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History of La Quinta



Established in 1926 by Walter H. Morgan, La Quinta Resort & Club is essentially the grandfather of the Coachella Valley. Designed by Gordon Kaufmann (who clearly had a "desert chic" vision), the place was built with 100,000 hand-fired adobe bricks—which is a lot of mud, but it certainly beat the alternative of melting in the sun.

The Original "Do Not Disturb" Sign Long before Instagram made everyone famous, Hollywood's elite came here to actually disappear. It was the ultimate "Hideaway" for stars who were tired of being stared at: Frank Capra: He wrote *It's a Wonderful Life* here. Apparently, the desert heat is great for curing writer's block.

Irving Berlin: He reportedly wrote "White Christmas" while sitting poolside in 100-degree heat, which is either peak irony or a very effective way to cool down.

Greta Garbo: She stayed here so often that she probably should have just been on the payroll. From 20 Rooms to a Whole City. What started as 20 tiny casitas eventually got so popular they had to build a city around it. The City of La Quinta was incorporated in 1982, naming itself after the resort (talk about a successful brand). Today, it has grown from a quiet 20-unit escape to a massive 800-room golf mecca, proved that if you build enough adobe houses in the sand, eventually, everyone will follow.

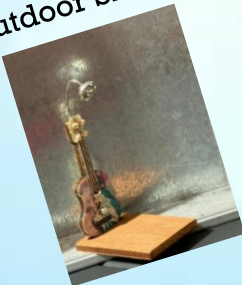

NAME UNDER THE STARS

Wednesday Evening Project

Chairman Stephanie Engseth



Many of you have been buying kits and building miniatures for a long time, while others are new to this hobby. Have you ever considered what it takes to produce a kit for sale? Here is an overview of the process involved in providing these products. Some products may require additional or repeated steps not mentioned here. Many people produce kits in different ways, but regardless of the method, it is always a time-consuming endeavor.

Conceptualizing the Project

Every project begins with an idea. For example, the 2026 California Dreaming Convention provided a theme to help spark inspiration. When thinking about the theme, images of the beach and ocean came to mind. Searching online using keywords such as surf, ocean, beach, and California led to a variety of pictures and posters on Pinterest. Among these, beach buildings and palm trees stood out, sparking the idea for a “Surf Shack” and marking the start of the development process.

Determining Scale and Size

The process often starts with a smaller scale (1/4”) and progresses to larger sizes. Deciding which size makes sense for the project is an important early step.

Design Considerations

How many walls, doors, and windows will there be? Will the doors be stationary? Should acrylic be used in the windows? **(CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE)**

Materials needed and what thickness will be appropriate?

Foundation, Floors, Porches/Decks, Roof, Stairs, Walls.

Determining the type of materials required, such as wood or mat board, considering factors like warping depending on the size & thickness. Wood types: Basswood, Plywood, Maple, Cherry, etc

Design and Prototyping

After creating a simple sketch, the next step is to lay out the pieces using Corel Draw, a 2D software used to run my laser machine. Each thickness and size of wood is organized on different pages within the file, similar to how Excel works. For example, different pages might be dedicated to 3" x 24" x 3/32" cherry wood, and so on.

All the required parts are drawn for the project, keeping assembly in mind. Guidelines, notches, and other features may be added to facilitate easier assembly.

Prototype Creation and Refinement

Measurements are verified and each part is checked to ensure a proper fit with adjacent components. The first prototype is cut using Basswood, as it is affordable. This initial prototype is typically discarded after making necessary changes in the design.

Adjustments are made in the software, and a new prototype is cut. During this stage, the steps for assembly are documented, photographed and instructions are prepared.

When cutting the first production kit other factors are decided:

Size of bags for parts; Labels for marking the bags; Labels for the Main Kit; Does it require a box and what size.

Procurement

An additional step is sourcing all materials and supplies for the kit, which can also be time-consuming depending on the complexity of the kit.

