
GIVE THANKS

PILGRIMS & CHRISTIAN FREEDOM

EARLY FORMS OF GOVERNMENT

NEW LEADERSHIP

Governor Bradford made this remark in regards to this experiment in government, "The colonists collectively cleared and worked the land, but they brought forth neither the bountiful harvest they had hoped for, nor a spirit of shared and cheerful brotherhood."

CHANGE IN GOVERNMENT PHILOSOPHY

- Jeremy Bradford went into action and began to give our parcels of land to each of the colonists to grow and produce what they wanted. They were free to trade with others and to make profit as they saw fit.
- The result was a bumper crop and enough food to put away for next year.

WILLIAM BRADFORD & THANKSGIVING

- After the initial trials of government, cultivating the land and getting through other various dangers; the colony was beginning to become prosperous.
- However, in 1623, a drought struck the area and crops were beginning to wilt and fail.
- William Bradford said, "A great drought from the 3rd week in May, till about the middle of July, without any rain and with great heat for the most part." "We set apart a solemn day seek the Lord by humble and fervent prayer in this great distress."



RAIN!

- It was said that the day continued to be hot and dry until God answered with rain!
 It wasn't a strong thunderstorm or with great wind, but a good, gentle rain which soaked the ground and gave life to their crops.
- The Indians who resided with the colonists were greatly impressed with this display of goodness from the Pilgrim's God. One of those Natives (Hobbamock) in fact was converted to faith in Jesus Christ because of it.
