



Shared Parental Leave (Adoption)

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1 Definitions

- 1.1 **DEMAT** means the Diocese of Ely Multi-Academy Trust.
- 1.2 **Academy** means a constituent academy of DEMAT.
- 1.3 **Central Team** means Staff who are not employed within an Academy.
- 1.4 **Line Managers** refers to those with line management responsibilities including but not limited to Hub Directors, Head of Department and Headteachers.
- 1.5 **Staff** means any person employed by DEMAT, temporarily or permanently.
- 1.6 **Employee** means any person employed by DEMAT, temporarily or permanently.
- 1.7 **Support staff** means non-teaching staff within an Academy.
- 1.8 **Adopter** means either the person who has been matched with the child for adoption or, where two people have been matched jointly, the person who has elected (at the time they are notified that they have been matched) to be the child's adopter for statutory adoption leave and pay purposes.
- 1.9 **Prospective adopter** means someone who has been approved as suitable to adopt a child and has been notified of that decision.
- 1.10 **Partner** means your spouse, civil partner or someone living with you in an enduring family relationship at the time the child is placed for adoption, but not your sibling, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, aunt, uncle, niece, or nephew.
- 1.11 **Qualifying Week** means the week the adoption agency notifies you that you have been matched with a child for adoption.
- 1.12 **SPL** means Shared Parental Leave.
- 1.13 **SAP** means Statutory Adoption Pay.
- 1.14 **ShPP** means Shared Parental Pay.

2 Application of this Policy

The policy is applicable to all employees (permanent and temporary) of DEMAT.

The above definitions are included for reference purposes for both School and Central Team staff to enable clarify and transparency when applying this policy.

3 Relationship with DEMAT Values

The application of this policy must be applied at all times in a way that reflects the values of DEMAT and our Christian Ethos:

Love – We engender love and tolerance between and for our staff, pupils and others to foster an inspiring atmosphere of mutual support.

Community – We are committed to ensuring our schools are a living part of the community and contribute positively to its needs.

Respect – We do everything to provide a caring, safe and secure place for our staff and pupils to be happy and respected in our schools so they may achieve their potential.

6 Purpose and Scope

6.1 This policy outlines the entitlements and application for leave arrangements for employees wishing to take Shared Parental (Adoption) Leave within DEMAT.

6.2 This policy operates based upon the general principles outlined below:

- The status of an employee's contract of employment during a period of shared parental leave is treated as if they are temporarily absent from work.
- During Shared Parental Leave, all contractual benefits, except pay, continue unaffected and annual leave entitlements accrue as normal.

6.4 A summary of entitlement along with the qualifying requirements are provided in Appendix A, B and C below.

6.5 This policy does not form part of the any employee's contract of employment, and it may be amended at any time, following consultation with trade unions.

6.6 Your terms and conditions of employment remain in force during Shared Parental Leave, except for the terms relating to pay.

6.7 If you are a member of the employer's pension scheme, we will make employer pension contributions during any period of paid SPL, based on your normal salary, in accordance with the pension scheme rules. Any employee contributions you make will be based on the amount of any shared parental pay you are receiving, unless you inform us that you wish to make up any shortfall.

6.8 This policy is part of a suite of family friendly policies.

7. Policy Statement

7.1 The Trust is committed to establishing an inclusive environment where employees feel supported. The Trust recognises that helping new parents, to feel supported in the workplace is an important part of this. Furthermore, we want to encourage efforts to keep new parents who are away from work for a long period of time, connected with their workplace, and confident about their return to work.

8. What is Shared Parental Leave?

8.1 Shared Parental Leave (SPL) is a form of leave that may be available where an adoption agency places a child with you and/or your partner on or after 5 April 2015.

8.2 It gives you and your partner more flexibility in how to share the care of your child in the first year after your child is placed with you for adoption than simply taking adoption and paternity leave. Assuming you are both eligible, you will be able to choose how to split the available leave between you both and can decide to be off work at the same time or at different times. You may be able to take leave in more than one block.

8.3 SPL and SHPP must be taken within 1 year of adoption.

9 Entitlement to SPL

9.1 You may be entitled to SPL if an adoption agency has placed a child with you and/or your partner for adoption and you intend to share the main responsibility for the care of the child with your partner.

