How GPAC is managing the review into child safety requirements

I would just like to update you in response to the new requirements in response to the review of child safety requirements, and how GPAC manages these changes to the Education and Care Services National Regulations.

This change reforms aim to strengthen children's safety. The key take outs are - New rules from September 1 include digital technology safety policies, 24-hour abuse reporting and a ban on vaping.

I can assure you that GPAC practices and will reinforce a strong child safe culture including good governance, a stable workforce, and embedding of the Child Safe Standards.

As part of the new regs personal mobile phones cannot be used at GPAC whilst caring for children. I can assure you we already had those Policies and Procedures in place and all our Educators put their phones in their lockers upon commencement of shift. The changes advertised will not amend our current policies such as: Child Protection, Telephone, Mobile and Internet Policy and our Digital Device and Social Media Use Policy.

We have however created another new Policy and Risk Assessment:

Safe Use of Digital Technology and Online Environments Policy Digital Technologies and Online Environments Risk Assessment

If you have or do see a staff member on a phone or device they would be using the GPAC devices to do a GPAC Facebook post, messaging a guardian or reviewing their programming/typing reflections etc.

We also partake in continued personal development, and will be redoing our training at our Thursday meeting so if you have any input, please let us know.

The change is that staff members CANNOT wear a smart watch that is enabled to take a video or photo. This is also in line with children at the Centre cannot wear a device with that technology or take photos whilst in our care.

We will also be speaking to the children at announcements -

to support children's understanding of online safety by providing age-appropriate guidance, discussions and activities that help them to recognise safe and unsafe online behaviours consulting about matters that impact them, including the use of digital technologies and online environments, to ensure their voices are heard and respected in a meaningful way.

Risks remain if Policies are poorly implemented or reputation is prioritised over child safety so, please provide your feedback in relation to GPAC's Policies or how we can assist in any way. We do have useful links on our website including the ECA Statement on young children and digital technologies

As always, if you ever have any concerns with the care we provide to your child, please immediately report it to myself or the GPAC President.

Re-enrolling for 2026

- 1. You will have received a re-enrolment link via email from Xplor please only use this link to re-enrol. The link will remain live for 7 days. If you need the link to be re-issued, please send admin an email admin@gpactivitycentre.org. DO NOT USE THE ENROL BUTTON ON THE WEBSITE TO RE-ENROL
- 2. Please submit the Booking Request Form ONE FORM FOR EACH CHILD YOU ARE RE-ENROLLING. If you wish to use the Centre on a casual basis and select 'Casual Only'
- 3. Current GPAC students re-enrolling for 2026 have first priority if the reenrolment link and booking request form have been received before 15th September. After this date, we will open enrolments to all new families wishing to start care at GPAC in 2026 and your re-enrolment will be processed on a first in, first served basis along with the new enrolments.
- 4. Don't forget to return the 2026 Code of Conduct & Expectation Charter
- 5. Please not that the Annual GPAC Membership Fee for 2026 has increased to \$60 per family from \$50

Not returning in 2026?

If your child is off to high school or you've decided not to return to GPAC in 2026, please send an email to admin@gpactivitycentre.org to advise us.

New siblings enrolling for 2026

- 1. Head to the website to enrol www.gpactivitycentre.org/enrolments
- 2. Please have your child's birth certificate, immunisation statement and any medical plans ready to upload
- 3. You will be able to select your preferred sessions of care on the enrolment form. Alternatively, you can submit a Booking Request Form.
- 4. Siblings of current GPAC students enrolling for 2026 have second priority (after current students re-enrolling for 2026) if the enrolment form and booking request have been received before 15th September. After this date, we will open enrolments to all new families wishing to start care in 2026 and your child's enrolment will be processed on a first in, first served basis along with the new enrolments.

2026 Annual membership fee of \$60 will be charged after 15th September for those who have re-enrolled.

<u>Illnesses</u>

How long should families keep sick children home for?

With the change of weather, spikes in infectious diseases are common, including gastro, conjunctivitis and colds.

Access this <u>table</u> from the updated Staying healthy: Preventing infectious diseases in early childhood education and care services - 6th Edition to identify when children should be excluded from the service and when they can safely return.

<u>Absentee notification from Xplor</u>

When a child is expected at GPAC for their morning booking but does not arrive they will be marked absent by an Educator after the children in attendance have been signed out. This will trigger an instant notification to guardians that their child was marked absent from GPAC. GPPS have confirmed they send an SMS at Ilam if a child hasn't arrived at school. If no explanation for the absence is received from that parent then an email to both parents is sent the following day. During Vacation Care, GPAC will mark you child absent in Xplor at our first head count roll call. If you subsequently arrive after this roll call we can manually mark them present for the day.

Absences & non-notification

Please ensure you advise us if your child will be absent from GPAC, especially for After School Care. If your child is booked in and does not show up for After School Care, a staff member will be required to come off the floor to locate your child/ren. As per GPAC's fees policy a non-notification phone fee of \$10 per child, will be charged to your account.

<u>Breakfast Service</u>

A friendly reminder that <u>GPAC serves breakfast from 7am until 8am</u>. If your child/ren would like to have breakfast at GPAC, please ensure they are here before 8am. This is because the staff member serving breakfast will need to help supervise the children playing inside and outside.

Please ensure your child/ren are aware that their Smart Watches must remain on school mode while at GPAC.


