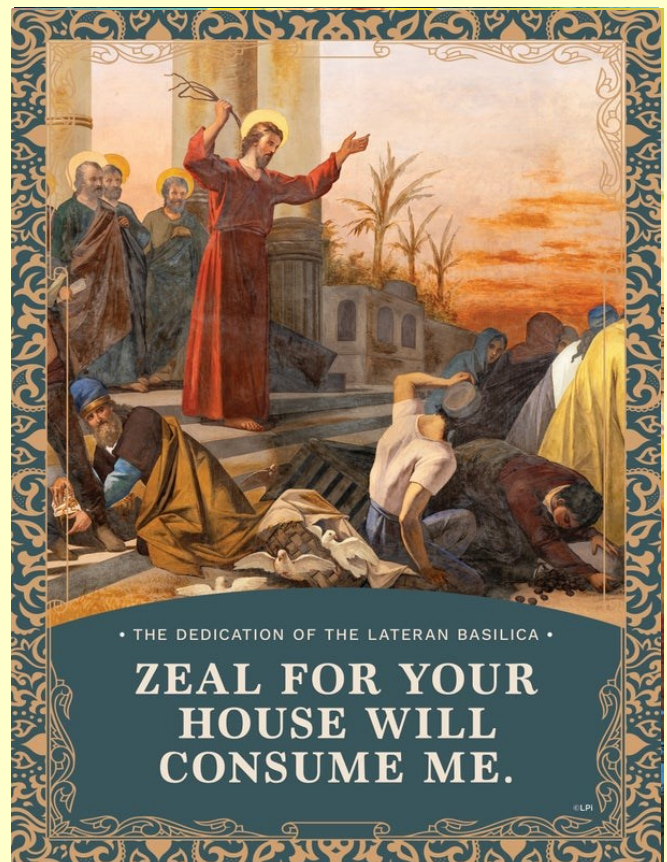

WE WELCOME ALL NEWCOMERS AND VISITORS TO BLESSED SACRAMENT CATHOLIC CHURCH. If you would like to register at Blessed Sacrament, registration forms are available at the back of the church, in the parish office, or you may register online at blsac.org.

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory class is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a wedding.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION: Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please email blsacfaithformation@gmail.com.

VISITING THE SICK: Please inform the Parish Office should a relative/friend who is homebound/hospitalized need a pastoral visit or the Sacrament of Anointing. A priest will attend to the Sacrament.

Our Parish-established criteria is used to verify parishioner status for Weddings, Sacramental Preparation, Sponsor Certificates for Baptism and Confirmation, and to receive parishioner tuition rates at Catholic schools.

Families must be Active Members for a child to be eligible to receive any Sacrament.

Families must be Active Members to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School.

Active status must be maintained for families in the Schools and Sacramental Program.

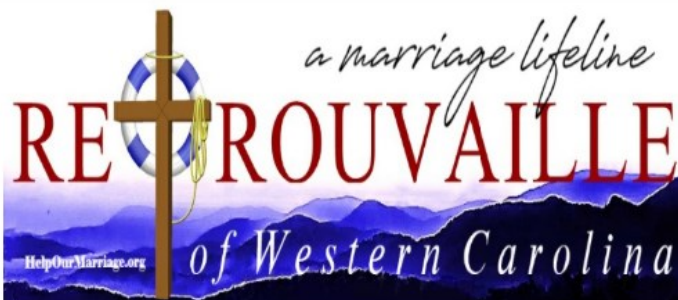

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Leo the Great

Given Name:	Leo (Leone)
Period:	C.391- Nov 10, 461
Papacy:	Sept 29, 440- Nov 10, 461
Place of Birth:	Tuscany, Italy

Pope Leo I also known as Leo the Great was Bishop of Rome. He is the first of the three Popes listed in the Annuario Pontificio with the title "the Great", alongside Popes Gregory I and Nicholas I.

Leo was a Roman aristocrat. He is perhaps best known for meeting Attila the Hun in 452 and persuading him to turn back from his invasion of Italy. He is also a Doctor of the Church, most remembered theologically for issuing the Tome of Leo, a document which was a major foundation to the debates of the Council of Chalcedon, the fourth ecumenical council. That meeting dealt primarily with Christology and elucidated the definition of Christ's being as the hypostatic union of two natures, divine and human, united in one person, "with neither confusion nor division". It was followed by a major schism associated with Monophysitism, Miaphysitism and Dyophysitism. He also contributed significantly to developing ideas of papal authority. . . .