9.2 The following conditions must be fulfilled:

9.2.1 You must have at least 26 weeks continuous employment with us by the end of the Qualifying Week, and still be employed by us in the week before the leave is to be taken.

9.2.2 Your partner must have worked (in an employed or self-employed capacity) in at least 26 of the 66 weeks before the Qualifying Week and had average weekly earnings of at least £30 during 13 of those weeks; and

9.2.3 You and your partner must provide the respective employers with the necessary statutory notices and declarations as summarised below, including notice to end adoption leave or statutory adoption pay (SAP).

9.2.4 The total amount of SPL available is 52 weeks, less the weeks of adoption leave taken by either you or your partner (or the weeks in which your partner has been in receipt of SAP if they were not entitled to adoption leave).

9.2.5 Either you or your partner must qualify for statutory adoption leave and/or SAP and must take at least two weeks of adoption leave and/or pay.

10. Opting in to Shared Parental Leave and Pay

10.1 No less than eight weeks before the date you intend your SPL to start, you must give written Notice to Opt-In to Shared Parental Leave scheme (Appendix A) which includes:

10.1.1 Your full name and your partner's full name.

10.1.2 If you are taking adoption leave, your adoption leave start and end dates.

- 10.1.3 If you are not taking adoption leave, your partner's adoption leave start and end dates, or if your partner is not entitled to adoption leave, the start and end dates of their SAP.
- 10.1.4 The total SPL available, which is 52 weeks minus the number of weeks adoption leave or SAP taken or to be taken by you or your partner.
- 10.1.5 How many weeks of the available SPL will be allocated to you and how many to your partner (you can change the allocation by giving us a further written notice, and you do not have to use your full allocation).
- 10.1.6 If you are claiming statutory shared parental pay (ShPP), the total ShPP available, which is 39 weeks (minus the number of weeks of SAP taken or to be taken); payable during the 52-week following your date of adoption.
- 10.1.7 How many weeks of the available ShPP will be allocated to you and how many to your partner (you can change the allocation by giving us a further written notice, and you do not have to use your full allocation).
- 10.1.8 An indication of the pattern of leave you are thinking of taking, including suggested start and end dates for each period of leave (see paragraphs 14, 15, 16 and 17 for information on taking leave). This indication will not be binding at this stage, but please give as much information as you can about your future intentions; and
- 10.1.9 Declarations by you and your partner that you both meet the statutory conditions to enable you to take SPL and ShPP (Appendix A).

11 Ending Adoption Leave

- 11.1 If you are taking or intend to take adoption leave and want to opt-in to the SPL scheme, you must give at least eight weeks' written notice to end your adoption leave early (a curtailment notice) (Appendix B). The notice must state the date your adoption leave will end. You can give the notice before or after adoption leave starts, but you must take at least two weeks adoption leave.
- 11.2 You must also give, at the same time as the curtailment notice, a Notice to Opt-in to Shared Parental Leave scheme (Appendix A) (see paragraph 10) or a written declaration that your partner has given their employer an opt-in notice and that you have given the necessary declarations in that notice.
- 11.3 If your partner is eligible to take SPL from their employer, they cannot start it until you have given us your curtailment notice.

11.4 The curtailment notice is usually binding and cannot be revoked. You can only revoke a curtailment notice if your adoption leave has not yet ended and one of the following applies:

11.4.1 If you realise that neither you nor your partner are in fact eligible for SPL or ShPP, you can revoke the curtailment notice in writing up to eight weeks after it was given;

11.4.2 If your partner has died.

11.5 Once you have revoked a curtailment notice you will be unable to opt back into the SPL scheme.

12 Ending your Partner's Adoption Leave or Pay

12.1 If your partner is taking adoption leave or claiming SAP from their employer, you will only be able to take SPL once your partner has either;

12.1.1 Returned to work;

12.1.2 Given their employer a curtailment notice to end adoption leave; or

12.1.3 Given their employer a curtailment notice to end SAP (if they are entitled to SAP but not adoption leave).

13 Evidence of Entitlement

13.1 You must also provide on request:

13.1.1 One or more documents from the adoption agency showing the agency's name and address and the expected placement date; and

13.1.2 The name and address of your partner's employer (or a declaration that they are self-employed).

14 Discussions regarding Shared Parental Leave

14.1 If you are considering taking SPL you are encouraged to contact your line manager to arrange an informal discussion as early as possible regarding your potential entitlement, to talk about your plans and to enable us to support you.

