

#### What Do You Breeze Over?

And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." Acts 16:31

Does that sound familiar? Often times, you probably breeze over the cover of our Voice of Faith newsletter to "get to the good stuff". Yet this is the good stuff. It talks about salvation, which should be a concern for all! Likewise, the temptation is there to breeze over baptism or at least think of it as something that happen in the past that has no bearing on our Christian Life right now.

We often think of baptism as some water and it is done in the context of the church service yet this plain or simple water is far from it, for it is included in God's Command and combined with God's Word as the small catechism explains. By baptizing in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, it is His name which is joined to the water with all His power and all His blessings, especially forgiveness, life and salvation. In Matthew, Mark and the Book of Acts, we have God's Command to baptize, even whole households.

Along with this command we also have a distinct need for baptism. Whether that be for infants or adults, all are sinful and fall short of the Glory of God, see Romans 3:23, or hear in Psalm 51, "I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me." In realizing our need, the sweet words and promises of God as to the benefits that baptism gives can all the more ring in our ears, in that it actually works the forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all that believe this. Truly in baptism, we are snatched from the power of Satan; as God cleanses us from all our sins and gives to us everlasting life. Did you notice what is missing from that last statement? What we do or our work or our public confession of faith are all missing. It is God who does these things. God plainly declares this in His Word as He says in Acts 2:39, "The promise is for you and your children."

So it is, that the question remains, whether baptized as a little baby or many years ago, what does baptism have to due with our daily life? Martin Luther has much to say about this, yet, particularly important is this quote, "Every Christian has enough to study and to practice all his life. He always has enough to do to believe firmly what Baptism promises and brings - victory over death and the devil, forgiveness of sins, God's grace, the entire Christ, and the Holy Spirit with His gifts." And: "If you live in repentance, therefore, you are walking in Baptism, which not only announces this new life, but also produces, begins and promotes it. In Baptism we are given the grace, Spirit and power to suppress the old man, so that the new man may come forth and grow strong. Therefore, Baptism remains forever. ...Repentance, therefore, is nothing else than a return and approach to Baptism."

Hopefully, the first of Martin Luther's 95 Theses should ring clearly in our ears that when "Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, in saying, "Repent ye, etc.," intended that the whole life of his believers on earth should be a constant repentance." A repentance at each day leads us to return back to our baptisms, our salvation, and our Lord Jesus Christ; so as never to breeze over them!

# REVIEW OF THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

#### FROM MARTIN LUTHER'S SMALL CATECHISM



#### **FIRST**

#### What is Baptism?

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

#### Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matt. 28:19)

#### **SECOND**

## What benefits does Baptism give?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

## Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:16)

#### **THIRD**

## **How can water do such great things?**

Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three: "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." (Titus 3:5–8)


#### **FOURTH**

## What does such baptizing with water indicate?

It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

#### Where is this written?

St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Rom. 6:4)




