

- ~ Contributions in cash can only be considered when presented in the parish envelope.
- ~ Multiple envelopes put in at a weekend Mass will be considered participation for that one Mass.
- ~ Envelopes Dropped off or Mailed will not be considered participation at Mass.
- ~ Blank Green envelopes are available in the church if needed.

Families must be Active Members for a child to be eligible to receive any Sacrament.

Families must be Active Members to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School.

Active status must be maintained for families in the Schools and Sacramental Program.



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Martin de Porres

Name: Martin De Porres Velázquez

Period: 9 December 1579 – 3 November 1639

Place of Birth: Lima, Peru

(Then Viceroyalty of Peru, Spanish Empire)

Father: Don Juan de Porras y de la Peña

(Spanish Nobleman)


Mother: Ana Velázquez

(a freed slave of African and Native descent)

Beatification: 29 October 1837 Canonization: 6 May 1962 Feast Day: November 3

Patron of: Black people, people of mixed race, innkeepers, barbers, public health workers, all

those seeking racial harmony, and animals



Poverty forced Martin to leave the school after two years in a primary school. Then he learned the trade of barber surgeon. Even from an young age he spent hours of the night in prayer, and the habit grew stronger as he grew older.

Although Martin wanted to lead a consecrated life, the existing rules prohibited it for Africans and native Americans. He gained an entry to the Dominican order through an option to be a "donado," a volunteer who performed menial tasks in the monastery in return for the privilege of wearing the habit and living with the religious community. Thus, he became a 'donado' in the Dominican Priory of the Holy Rosary, in Lima. He joined the monastery when he was 15 and was later on promoted to the status of 'Almoner,' (person in charge of distributing money to the poor in a monastery).

Martin's life in the monastery included working in the kitchen and laundry, cleaning, barbering, and taking care of the sick. During this period, he is said to have performed many miraculous healings. After eight years, De Lorenzana, the prior of the monastery, exempted Martin from the rule and let him take the vows to become a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. Some of the members of the monastery were not as charitable as the Prior, and they insulted him for his color, and his birth (he was considered as an illegitimate child). At the age of 24, in the year 1603, he took his vows, despite his early reluctance owing to his humility.

Martin was a deep devote of the Blessed Sacrament. One night he was praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament, when the step of the altar he was kneeling on caught fire. Throughout all the confusion and chaos that followed, he remained where he was, unaware of what was happening around him.

At the age of 34, he was assigned to infirmary, where he served until his death at the age of 59. He was known for his compassion, patience and dedication in taking care of the sick even during the difficult times. His service broke the boundaries of the monasteries, and he started bringing outsiders inside to treat them. Legends say that even a glass of water that he served cured the sick. Many miracles were reported of such



miraculous healing. He ministered without any distinction of class or color, serving both Spanish nobles and African slaves with the same compassion and love. "One day an aged beggar, covered with ulcers and almost naked, stretched out his hand, and Martin let the man use his own bed. When one of his brethren reproved him, Martin replied: "Compassion, my dear Brother, is preferable to cleanliness.""

During an epidemic, when more than 60 in the monastery was sick, and the sick novices were sheltered in a separate and distant place, Martin is said to have miraculously passed through the locked doors to reach them and serve them. When the Provincial Superior forbade him from bringing the sick to the monastery, for fear of the friars getting threatened by the epidemic, his sister offered her house in the country to accommodate the sick, and Martin treated them there.

"One day he found on the street a poor Indian, bleeding to death from a dagger wound, and took him to his own room until he could transport him to his sister's hospice. The prior, when he heard of this, reprimanded him for disobedience. He was extremely edified, however, by his reply: "Forgive my error, and please instruct me, for I did not know that the precept of obedience took precedence over that of charity." The prior gave him liberty thereafter to follow his inspirations in the exercise of mercy."

"Martin did not eat meat. He begged for alms to procure necessities the convent could not provide. In normal times, he succeeded with his alms in feeding 160 poor persons every day, and distributed a remarkable sum of money every week to the indigent. Side by side with his daily work in the kitchen, laundry and infirmary, Martin's life is said to have reflected extraordinary gifts: ecstasies that lifted him into the air, light filling the room where he prayed, bilocation, miraculous knowledge, instantaneous cures and a remarkable rapport with animals. He founded a residence for orphans and abandoned children in the city of Lima."

"Martin was a friend of both Saint Juan Macías, a fellow Dominican lay brother, and Saint Rose of Lima, another lay Dominican. By his death on 3 November 1639, he had won the affection and respect of many of his fellow Dominicans as well as a host of people outside the priory. Word of his miracles had made him known as a saint throughout the region. As his body was displayed to allow the people of the city to pay their respects, each person snipped a tiny piece of his habit to keep as a relic."

"Martin de Porres is often depicted as a young mixed-race friar wearing the old habit of the Dominican lay brother, a black scapular and *capuce*, along with a broom, since he considered all work to be sacred, no matter how menial. He is sometimes shown with a dog, a cat and a mouse eating in peace from the same dish."

St. Martin De Porres calls us to holiness through his saintly life and intercessions.



## Meditación del Evangelio. 2 de noviembre de 2025. Conmemoración de todos los fieles difuntos

Hoy recordamos a nuestros familiares y amigos difuntos. Elevamos nuestras oraciones con las palabras del Salmo 130: "Desde el abismo clamo a ti, Señor: ¡Señor, escucha mi voz! Que tus oídos estén atentos al clamor de mis súplicas". De esta forma, la Iglesia conmemora a todos los fieles difuntos.

El Papa Francisco nos dice: "La Conmemoración de los difuntos tiene un doble sentido. Un sentido de tristeza: un cementerio es triste, nos recuerda a nuestros seres queridos que se han marchado, nos recuerda también el futuro, la muerte; pero en esta tristeza, nosotros llevamos flores, como signo de esperanza. Puedo decir, también, de fiesta, pero más adelante, no ahora. Y la tristeza se mezcla con la esperanza. Y esto es lo que todos nosotros sentimos hoy, en esta celebración: la memoria de nuestros seres queridos, ante sus restos, y la esperanza. Pero sentimos también que esta esperanza nos ayuda, porque también nosotros tenemos que recorrer este camino. Todos nosotros recorreremos este camino. Antes o después, pero todos. Con dolor, más o menos dolor, pero todos. Pero con la flor de la esperanza, con ese hilo fuerte que está anclado en el más allá. Esta ancla no decepciona: la esperanza de la resurrección". No debe existir ninguna duda, el Evangelio confirma esta ancla, que es Jesús y su promesa de vida eterna: "Toda persona que al contemplar al Hijo crea en Él, tendrá vida eterna, y yo la resucitaré en el último día" (Juan 6:40).

### DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados "miembros inscritos y activos" cuando:

- 1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
- 2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
- 3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Una familia sin actividad por un tiempo prolongado se interpreta como que la familia ha dejado de pertenecer a nuestra parroquia. Si está de vacaciones por un tiempo prolongado, por favor, <u>notifíquenos.</u> para mantener su estado activo; igualmente si es por enfermedad, y así, además, lo incluiremos en nuestras oraciones.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo solo se pueden tomar en cuenta cuando se colocan en la colecta dentro del sobre personalizado de la parroquia.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.

Las familias deben ser miembros activos para poder optar a recibir un sacramento. Asimismo, para recibir un descuento en el costo educacional tanto del Colegio Católico Blessed Sacrament como de la secundaria Bishop England.