14.2 Your line manager may upon receiving a notification of entitlement to take SPL seek to arrange an informal discussion with you to talk about your intentions and how you expect to use your SPL entitlement.

- 14.3 Upon receiving a Notice to Opt-in to the Shared Parental Leave scheme form (Appendix A), we will usually arrange a meeting to discuss it. Where a notice is for a single period of continuous leave (a period of a number of weeks taken in a single unbroken period of leave), or for discontinuous leave (where you intend to return to work between periods of leave) and it can be approved without further discussion, a meeting may not be necessary.
- 14.4 Where a meeting is arranged it will take place in private and be arranged in advance. If the initial date is problematic, then another date will be arranged if possible. If an alternative date cannot be arranged, then a discussion may take place over the telephone.
- 14.5 At the meeting you may, if you wish, be accompanied by a workplace colleague or a trade union representative.
- 14.6 The purpose of the meeting is to discuss in detail the leave proposed and what will happen while you are away from work. Where it is a request for discontinuous leave the discussion may also focus on how the leave proposal could be agreed, whether a different arrangement would be agreeable to you and us and what the outcome may be if no agreement is reached.

15 Booking your SPL dates

- 15.1 Having opted into the SPL scheme you will need to give Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C) informing us of the start and end dates of your leave. This can be given at the same time as your Opt-In notice (Appendix A), or it can be given later, if it is given at least eight weeks before the start of your leave. You must also state in your Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave the dates on which you intend to claim shared parental pay ('ShPP'), if applicable.
- 15.2 If your Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C) gives dates for a single period of continuous leave of SPL you will be entitled to take the leave set out in the notice.
- 15.3 You can submit up to three Notices of Dates for Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C). This may enable you to take up to three separate blocks of SPL (although if you give a notice to vary or cancel a period of leave this will in most cases count as a further Notice of Dates for SPL (Appendix C)).

16 Procedure for requesting discontinuous periods of SPL

- 16.1 In general, a Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C) should set out a single continuous block of leave. We may, in some cases, be willing to consider a Notice of Dates for SPL where the SPL is split into shorter periods (of at least a week) with periods of work in between. It is best to discuss this with your line manager in advance of submitting any Notice of Dates for SPL (Appendix C). This will give us more time to consider the request and hopefully agree a pattern of leave with you from the start.

- 16.2 You must submit a Notice of Dates for SPL (Appendix C) setting out the requested pattern of leave at least eight weeks before the requested start date. If we are unable to agree to your request straight away, there will be a two-week discussion period. At the end of that period, we will confirm any agreed arrangements in writing. If we have not reached an agreement, you will be entitled to take the full amount of requested SPL as one continuous block, starting on the start date given in your notice (for example, if you requested three separate periods of four weeks each, they will be combined into one 12-week period of leave). Alternatively, you may:
- 16.1.1 choose a new start date (which must be at least eight weeks after your original Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave was given), and tell us within five days of the end of the two-week discussion period: or
 - 16.1.2 withdraw your Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave within fifteen days of the date of the Notice (in which case it will not be counted, and you may submit a new one if you choose).

17 Changing the dates or cancelling your SPL

- 17.1 You can cancel a period of leave by notifying us in writing at least eight weeks before the start date in the Notice of Dates of Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C).
- 17.2 You can change the start date for a period of leave, or the length of the period of leave, by notifying us in writing at least eight weeks before the original start date or the new start date, whichever is earlier.
- 17.3 You can change the end date for a period of leave by notifying us in writing at least eight weeks before the original end date, or the new end date, whichever is earlier.
- 17.4 You can change split periods of leave into a single continuous period of leave by notifying us in writing at least eight weeks before the start date of the first period, or in writing at least eight weeks before the original end date if the leave has already commenced.
- 17.5 You can request that a continuous period of leave be split into two or more discontinuous periods with periods of work in between. We will consider any such request as set out in paragraph 11.
- 17.6 A notice to change or cancel a period of leave will count as one of your three Notices of Dates for Shared Parental Leave, unless:
 - 17.7 A Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C) requesting a discontinuous period of SPL is withdrawn by you on or before the fifteenth day after the notice was given;
 - 17.7.1 The variation is a result of the child being placed with you earlier or later than the expected placement date;
 - 17.7.2 The variation is at our request; or
 - 17.7.3 We agree otherwise.

