

We give Thee but Thine own, Whate'er the gift may be; All that we have is Thine alone, A trust, O Lord, from Thee.

How often do we hear these words? Oh, that's right! Every Sunday, every time we collect an offering in church. These words are from Lutheran Service Book Hymn #781, We Give Thee But Thine Own. They point to an important truth that all that we have is a gift from God Alone and thereby given to us in trust.

Trust, not in the sense of trusting that something is true but instead, given in trust for us to be faithful stewards of the gifts from God. Most especially for one or more beneficiaries, as pointed to by the Oxford Dictionary. This is an important starting point for each of us to consider that all that we have, everything, is a gift from God as He gives us our daily bread.

Martin Luther in the Small Catechism explains what is meant by daily bread when he says, "Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods..." Truly when we consider the gifts God indeed gives to each of us, each and every day in our daily bread, these are indeed a trust that the Lord gives us, for which we are stewards.

To be stewards of these gifts, or to consider stewardship as a topic could include many things. Many times, we like to talk in broad terms sometimes including things like time, talent, and treasures, and how this affects all those around us. This can be helpful. Today, though, let's get specific and reflect especially on the support and needs of our church. Our church exists to faithfully preach the pure the Word of God and the right administration of the Sacraments. This happens in a real sense as a direct result of the monetary support of the gathered Body of Christ.

The Body of Christ has historically included the act of collecting the (physical/electronic) gifts and bringing them to the altar, which has been a part of Christian worship since the time of the apostles. Many will understand that this indeed sustains the church in its mission by paying the mortgage, various utility bills, biblical curriculum, staff salaries, facility repairs/upkeep, and a whole host of other things. The dollars and cents received in the plate and online go to vital resources that keep the lights on and the doors open. Regularly these monetary gifts that we receive are reported in our bulletins and in our financial reports and continue to show a definite real ongoing need.

Needs do not always come exactly in a neat form. Indeed there have been many other needs in the last six months or so that many are unaware of, that have been contributed. These gifts have made a phenomenal impact which has made sure our church continues while not putting additional strain on our church finances. Provided below is a list of some of these contributions. Truly there are so many needs that fall into this category. Needs that I would be glad to share with anyone who would like to know more in order to donate to a specific thing. Our church remains only as a result of those who have contributed as God has blessed His people; I pray that this continues into the future. Trusting in Christ's assurance that "[He] will build [His] church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18)

- The new funeral policy was passed and will be presented for vote to the congregation at the next Voters Assembly Meeting.
- The new lease agreement for the parsonage, which was developed in conjunction with the IU20, was passed.

 The Preschool Budget for the 2025-2026 school year was passed. Jackie Morrow and Lorraine Varela, who both work for the Preschool and serve on Council, were excluded from discussion and voting to avoid a conflict of interest.

RAMBLINGS FROM THE HEAD ELDER

s Jean reminded me (AGAIN) that my submission for this month's Voice of Faith was due, and me without a topic to write about (AGAIN); I looked down the hallway and saw our Preschool teachers busy getting the upstairs classrooms back together for the start of what I know is going to be a fantastic new school year. There we go...another ah-ha idea hit me. A New Beginning.

Genesis 6 thru 9 teaches us about Noah, his family and the great flood. Chapter 9 especially tells us of a new beginning, a covenant, between God and his creation and generations to come.

God gives us new beginnings every day. The author of the Book of Lamentations wrote, The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him." Lamentations 3: 22- 24 (ESV). Scholars believe that the prophet Jeremiah penned these shortly after the Babylonians had destroyed Jerusalem in 586 BC....I would call that a new beginning.


The apostle Paul wrote: We were the first to come all the way to you with the gospel of Christ. 2Corinthians 10:14 (ESV). Perhaps the church in Corinth had been taught something about faith in Christ, but it was still new to them a year later. It's not hard to imagine the Corinthians - who for generations had followed Jewish teachings and were daily immersed in Roman culture - still finding Christ's teachings new. Truly a new beginning for them.

Acts gives us another message of a new beginning. We all know the story of believers of the Word, that "they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. ⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." ¹²And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" Act 2:1-12 (ESV). That new beginning was the beginning of the church.

The bible is filled with messages of new beginnings. Everyone of these new beginnings are a gift from our living God and as with any gift, we should not waste it and be thankful for it. Let us all thank God first thing every day for His mercy and grace and the blessings of those New Beginnings.