Papacy

During Leo's absence in Gaul, Pope Sixtus III died on 11 August 440, and on 29 September Leo was unanimously elected by the people to succeed him. Soon after assuming the papal throne, Leo learned that in Aquileia, Pelagians were received into church communion without formal repudiation of their heresy; he censured this practice and directed that a provincial synod be held where such former Pelagians be required to make an unequivocal abjuration. . . .

From a pastoral perspective, he energized charitable works in a Rome beset by famines, an influx of refugees, and poverty. He further associated the practice of fasting with charity and almsgiving, particularly on the occasion of the Quatuor tempora, (the quarterly Ember days). It was during Leo's papacy that the term "Pope", which previously meant any bishop, came to exclusively mean the Bishop of Rome. . . .

On the fundamental dignity of Christians

In his In Nativitate Domini, Christmas Day, sermon, "Christian, remember your dignity", Leo articulates a fundamental dignity common to all Christians, whether saints or sinners, and the consequent obligation to live up to it."

Death and burial

Leo died on 10 November 461 and, as he wished to be buried as close as possible to the tomb of St. Peter, his body was entombed within the portico of Old St. Peter's Basilica. He was the first pope to be buried within St. Peter's. In 688, Pope Sergius I had Leo's remains moved to the south transept, inside the basilica. The relocation was apparently due to the number of later papal burials obscuring the prominence that Sergius believed Leo's tomb should have.

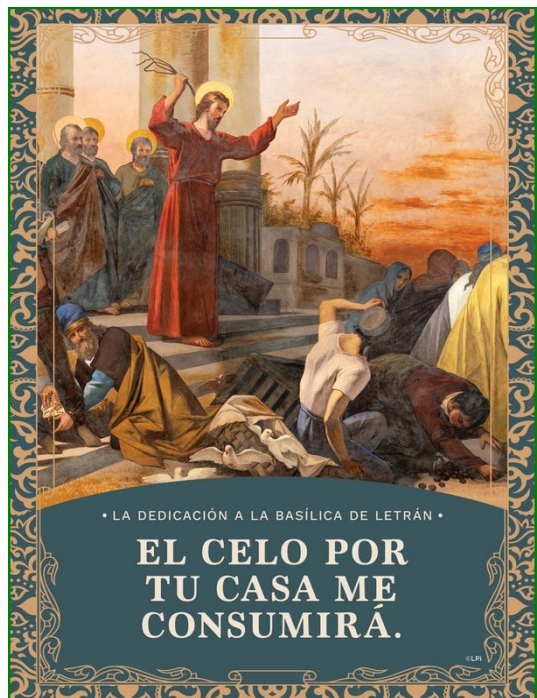
Significance

Pope Benedict XVI said that Leo's papacy was "undoubtedly one of the most important in the Church's history".

In 1754 Pope Benedict XIV proclaimed Leo I as a Doctor of the Church. Next to Leo only one other pope, Gregory I, is also recognized as Doctor of the Church.

Meditación del Evangelio. 9 de noviembre de 2025. **Dedicación de la Basílica de Beltrán**

El Espíritu de Dios vive en nosotros. La dignidad humana radica en esto: en que somos templo vivo del Espíritu Santo. Este es el gran regalo de Dios a nosotros, otorgado por la gracia. El apóstol san Pablo nos ofrece una poderosa reflexión al respecto: “¿No saben que son templo de Dios y que el Espíritu de Dios habita en ustedes? Si alguno destruye el templo de Dios, Dios lo destruirá a él. El templo de Dios es sagrado, y ese templo son ustedes” (1 Corintios 3:16–17). Saber esto conlleva una gran responsabilidad para cada uno de nosotros. ¿Cómo cuido el templo de Dios que es mi cuerpo? ¿Qué tipo de cimientos sostienen su construcción diaria? Recuerda que su principal función es demostrar que allí habita el Dios vivo.

