

Families must be Active Members for a child to be eligible to receive any Sacrament.

Families must be Active Members to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School.

Active status must be maintained for families in the Schools and Sacramental Program.





SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Pope Greogory the Great

Given Name: Gregory

Period: 540- March 12, 604

Papacy: Sept 3, 590- March 12, 604 (64th Pope) Place of Birth: Rome, Italy, Eastern Roman Empire

Parents: Gordianus, & Silvia
Canonization: By Popular Acclamation

Patron of: Musicians, singers, students, and teachers Special Title: One of the three Popes called 'the great'

(Others: St. Leo I & St. Nicholas I)



Saint Gregory the Great was born into a noble family of Rome. His father was a senator and later on the Prefect of Rome (Mayor in today's language). His mother Silvia was a woman known for her virtuous life and was later recognized as a saint. Saint Gregory the Great's family was both wealthy and influential; but more importantly, it was a pious Catholic family that ensured him solid intellectual and spiritual formation from an early age.

It was a turbulent time in the Roman history. As a child and teenager, he witnessed war and diseases ravaging the city. The conflict between the ruling Ostrogoths and the Eastern Roman empire (535-554) destroyed too many lives and the city. Some unconfirmed historians claim that Gregory's family had to flee the city for a while and returned once peace was restored and the Eastern Roman emperor took control of Italy. Order and peace returned, and people started to rebuild the city.

Young Gregory was a leader in the making following the footsteps of his father and started assuming significant roles even as a teenager. At the age of 33, he was elected the Prefect of Rome, a position held by his father earlier. In a short while his father died, and that caused a major shift in the course of his life. He resigned from his office, turned his estate to a monastery, took monastic vows. He spent the following four years as a monk dedicating his life exclusively to prayer and study. Later on, he counted those years as his happiest years.

Gregory was ordained a deacon along with six others in 578, by Pope Pelagius II, and a year later he was sent to Constantinople as Papal envoy. During the next six years there, while representing the Pope in the imperial court, he maintained a monastic life dedicated to study and prayer, without compromising on his challenging duties. During those years he started writing his famous commentary on the book of Job, dealing with the Christian understanding of human suffering, the nature of God, the problem of evil, and the virtue of patience.

After six years of stellar service, Deacon Gregory returned to Rome and his preferred monastic life. When Pope Pelagius II died in 590, he was elected as the 64th Pope. Pope Gregory I was the first monk to be elected a pope. His papacy, one of the most consequential papacies, lasted for fourteen years (590-604). During his papacy, he significantly reformed both Church administration and liturgy. He set strict rules to manage the properties and finance of the church. He took measures to curb nepotism and increase transparency. He almost emptied the papal treasury to serve the hungry and the needy. He helped the poor both systematically and in discreet manner respecting the honor of the receiver. He also forged important strategic military and political alliances that strengthened the papacy and ensured the safety and betterment of those under his care. Many civil leaders also turned to him for guidance. He worked tirelessly to standardize the Liturgy offering clear guidelines for rubrics, establishing prayers, the flow of the Mass, and the liturgical year. His contributions to develop the liturgical chant is well acknowledged, and thus, they are called the 'Gregorian Chant.'

He had great missionary spirit. He wanted to be a missionary himself. He sent the first team of missionaries to the land of Angles and Saxons in England. These missions were ultimately very successful through the efforts of Saint Augustine of Canterbury and forty of his brother monks, who were sent from Pope Gregory's own monastery.


He was a prolific writer also. More than 800 letters, commentaries on Scripture, the "Pastoral Rule" (*Regula Pastoralis*), an influential guide for bishops and other church leaders, are among his contributions. His "Dialogues" are a collection of inspiring visions, miracles, and stories of the lives of the saints, including an early biography of St. Benedict. His works contributed significantly in shaping the future for both secular worlds, and the Church for centuries to come. Thus, he is rightly called the great among the saints, and the saint among the greats.

'Enduring legacies cannot be fabricated, purchased, or contrived. They are the result of true leadership and the profound impact one leaves behind. Pope Gregory I is now known as Saint Gregory the Great. He is "great" because he not only had a major influence upon the people of his time, both religiously and politically, but also because his influence and writings solidified the direction that the Church would take after him. His first loves were of Christ and the monastic way of life. God used Gregory's humble way of life as a foundation upon which He would continue to build His Church.'

Pope Gregory died in 604, at the age of 64, after a prolonged illness that bothered him throughout his papacy.

Gregory is honored, along with Augustine, Jerome and Ambrose, as one of the four Great Latin Church Fathers, and is a Doctor of the Church. He is considered a saint not only in the Catholic Church, but also in Eastern Orthodox Church, Anglican Communion, various Lutheran denominations, and other Protestant denominations. Immediately after his death, Gregory was canonized by popular acclaim. He is the patron saint of musicians and teachers.

Meditación del Evangelio - 23.° Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario. 7 de septiembre de 2025.

