What's in **Your** Wallet?

I believe most of us have heard this phrase and thought of a particular credit card and its purchasing power. It is a good ad, and it makes me do exactly what it's meant to do – think about which credit cards I use to support my lifestyle as the world changes.

The church's culture also experiences changes. There are new people, new programs, and different preachers. Hopefully, these aspects of the church challenge and encourage all of us to think about what truly matters amid the rapid changes of the world. The church and its desire to please God act as an anchor and a strong tower that we can cling to in a world full of change.

There are many reasons I believe this is true. One is my personal experience. Another is a simple passage embedded in the text of Isaiah and alluded to in I Peter. "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever." This concept is echoed in I Peter, which states, "The word of the Lord endures forever. And this is the word that was preached to you." This world, with all its issues—both good and bad—will eventually pass away. God's promises are the only "things" we can rely on, and I believe those promises are salvation, atonement, and eternal life. I like how Thomas Merton described it: "you will not leave us alone to face our perils."

Beyond this reality, I believe there are four aspects of the Christian life that support one's growth in recognizing the eternal nature and desires of God. These four fundamental components of the Christian faith are all vital. There are times in everyone's life when one or two may play a more prominent role, but all four are necessary for a balanced Christian witness:

Worship: Showing up and participating in regular weekly worship. Allow the prayers, hymns, readings, and sharing in the Eucharist to be more than just a Sunday morning event. How we start the week is important! Begin the week with the act of corporate worship; let what happens in worship shape the entire

week. Besides Sunday services, St. Mary's offers the daily office of Morning Prayer. It is read Monday through Friday at 8:40 AM in the chancel.

Prayer and Study: These two foundational practices begin to unlock Holy Scripture and shape one's daily life. Study can open the text of Holy Scripture, and prayer can deepen our faith as we grow in the act of listening to and talking with God. St. Mary's offers many tools for study. There are large and small Bible studies. Irene is currently involved in the Devoted class (Tuesday mornings) and enjoying a book by Tim Keller. The Rev. Deacon John Kennedy facilitates a group on Tuesday, made up of people participating in Centering Prayer. Prayer can be a wonderful opportunity to simply sit still and listen for God.

Giving: The ministries of every church rely on the financial gifts from its members. The people of St. Mary's are traditionally generous and take this aspect of the



Christian life seriously. Holy Scripture and traditions guide this fundamental practice. I have learned that it is a joy to give and to share what we have received. Discovering that God invites us to participate in building up the Christian witness is exciting. St. Mary's offers ways to give that are local, national, and international. Sometimes giving relates to specific situations, such as the tragedy in west Texas. We also share our buildings and resources with many. All of this stems from the belief that we are blessed, and through sharing, we gain a deeper understanding of the gifts we have received.

Service: Hands-on service includes providing lunch for the GED program, driving youth to events, serving on the Altar or Flower Guild, and creating gifts through the Creative Arts Ministry—all ways to serve. Serving helps make worship, prayer, study, and giving more meaningful. St. Mary's is like a train station: many trains offering service begin here. Boarding one of those trains depends on the individual and how much growth and challenge they are ready for.

When you wonder how to build your Christian life, consider what you are doing and how you are exposing yourself to all that the Christian life offers. Philips Brooks, a famous preacher of the American church, said in a series of talks at Yale, "in a world with many things to offer, the Christian has the very best to choose from, they get to tell the world through their lives about the enduring word of God, that will stand forever."

What are you building your Christian witness upon? I hope that it is built on the enduring word of God!


