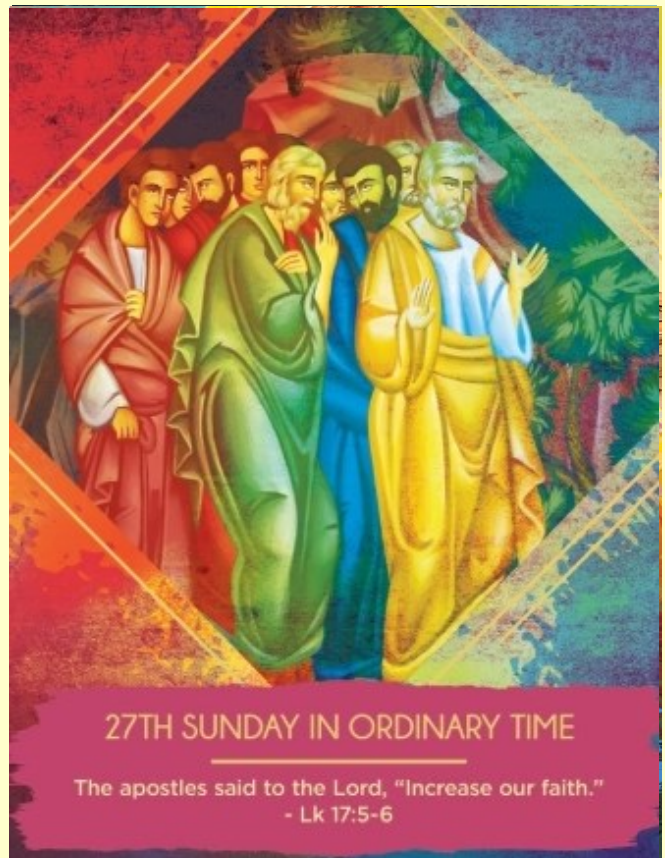

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory class is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a wedding.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION: Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please email blsacfaithformation@gmail.com.

An extended time with no activity will place a person or family on inactive status.

- ~ If you give online, please turn in your empty envelopes weekly at Mass and check "I give online."
- ~ If you contribute periodically through the collection, please remember to put in envelopes weekly, even if empty.
- ~ Contributions in cash can only be considered when presented in the parish envelope.
- ~ Multiple envelopes put in at a weekend Mass will be considered participation for that one Mass.
- ~ Envelopes Dropped off or Mailed will not be considered participation at Mass.
- ~ Blank Green envelopes are available in the church if needed.

Families must be Active Members for a child to be eligible to receive any Sacrament.

Families must be Active Members to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School.

Active status must be maintained for families in the Schools and Sacramental Program.

TO PARTICIPATE AS FULLY ENGAGED STEWARDS OF THE PARISH.



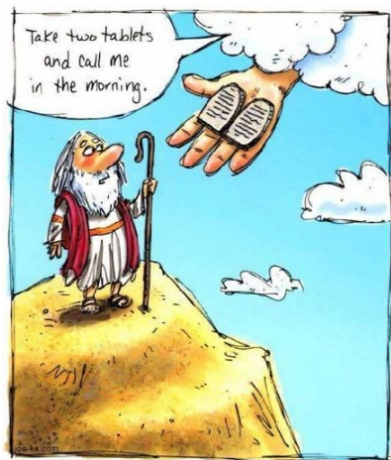

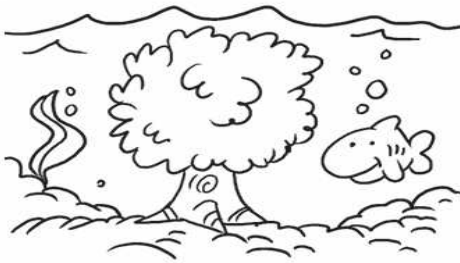

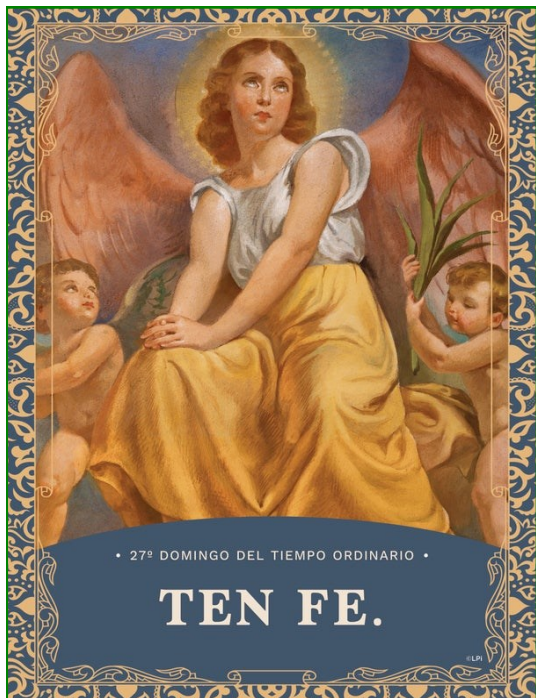

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Meditación del Evangelio. 27º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario - 5 de octubre de 2025.

