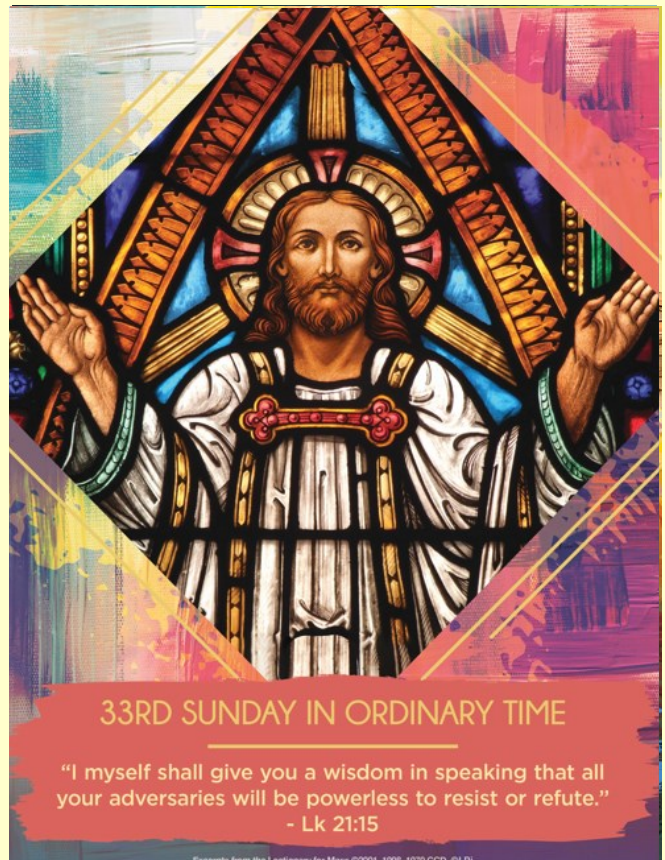

WE WELCOME ALL NEWCOMERS AND VISITORS TO BLESSED SACRAMENT CATHOLIC CHURCH. If you would like to register at Blessed Sacrament, registration forms are available at the back of the church, in the parish office, or you may register online at blsac.org.

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory class is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a wedding.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION: Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please email blsacfaithformation@gmail.com.

VISITING THE SICK: Please inform the Parish Office should a relative/friend who is homebound/hospitalized need a pastoral visit or the Sacrament of Anointing. A priest will attend to the Sacrament.

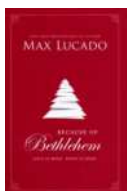

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Elizabeth of Hungary



Given Name:	Elizabeth
Period:	July 7, 1207- November 17, 1231
Place of Birth:	Pozsony, Kingdom of Hungary (modern-day Bratislava, Slovakia)
Parents:	Andrew II of Hungary & Gertrude of Merania
Canonization:	May 27, 1235
Feast Day:	November 17
Patron of:	hospitals; nurses; falsely accused people; bakers; brides; countesses; dying children; exiles; homeless people; lace-makers; widows, etc.

Elizabeth was the daughter of King Andrew II of Hungary. There are different stories about her early childhood. Elizabeth was brought to the court of the rulers of *Thuringia* in central Germany, to be betrothed to Louis IV, Landgrave of Thuringia (also known as Ludwig IV), a future union which would reinforce political alliances between the two families. Elizabeth was raised by the Thuringian court and would have been familiar with the local language and culture. She was married to Louis when she was fourteen. In 1221, during the same year of their marriage, Louis was enthroned as *landgrave*, a title below *duke* and above *count*.

As a teenager Elizabeth learned the ideals of Francis of Assisi, and started living them. Louis was not upset with her acts of charity, believing that they would be rewarded in eternal life. Though not canonized, Louis is considered a saint in Thuringia.

Fr. Konrad von Marburg was appointed Elizabeth's confessor and spiritual guide. He had great influence over her. In the spring of 1226, when floods, famine and plague wrought havoc in Thuringia, Elizabeth assumed control of affairs at home and distributed alms in all parts of their territory, even giving away state robes and ornaments to the poor.