Final Steps - Print the Labels; Print the Instructions; Cut the parts; Bag and Tag parts

Place in final container (Box or Bag) with the instructions

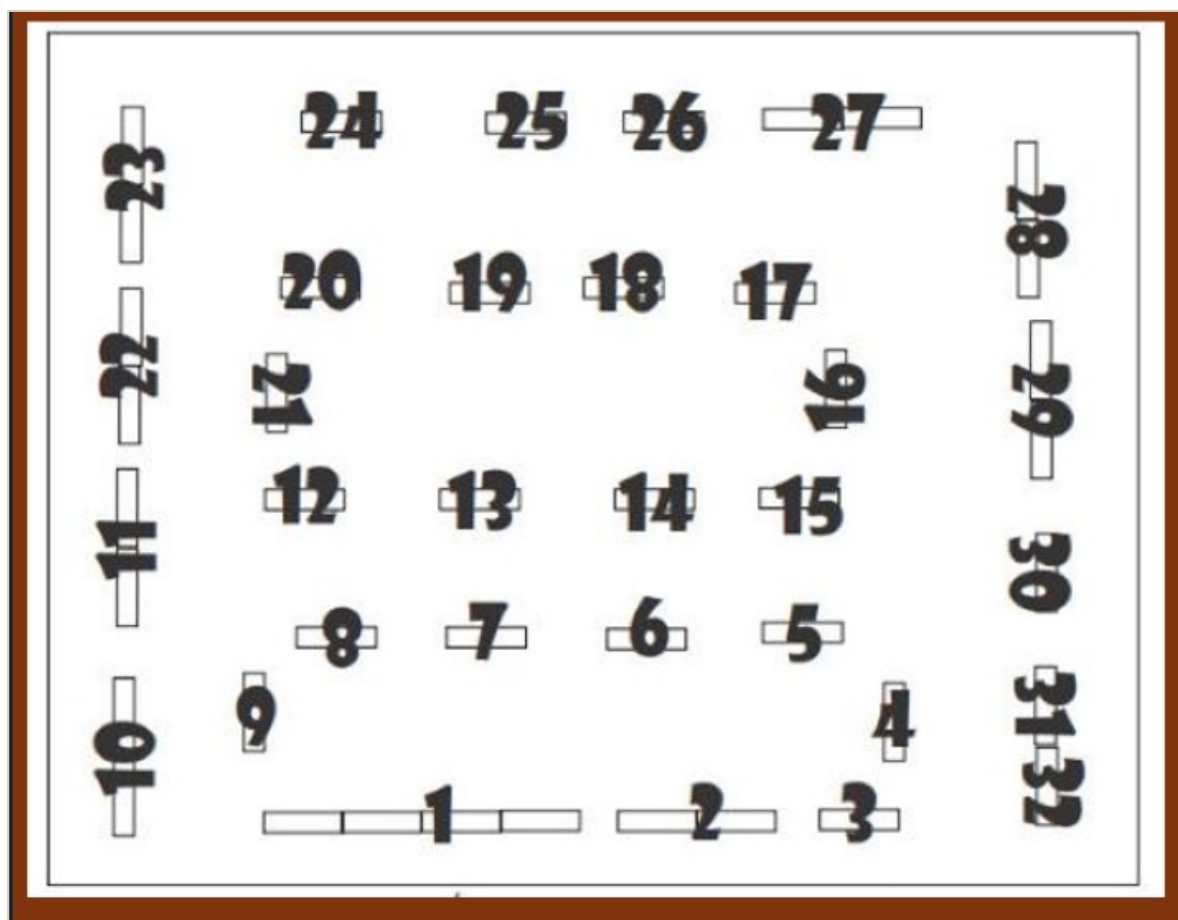


DEALER FLOOR PLAN

Turn an inexpensive plastic tree into a miniature to be proud of.

Step 1: Use a hobby knife to scrape away the plastic seam lines (flash) along the trunk, then lightly sand the entire tree to remove the shiny factory finish.

Step 2: Brush on a mix of brown paint and baking soda or fine sand for an organic, gritty texture.

Step 3: Basecoat the trunk in a weathered grayish-brown and the fronds in muted olive greens. Brush on a thin, dark brown acrylic wash so it settles into the grooves to create instant depth and shadows.

Step 4: Lightly flick a nearly dry brush with light tan (for the trunk) and yellowish-green (for the fronds) across the raised edges to simulate bright sunlight catching the details.

Step 5: Glue tiny, crinkled strips of brown coffee filter or shredded twine just below the green canopy to mimic the drooping, dead fronds common on desert palms.

Step 6: Coat the entire tree with a flat matte sealer (like Testors Dullcote) to permanently kill the plastic shine and lock in your work.

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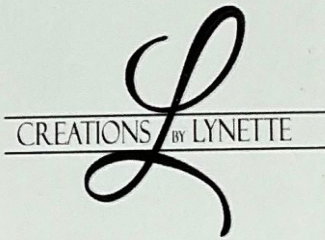
