#### Hello Oklahoma Lions!

"Lead to Serve, Serve to Lead" is our Lions International President, A.P. Singh's theme. When I was District Governor, Past Lions International President Douglas Alexander's theme was "Service from the Heart." I believe my theme is "Service with Joy". All these themes emphasize service!

Let's focus on projects that bring us joy. I believe that joy is the final component that amplifies our service projects. Lions Club International has eight major focus areas: Childhood Cancer, Diabetes, Disaster Relief, Environment, Humanitarian Efforts, Hunger, Vision, and Youth. A project spearheaded by someone who truly believes in a particular focus area is more likely to succeed. This lion leader is serving from the heart. They are serving with joy! As Lions, we don't always have the luxury of serving on projects that we like. However, if we can find Lions that are truly **stoked** about serving in these focus areas, we will be successful. Service with joy is contagious!

This year, Lions and Leos from around the world are coming together for three weeks of exceptional service. The first of these "Weeks of Service" focuses on mental health and well-being. Let's look at a few mental health statistics from the World Health Organization:

- 1 in 7 youths aged 10 to 19 suffer from mental health conditions, although many of these conditions are unrecognized and untreated.
- Fourteen percent of adults 60+ live with a mental health disorder. Loneliness and social isolation are key risk factors.
- Twenty countries still criminalize attempted suicide.
   Those with mental health conditions face stigma and discrimination around the world.

Mental Health and Well-being Week is October 4-12, 2025. Consider how your Lions club can promote mental health and well-being in your community.

The other two "Weeks of Service" are hunger (January 3-11, 2026) and Environment (April 18-26, 2026).