El Padre que Sabe lo que Quieres. Es fácil darle a tu hijo lo que está pidiendo. Es difícil darle lo que “quiere”. Si un niño pide comer un cono de helado, no hay nada de malo en darle uno. Pero si está exigiendo de mal humor un cono de helado a las 7:45 de la mañana, lo que quiere, ya sea que se dé cuenta o no, es algo de proteína y granos integrales y un poco de aliento para seguir adelante con su día. Así que le das huevos y pan tostado, y lo ves luchar para aceptarlo. A veces lo hace y a veces no, pero, de cualquier manera, estarás aquí. Lo perdonarás por los apodos que te diga y pondrás el desayuno saludable en la nevera, esperándolo cuando esté listo para comerlo.

"Aumenta mi fe". Se lo he dicho a Dios muchas veces, imaginando una vida de oración que no requiere esfuerzo y una vida sacramental que no tiene complicaciones, una aceptación de la verdad que es inquebrantable. Fe fácil, eso es lo que pido, y mucha, por favor.

Pero la fe fácil no es fe en absoluto, y la fe en que no eres lo suficientemente fuerte para sostenerla te romperá los brazos. Y lo que Dios nunca hará, es decir: "Claro, niño, aquí tienes", y hacer pasar un regalo falso como si fuera real, solo para que ambos nos sintamos bien. No me entregará algo para lo que no sea lo suficientemente fuerte para sostener.

Esa sería una jugada clásica de padre perezoso. Eso sería un movimiento de cono de helado a las 7:45 a.m.

En cambio, Él observa cuidadosamente mientras navego por el terreno accidentado de la vida espiritual, listo para susurrarme instrucciones al oído. Él contiene la respiración mientras los desafíos de este mundo crean profundos surcos en mi alma, y luego riega esos surcos con las aguas vivificantes de la gracia, transformándolos en valles de consuelo y respiro.

A veces lo llamo por apodos. A veces rechazo lo que Él me ofrece. Después de todo, no es lo que pedí.

Pero es lo que quiero. Por suerte, Él lo sabe mejor que yo.

Celebración de Sacramentos

Bautismo. Los padres que deseen bautizar a sus hijos deben comunicarse con la oficina parroquial por lo menos 3 meses antes de la fecha estimada para informarse del proceso. Una sesión preparatoria es obligatoria para los padres y padrinos. A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe y los adultos a través del programa de Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Si ha estado casado anteriormente, le sugerimos iniciar más de un año antes si no ha obtenido una declaración de nulidad.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

*Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de **Miembro Activo**. ¿Por qué se celebra la fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario?

El Papa San Pío V sabía que la Virgen había intercedido por la Santa Liga, asegurándoles la victoria. De hecho, el 7 de octubre de 1571, fecha de la batalla de Lepanto, él vio a la Santísima Madre en una visión en la que le reveló la victoria.

Como ofrenda de agradecimiento, el Papa declaró ese día fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria, conocida más tarde como Nuestra Señora del Rosario.

¿Por qué se llama a María Reina del Santo Rosario?

María es la Reina Madre porque su Hijo es Cristo Rey. El rosario, según se le dio a Santo Domingo, es una meditación de los misterios del Rey encarnado, y por ende, también de los dolores y gozos de Su Madre. Así, María está tan profundamente unida al rosario que no puede pensarse en el rosario sin pensar en María.

¿A quién le dio el Rosario María?

En el siglo XIII, la Santísima Virgen se apareció en visiones a Santo Domingo y lo inspiró a crear el rosario tal como se lo conoce hoy.

DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados “miembros inscritos y activos” cuando:

1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Una familia sin actividad por un tiempo prolongado se interpreta como que la familia ha dejado de pertenecer a nuestra parroquia. Si está de vacaciones por un tiempo prolongado, por favor, notifiquenos, para mantener su estado activo; igualmente si es por enfermedad, y así, además, lo incluiremos en nuestras oraciones.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo solo se pueden tomar en cuenta cuando se colocan en la colecta dentro del sobre personalizado de la parroquia.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.

Las familias deben ser miembros activos para poder optar a recibir un sacramento. Asimismo, para recibir un descuento en el costo educacional tanto del Colegio Católico Blessed Sacrament como de la secundaria Bishop England.

Las familias con estudiantes en la Formación en la Fe y los colegios mencionados deben mantener su estado de miembro activo, permanentemente.
