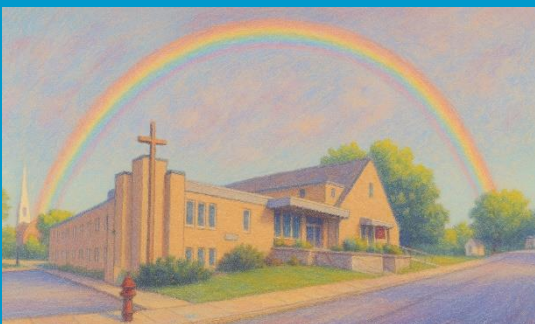

Message from Pastor Nathan

Even in Lent, our readings from Romans at worship on Sunday point to the resurrection of Christ. For our council devotion this month, I took the liberty of translating Romans 8:6-11 (the second reading for the Fifth Sunday in Lent) into contemporary and a bit more expansive language. I am not a serious scholar of Greek, but I did my best with my working knowledge of Greek and the themes of Romans. So here it goes:

⁶To orient one's mind on the lonely, fragile self is death, but to orient one's mind on the ever-present breath of God is life and peace. ⁷You see, the mind oriented on the lonely, fragile self eventually lashes out at God; it no longer constructively arranges itself under God's law. It simply is no longer capable! ⁸Those who are oriented on their lonely, fragile selves are simply not capable of making themselves acceptable to God.

⁹But you are not stuck in your lonely, fragile selves; you are made alive by the ever-present breath of God, because the breath of God makes a home in your body. Anyone without the breath of Jesus does not have Jesus. ¹⁰But if Christ breathes in your body, even though, on the one hand, your lonely, fragile self feels dead because of failing to measure up, on the other hand, the ever-present breath of God in you is the source of your life(!) because God's final judgment in Christ has made you acceptable! ¹¹If the breath of God who raised Jesus from the dead makes a home in your body, then God who raised Christ Jesus—God's Anointed and Chosen One—from the dead, this one will also give life and breath to your dying, fragile selves through his ever-present breath that makes a home in your body. (Romans 8:6-11)

One of the gifts of resurrection is reaffirming the connection we have to all of life. As described in Genesis, the breath of God (or spirit or wind - it's all the same word in the original language of the Bible) is the source of life. The breath of God is everywhere. When Jesus dies, he pours out his spirit upon all people and all things (see John 12:32 and 19:30).

On Good Friday, we acknowledge that the

moment of resurrection begins in Jesus' death. The spirit that enlivens him does not die on the cross but is released into the world to give us life. We might try to isolate and cut off ourselves from this breath of God. But in great love God finds us and re-connects with us with life through the death and resurrection of Christ.

As we look forward to Easter, I am ever-grateful for the connection I have discovered with you in serving as your pastor. I felt this recently when our Church Council gathered for a retreat on March 14th to formulate a Vision and Values statement for our life together in the next few years (see the announcement about this in this newsletter). After spending time in prayer, we talked. . . and talked . . . and talked! If it weren't for the looming snowstorm, we would have kept talking!

One of the things I felt during this conversation was the heartfelt desire to continue deepening our relationships with each other while also opening our doors in welcome to others. There was also a heartfelt desire to continue collaborating and partnering with other churches and organizations. I see this as not a desire to "build our own little kingdom" but a desire to seek out and be open to how God is calling us to be embedded in and committed to our neighborhood and community. We don't want to go it alone as a church but want to be open to the Spirit already at work inside and outside our doors.

This is the good news of Easter: We are not alone. God is still at work among us and outside us. New life awaits those eager to breathe in God's promises and breath out God's compassion.

Happy Easter, dear people of St. Paul Lutheran!

Our congregation is entitled to send three voting members (and additional visitors) for two days of inspiring worship, stimulating learning, and helping make decisions about governance, mission and finances, as well as elect members of Synod Council or other committees. This year, we will also elect our next bishop! Voting members are not designated "representatives" of a congregation (like elected officials), but they are asked to take seriously the responsibility of voting with their conscience for the well-being of the synod. Simpson Housing Services



Today, Simpson provides an extended-stay shelter and critical resources for 66 guests (men, women, and non-binary people) 24 hours a day, 365 days per year. Guests are diverse in background, employment status, and physical abilities. Guests also have a variety of experiences with domestic violence, mental illness, or chemical dependency. They welcome each guest with dignity and respect, recognize each person's personal strengths and barriers, and offer a safe space where guests can explore stable housing options and resources. They rely on the generous support of hundreds of volunteers and donors to help with basic operations of the shelter. Volunteers prepare meals in the shelter kitchen and serve lunch and dinner daily. Generous donors donate supplies such as toiletries, cereal, and coffee, as well as basic clothing items like socks, underwear, and t-shirts.

Mission Outreach Update

Mission Outreach will be purchasing snacks for Kids Snack Bags. The Youth Group will help assemble them, and they will be delivered for distribution to Valley Outreach. This year we decided to reduce the number of Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes to 150. In place of the 100 shoeboxes we are cutting, we decided to collect donations during April and May to assemble 25 Baby Care Kits and 25 Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief and deliver them in June when the quilters deliver their quilts. There are no shipping costs through LWR. Personal Care Kits include: 1 lightweight bath towel, 2 or 3 bars of soap, 1 adult-size toothbrush, 1 sturdy comb, and 1 pair of metal nail clippers. Baby Care Kits include: 2 receiving blankets, 4 cloth diapers, 1 jacket, 2 gowns, 2 pairs of socks, 2 T-shirts, diaper pins, and 3 bars of gentle soap. We will soon have collection boxes in the Gathering Area.

St. Paul Area Synod Bishop Candidates

Volunteers typically serve on a rotating schedule, and training is provided.

SPLC Vision & Values Statement

Last fall, leaders of our congregation took the time for one-on-one conversations with several members and friends of the congregation in order to lay the groundwork for adopting a Vision and Values statement that will guide our life together for the next few years. Meeting in retreat with Pastor Justin Grimm in early December, and then again on their own on March 14th, the Church Council passed a motion to recommend its adoption by the whole congregation. Copies of the proposed Vision and Values statement are available in the Gathering Area. Stay tuned for opportunities to have conversation about and provide feedback of the statement before the meeting, however, we will provide ample time for feedback at the meeting itself.

Congregational Meeting April 19th

The Church Council has called for a special congregational meeting to be held on Sunday, April 19th, immediately following our 9:00 AM worship service. All members of the congregation are encouraged to attend and participate in this important time in the life of our church.

IMPORTANT!

The purpose of this meeting is twofold. First, we will elect members to represent our congregation at this year's Synod Assembly. These individuals will serve as our voice in the wider church, helping to shape decisions and direction at the synod level.

Second, we will consider and adopt a Vision and Values statement that has been thoughtfully developed to guide our shared ministry in the coming years. This statement will help clarify who we are, what we believe God is calling us to be, and how we will live out that calling together. It will also serve as a foundation for any future updates to our church's constitution.

We hope you will plan to stay after worship and be part of this meaningful conversation and decision-making process as we look ahead with purpose and hope.
