“Viva Las Vegas!” I saw those words everywhere as soon as I got off the plane in Vegas. This phrase means in Spanish “Live Las Vegas” or “Long Live Las Vegas”. Today it is synonymous with the whole Vegas experience along with the iconic welcome sign. It is literally seen by millions of tourists who plan to live it up in Las Vegas.

So, it is an interesting backdrop for a gathering of members of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) to meet in a discussion centered around differing views of pastoral formation in the hope that greater harmony in our Synod’s life together may arise. More than 120 people (clergy and lay members) in January came together at a church in Las Vegas to fraternally discuss pastoral formation and the differing viewpoints held within the LCMS. This included representation from 20 out of the 35 districts from around the Synod and included 11 out of the 35 district presidents. After a time of prayer and study, the remaining time of the gathering was spent hearing presentations by speakers with contrasting positions and having break-out sessions to discuss what was said and opinions related to the various points.

The press kit from the gathering summarized the topics discussed as:

- Benefits of residential seminary as the standard pastoral formation option
- Online seminary as an effective option in addition to residential seminary
- History of Synod resolutions related to pastoral formation
- Types of pastors congregations and district presidents are looking for and why residential or online seminary options fulfill those needs

After hearing presentations on the previously discussed topics, attendees seated at assigned tables were given the task of answering together, as a whole table, where there was common ground on issues presented by the speakers.

As mentioned before, the tables were assigned seating. This was to break up the 120 attendees based on their self-selected viewpoints related to pastoral formation. This included 90 with the viewpoint of “online seminary education can be an effective option for MDiv formation” and only 30 or less with the viewpoint of “residential seminary as the standard for MDiv formation”. What this amounted to, is one to two people at each table of eight or so who believe that the Masters of Divinity (MDiv) degree should only be accomplished through residential seminary. Overall, discussions were plentiful while consensus was scarce.

One of the first tasks given to each table was to determine, “Here is where we agree”. It was interesting that even for this first task of determining what we all agree on, my table spent roughly 25 minutes in discussion only to come up with the one thing we could agree on, which was that each side did not trust the other side advocating the opposing position. The reason for this disagreement is that pastoral formation in the LCMS was not the only issue at play. Hidden behind this issue were all sorts of other disagreements that each side was not verbalizing, at least at first, but were none the less important points that colored each side’s view on the issue of pastoral formation.

Some people have asked me if I enjoyed my time in Vegas. Definitely, when people think of Vegas, they think of slot machines, living it up, and an overall good time. This was not the experience that I had. Yet it was important to the overall life of our church to be there, to be in the room, and to discuss these important issues together. In fact, Synod means to “walk together”, but there are those who have such differing views, we cannot live and walk together until resolutions can be made.

Some say “Viva Las Vegas”. I say “Viva LCMS” as it is our lives together, walking together in unity of faith that defines who we are as the LCMS. If you would like more information and have some free time, an LCMS Pastor from the Pittsburg area who was at the gathering was interviewed about the issues behind the issues and gives an excellent summary. It is my prayer that as we prepare to meet as a Synod in convention this summer in Phoenix, some resolutions to these issues may be found. Amen.

4TH ANNUAL FAITH AND FITNESS CLASS

Dear Members of Faith Lutheran Church,

As part of a community outreach program, I would like to offer the 4th Annual Faith and Fitness Class. This would be a 6 week program which would meet on Tuesdays and Fridays for approximately 60-90 minutes. **This 6 week program starts February 10th and end March 20, 2026. The classes will be from 10:30 am to 12 noon in Fellowship Hall.** These classes are intended for those individuals that may answer yes to any of these 3 questions:

- **Do you use a cane or a walker?**
- **Do you feel unsteady on your feet?**
- **Have you fallen in the past year?**

Of course others can join us, but this will not be a high impact exercise class. It will be offered to get people moving and offer some strengthening/balancing exercises to help prevent falls.

Emphasis is placed on flexibility, balance and core strength. Each routine will offer a modification to meet the ability of the participant. The first class will include an overview of terminology, such as the importance of warm up, cool down, sets, reps, etc.. Activity will most likely be 30-45 minutes.

An informal devotion will be offered during this time as well. This devotional time can include a time of thanks, prayer requests, perhaps a reading from Portals of Prayers or a short inspirational story from Guidepost, or a devotion from the Lutheran Hour Ministries. Participants could also reflect on their favorite bible passage and why it means so much to them. Simply, a time of thanks and sharing what makes us faithful.

I believe in having a set start time and end time, so participants can fit other activities into their busy lifestyles. I am willing to offer blood pressure monitoring and educating members on how to monitor their own pulse and certainly remind participants and members of our church on where the AED is located.

I have a teaching degree in Health and Physical Education and a Masters degree in Clinical Exercise Physiology. I spent 40 years in the field of Cardiac and Pulmonary rehabilitation and retired in January of 2022 from Lehigh Valley Health Network. 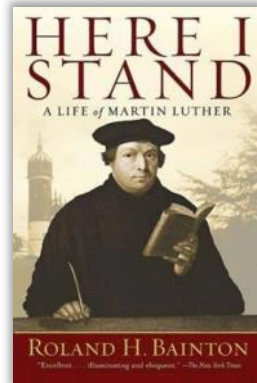

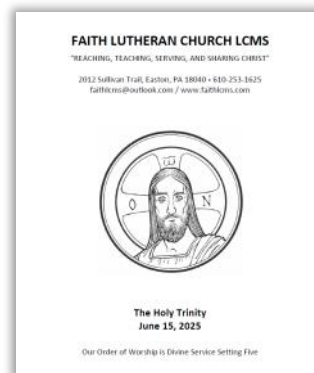
