Themes of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany

As I was thinking about the upcoming liturgical seasons and their themes, I realized something new that I had not previously connected between the three. Simply put:

Advent is a time when believers make room in their day-to-day for the Messiah.

The believer celebrates the arrival of the Messiah in the season of **Christmas**.

Epiphany asks this question of the believer, "The Messiah is here, so what do you think?" Epiphany calls the believer into a deeper understanding of the Messiah.

Advent is not Christmas; Christmas is not Advent; and Epiphany is neither.

All three liturgical seasons can have a significant role in the life of the believer who is willing to take each one seriously and As I thought about understanding, one phrase kept coming up in my thoughts: "And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." (Luke 2:7) This is a well-known line we will hear on Christmas Eve- in the middle of the three seasons.

Advent is a time to "build room in our lives" for the birth of the Messiah. Over the four Sundays of Advent, we will hear the call of Biblical prophets and the words of Holy Scripture, which tell us the time is near. These calls remind us that God is doing something in the world for all of humanity. If we don't heed these calls, there is the chance that what is coming at Christmas will be missed and not fully comprehended, because there was little room in our lives for the Messiah. Christmas is busy, but it is not a time to forget about God and the real reason for celebration.

God's actions and desires are independent of our

preparing and anticipating. This reality is repeated in the text of Holy Scripture. Joseph, a disliked brother, is sold into slavery and then saves the brothers who sold him. God fed the nation of Israel in the wilderness, and they went on sinning. God used David when he was the youngest and most unlikely of Jesse's sons. A Messiah for the whole world and all of humanity was born in a stable, because there was no room in the inn. God's plan will not return to God empty. A Messiah is born, and now it is our

turn to respond to this gift.

"No room in the inn" will not stop the ways of God.

The birth of the Messiah opens the world to a celebration that God offers us. This is a confusing tension. We don't have room for God; however, God has room for us. These three seasons can teach us this love and mercy that only God offers. While we say we love others, we stumble because of our egos, fear, and lack of mercy. In the seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, we have a front row seat to what God can do in the lives of women and men.

Please consider these important guidelines and reminders regarding giving to St. Mary's on the Highlands. Contributions to St. Mary's are tax-deductible as allowed by law. Maximum tax benefits depend on timing.

IRS rules recognize a contribution on the day of delivery. For contributions to be deductible for 2025, they must meet one of the following criteria:

- By mail: postmarked on or before December 31, 2025. Mail to: St. Mary's on-the-Highlands Episcopal Church / Attention: Director of Finance 1910 12th Avenue South
 - Birmingham, AL 35205
- ▶ Hand delivery: received at the church office by noon, Wednesday, December 31, 2025. Any gifts dropped off after the office is closed will be treated as 2026 gifts.
- ▶ Online giving: Please utilize our secure online giving option at www.stmarysoth.org/give. When paying by credit or debit card, you will get credit for the amount the church actually receives, less the 3% fee. Electronic checks are free.
- **Stock transfer:** The stock gift must be received by St. Mary's brokerage account by December 30. Please consult with your financial advisor and initiate your transfer early. Some transfers take longer especially at the end of the year. **Please contact Rhea Pelekis prior to requesting a transfer of stock.** This will ensure that you receive the appropriate credit and that you have the correct transfer instructions.
- Please note that any gifts given via online bill payment services are dated on the date your bank actually transmits or otherwise removes the funds from your account, NOT on the date you schedule or submit the transaction.
- Please note on the memo line which account you are supporting: 2025 pledge, Christmas offering, prepaid 2026 pledge, or memorial, etc.
- Tax situations vary. We encourage you to consult with your tax or financial advisor regarding any charitable donations or gifts.

Discretionary Funds

Discretionary funds are resources allocated for specific needs but are separate from the operating budget. All clergy at St. Mary's have access to "Discretionary Funds."

These funds support projects such as a food pantry, neighboring parishes, or nonprofit organizations, or, at times, aid for a family or individual to buy groceries or cover essential medical expenses. These funds have been used to provide shoes, purchase tools, cover costs related to identification cards, assist with burial expenses, pay part of a utility bill, and even fund childcare needs. They can also be used to buy books or give an honorarium to a priest who steps in to help a family. Discretionary funds are often utilized when a new ministry is started that reaches beyond St. Mary's.

These funds are not owned by any individual but by the congregation. When gifts are donated to a discretionary account in honor of a wedding, baptism, funeral, or as a gesture of thanks, they are used to strengthen God's kingdom and support His people.

Las Posadas

The word "posada" means lodging, or inn. Originating in Latin American countries to celebrate the nativity story, Posada is a period of time during Advent when Mary and Joseph travel around to different households and stay there for one night. Families can sign up to take part and then become hosts to the holy family for one night during Advent. During this time, children have an opportunity to learn more about the Christmas story, and everyone can meet others from this parish family as the figures are passed from one house to the next. At the Christmas Eve service, the Wise Men begin their journey to Bethlehem to see the Christ child, so families continue hosting figures in their homes until the Epiphany service on January 4.


Beginning Sunday, December 14, costumes will be available to borrow on the children's hall. Here are the age group assignments:


