- Fellowship (2-year term)
- Evangelism & Membership Chair (2-year term)
- Children, Youth & Family (1-year term will be appointed by Church Council)
- Audit Committee (The Constitution states this committee is made up of 3 people: each serving a different term; terms are 1, 2, or a 3-year term.)
- Nominating Committee: Up to 5 members serving up to a 2-year term.