Para seguir a Jesús debemos realizar ciertos cambios en la vida, que implican salir de nuestro confort. Renunciar a cosas y situaciones a las que no estamos acostumbrados, pensamos, es casi imposible. Pero, recuerde, nada es imposible para Dios. Dejar nuestros caprichos, manías y malos hábitos que se oponen al Evangelio es cosa de trabajo y proceso. "El que no carga con su propia cruz para seguirme no puede ser discípulo mío" (Lucas 14:27).

El Papa Francisco, en su catequesis, nos ayuda a comprender el mensaje de Jesús para que nuestra carga sea ligera y apreciemos la cruz que llevamos en nuestra vida. "Hay tres características que trazan claramente la personalidad de Jesús y que motivan nuestra confianza en Él: nos encomendamos a Él porque ora por nosotros, porque nos ha elegido y porque está cerca de nosotros: es el intercesor. Jesús ama y elige con amor, nos elige a todos. Y la cercanía de Dios a su pueblo es la cercanía de Jesús con la gente".

A Jesús le importa nuestra libertad, no quiere que lo sigamos a ciegas. Cargar con la cruz quiere decir medir y calcular las fuerzas que tenemos y darnos cuenta de cuánta fidelidad a sus enseñanzas existe en nuestro corazón. 'El nos ayuda con su gracia, cuando flaqueamos. ¿Quieres seguir a Jesús? Pues, adelante, Él te espera siempre.

El Jubileo

'Jubileo' es el nombre de un año particular: parece que deriva del instrumento utilizado para indicar su comienzo; se trata del yobel, el cuerno de carnero, cuyo sonido anuncia el Día de la Expiación (Yom Kippur). Esta fiesta se celebra cada año, pero adquiere un significado particular cuando coincide con el inicio del año jubilar. A este respecto, encontramos una primera idea en la Biblia: debía ser convocado cada 50 años, porque era el año 'extra', debía vivirse cada siete semanas de años (siete veces siete años, *es decir, cuarenta y nueve años*).



(cfr. Lv 25,8 □ 13). En 1470, el Papa Pablo II estableció la periodicidad actual de cada 25 años.

Aunque era difícil de realizar, se proponía como la ocasión para restablecer la correcta relación con Dios, con las personas y con la creación, y conllevaba el perdón de las deudas, la restitución de terrenos enajenados y el descanso de la tierra.

La Puerta. Desde el punto de vista simbólico, la Puerta Santa adquiere un significado particular: es el signo más característico, porque la meta es poder atravesarla. Su apertura por parte del Papa constituye el inicio oficial del Año Santo. Originalmente, solo había una puerta, en la Basílica de San Juan de Letrán, que es la catedral del obispo de Roma. Para que los numerosos peregrinos pudieran hacer este gesto, las demás Basílicas de Roma también ofrecieron esta posibilidad. Al cruzar este umbral, el peregrino recuerda el texto del capítulo 10 del evangelio según san Juan: "Yo soy la puerta: quien entre por mí se salvará y podrá entrar y salir, y encontrará pastos". El gesto expresa la decisión de seguir y de dejarse guiar por Jesús, que es el Buen Pastor.

Bautismo. Los padres que deseen bautizar a sus hijos deben comunicarse con la oficina parroquial por lo menos 3 meses antes de la fecha estimada para informarse del proceso. Una sesión preparatoria es obligatoria para los padres y padrinos. A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe y los adultos a través del programa de Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial <u>al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada</u> de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Si ha estado casado anteriormente, le sugerimos iniciar más de un año antes si no ha obtenido una declaración de nulidad.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de Miembro Activo. No podemos emitir tal declaración si usted no es un miembro inscrito y activo de Blessed Sacrament. (Ver "Definición de Miembro Activo" en el siguiente artículo).

DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados "miembros inscritos y activos" cuando:

- 1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
- 2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
- 3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Una familia sin actividad por un tiempo prolongado se interpreta como que la familia ha dejado de pertenecer a nuestra parroquia. Si está de vacaciones por un tiempo prolongado, por favor, <u>notifíquenos,</u> para mantener su estado activo; igualmente si es por enfermedad, y así, además, lo incluiremos en nuestras oraciones.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo solo se pueden tomar en cuenta cuando se colocan en la colecta dentro del sobre personalizado de la parroquia.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.

Las familias deben ser miembros activos para poder optara recibir un sacramento. Asimismo, para recibir un descuento en el costo educacional tanto del Colegio Católico Blessed Sacrament como de la secundaria Bishop England.

Las familias con estudiantes en la Formación en la Fe y los colegios mencionados deben mantener su estado de miembro activo, permanentemente.

Cuando los hijos de una familia miembro de la parroquia terminan el bachillerato y tienen 18 años o más, deben inscribirse individualmente como miembros adultos y los animamos a que participen como discípulos corresponsables de su parroquia.