18 Shared Parental Pay (ShPP)

- 18.1 ShPP is payable for a maximum of 37 weeks during the 50-weeks following the date of adoption, as 2 weeks Statutory Adoption Pay (SAP) must be taken.
- 18.2 You may be able to claim ShPP if you have at least 26 weeks' continuous employment with us at the end of the Qualifying Week and your average earnings are not less than the lower earnings limit set by the government each tax year.
- 18.3 ShPP is paid at a rate set by the government each year.

19 Keeping in touch

- 19.1 We may make reasonable contact with you from time to time during your SPL although we will keep this to a minimum. This may include contacting you to discuss arrangements for your return to work.
- 19.2 You may ask or be asked to work (including attending training) on up to 20 'shared parental leave in touch' days ('SPLIT' days) during your SPL. This is in addition to any 'keeping in touch' days (KIT days) that you may have taken during adoption leave. KIT/SPLIT days are not compulsory and must be discussed and agreed with us. Any SPLIT days worked do not extend the period of SPL.
- 19.3 You will be paid at your normal basic rate of pay for time spent working on a SPLIT day and this will be inclusive of any shared parental pay entitlement.

20 Returning to work

- 19.1 If you want to end a period of SPL early, you must give us eight weeks written notice of the new return date. This should be addressed to your Line Manager. If you have already given us three Notices of Dates for Shared Parental Leave (Appendix C), requesting that a discontinuous period of SPL is withdrawn by you on or before the fifteenth day after the notice was given, you will not be able to end your SPL early without our agreement.
- 19.2 If you want to extend your SPL, assuming you still have unused SPL entitlement remaining, you must submit a new 'Notice of Dates for Shared Parental Leave' form (Appendix C) at least eight weeks before the date you were due to return to work. If you have already submitted notices, you will not be able to extend your SPL without our agreement. If you are unable to request more SPL you may be able to request annual leave or ordinary parental leave, which will be subject to our need for you to be at work.
- 19.3 You are normally entitled to return to work in the position you held before starting SPL, and on the same terms of employment. However, if it is not reasonably practicable for us to allow you to return into the same position, we may give you another suitable and appropriate job on terms and condition that are not less favourable, but only in the following circumstances:

- 19.3.1 If your SPL and any adoption or paternity leave you have taken adds up to more than 26 weeks in total (whether or not taken consecutively); or
 - 19.3.2 If you took SPL consecutively with more than four weeks of ordinary parental leave.
 - 19.3.4 If you want to change your hours or other working arrangements on return from SPL you should make a request under our Flexible Working Policy. It is helpful if such requests are made as early as possible.
- 19.4 If you decide you do not want to return to work, you should give notice of resignation in accordance with your contract.

Appendix A: Notice to Opt-In to

Shared Parental Leave (Adoption)

Use this form to opt-in to the shared parental leave scheme following the placement of a child for adoption. A separate form is available for birth parents. Please see our Shared Parental Leave Policy for more information.

If you are the child's adopter, you must also submit a signed **Notice to End Adoption Leave Early (Curtailment Notice)** (Appendix B) to bring your adoption leave entitlement to an end. Please discuss this form, in particular the dates in sections B and C, with your line manager before completing it.

Guidance notes. Shared parental leave may be shared between a child's adopter and their Partner. Both parties must expect to share the main responsibility for the child's upbringing.

"Partner" means the adopter's spouse, civil partner, or other person living with the adopter in an enduring family relationship, but who is not the adopter's sibling, parent, child, grandparent, grandchild, aunt, uncle, niece or nephew.