El pasaje del Evangelio nos presenta otra imagen de la hermosura y santidad del templo: “Jesús purifica el templo, y lo hace con el látigo en la mano. Se pone a expulsar las actitudes paganas, en este caso, de los mercaderes que vendían y habían transformado el templo en pequeños negocios. Jesús purifica el templo reprendiendo: ‘Está escrito: mi casa será casa de oración, no de otra cosa’. El templo es un lugar sagrado. Y nosotros debemos entrar allí, en la sacralidad que nos lleva a la adoración. No hay otra cosa. Hay dos templos: el templo material, lugar de adoración, y el templo espiritual dentro de mí, donde mora el Espíritu Santo” (Papa Francisco).

San Josafat Obispo y mártir - 14 de noviembre

San Josafat nació en Vladimir, Ucrania, el 1580, con el nombre de Juan Koncewicz. Era hijo de un cónsul y fue educado en el cisma de Focio y Cerulario. El año 1595, a sus 15 años, empieza a trabajar en un comercio de Vilna, Lituania. En los ratos libres se dedica a la lectura, sobre todo de santos, y también al penoso tema de la unión de las Iglesias.

Ese mismo año de 1595 se promulga en Brest-Litowosk, con la autoridad del metropolitano de Kiev, el decreto de unión de los Eslavos Orientales con Roma. Clemente VIII publica la constitución *Magnus Dominus* para celebrarlo.

Josafat se decidió a la unión con la Iglesia católica, sin renunciar a las peculiaridades de Oriente. Al contrario, defendió la conservación del Rito Oriental Esloveno y la Orden monástica de San Basilio, en la Iglesia Universal. El mismo se hizo monje basiliano en Viena, y cambió su nombre Juan por Josafat. Allí se entregó a la piedad y a las más duras penitencias. El metropolitano de Kiev afirma que «en breve tiempo llegó a ser maestro de todos, en la ciencia, en la disciplina religiosa y en todas las virtudes».

El año 1614, ya ordenado sacerdote, es nombrado archimandrita. El monasterio floreció en afanes de santidad y en anhelos de unión con Roma. Josafat

entusiasmaba y arrebatava a todos con su dialéctica irrefutable.

En 1618 es nombrado obispo de Pólotzk, con lo que su influencia se extiende mucho más. El ejemplo de su vida casta, pobre y de gran generosidad para todos, era la mejor fuerza de su apostolado. Por socorrer a los pobres se desprendía de todo, hasta de las cosas más necesarias.

Escribe varios folletos sobre el bautismo de San Vladimiro, sobre el primado de Pedro y en defensa de la fe católica. La Rutenia Blanca le oye con admiración. Crece su fama. También el odio de los cismáticos, que le llamaban «el apóstata papista». Es perseguido. Sufre atentados. El sigue en la brecha y se ofrece como víctima. Lo que importa es la unión.

El día 12 de noviembre de 1623 culminó su heroica carrera en Vitebsk. Fue rodeado de sus más encarnizados enemigos, le hirieron de bala y fue rematado con un golpe de hoz. El Santo había previsto que no podría acabar de otra manera, al predicar con tanta valentía la verdad ante tantos enemigos. Pero él sabía que también había acabado así su divino Maestro. El discípulo no podía ser menos, quería seguir sus huellas fielmente.

A los veinte años de su heroico martirio Urbano VIII lo beatificó con el honroso título de «apóstol de la unidad católica». Más tarde fue canonizado por el Papa Pío IX.

DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados “miembros inscritos y activos” cuando:

1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Si está de vacaciones por un tiempo prolongado, por favor, notifíquenos, para mantener su estado activo; igualmente si es por enfermedad, y así, además, lo incluiremos en nuestras oraciones.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo solo se pueden tomar en cuenta cuando se colocan en la colecta dentro del sobre personalizado de la parroquia.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.

Las familias deben ser miembros activos para poder optar a recibir un sacramento. Asimismo, para recibir un descuento en el costo educacional tanto del Colegio Católico Blessed Sacrament como de la secundaria Bishop England.

Las familias con estudiantes en la Formación en la Fe y los colegios mencionados deben mantener su estado de miembro activo, permanentemente.

Celebración de Sacramentos

Bautismo. Los padres que deseen bautizar a sus hijos deben comunicarse con la oficina parroquial por lo menos 3 meses antes de la fecha estimada para informarse del proceso. Una sesión preparatoria es obligatoria para los padres y padrinos. A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe y los adultos a través del programa de Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Si ha estado casado anteriormente, le sugerimos iniciar más de un año antes si no ha obtenido una declaración de nulidad.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de Miembro Activo.
