, Lion Shirley Roberts and P.D.G. Lion John Jones, and the low membership from our MD 105 Lions has resulted in the closure.

The club began on the 1st January 2000 and was soon growing to be a first class outlet for pin traders, not only here in the U.K. but amongst our overseas traders. From 2006 when the Council of Governors granted us the chance to produce the Annual MD 105 pin, the quality of the pins issued was recognised by collectors. The production of this annual pin will now revert to the Council of Governors.

Thanks are expressed to all members, past and present, who contributed to all those successful years. It is to be hoped that many will still continue with their hobby. To maintain this the Lions International Trading Pin Club, (L.I.T.P.C.) is the path to take.


Over the years the B.I.T.P.C. have raised thousands of pounds from pins contributed by collectors under its Fundraising Project. At MD 105 Conventions the opportunity was often taken to make a donation to Lions charity appeals.

The funds in our bank account in accordance with our Club Constitution, will be donated to Lions Clubs International Foundation, (L.C.I.F.). The amount will exceed £6,000.00.

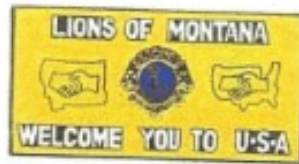