On his way to join the Sixth Crusade, Louis died of fever in Otranto, Italy, on September 11, 1227. Elizabeth was 20 when she became a widow, and she delivered their daughter Gertrude a few weeks later. Upon hearing of the tragic death, she reportedly cried, "He is dead. He is dead. It is to me as if the whole world died today."

Following her husband's death, Elizabeth made solemn vows to Konrad similar to those of a nun. These vows included celibacy, as well as complete obedience to Konrad as her confessor and spiritual director. Konrad's treatment of Elizabeth was extremely harsh, and he held her to standards of behavior which were almost impossible to meet. Among the punishments he is alleged to have ordered were physical beatings; he also ordered her to send away her three children. Her pledge to celibacy proved a hindrance to her family's political ambitions. Elizabeth was more or less held hostage at Pottenstein, the castle of her uncle, Bishop Ekbart of Bamberg, in an effort to force her to remarry. Elizabeth, however, held fast to her vow, even threatening to cut off her own nose so that no man would find her attractive enough to marry.

Elizabeth's second child Sophie of Thuringia (1224–1275) married Henry II, Duke of Brabant. Elizabeth's third child, Gertrude of Altenberg (1227–1297), was born several weeks after the death of her father; she became abbess of the monastery of Altenberg Abbey, Hesse near Wetzlar.

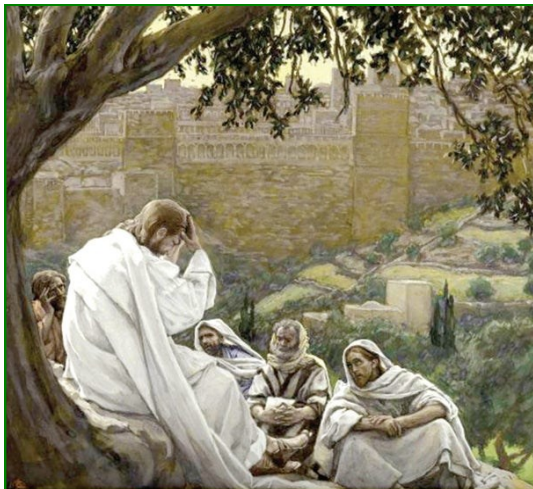


Elizabeth built a hospital at Marburg for the poor and the sick with the money from her dowry; there she and her companions cared for their patients.

Elizabeth died in Marburg at the age of twenty-four on November 17, 1231.

Very soon after the death of Elizabeth, miracles were reported that happened at her grave in the church of the hospital, especially those of healing. On the suggestion of Fr. Konrad, and by papal command, examinations were held of those who had been healed between August 1232 and January 1235. The results of those examinations were supplemented by a brief *vita* of the saint-to-be, and together with the testimony of Elizabeth's handmaidens and companions, proved sufficient reason for quick canonization. She was canonized by Pope Gregory IX on 24 May 1235.

Meditación del Evangelio. 9 de noviembre de 2025.

XXXIII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Lucas 21:5-19

La perseverancia, ¿qué significa esta palabra tan importante? Es mantenernos firmes en nuestros planes y buenos propósitos.

Perseverar en los estudios, en el trabajo y en las relaciones familiares requiere entusiasmo y energía cada día. Nada es fácil, y hoy Jesús nos

invita a no tener miedo ante las adversidades y catástrofes que vemos actualmente, sino a superar las pruebas con fe y confianza en un Dios que no defrauda: "Con todo, ni un cabello de su cabeza se perderá". Y agrega otra frase que nos invita a despertar del letargo espiritual: "Manténganse firmes y se salvarán" (Lucas 21:18-19).

La liturgia de hoy nos ayuda a reflexionar sobre las muchas traiciones, hambres y guerras que azotan a nuestros hermanos y hermanas en el mundo. Sin embargo, a pesar de todo eso, caminamos con esperanza. Nada ni nadie puede arrebatarnos la seguridad de que Dios está caminando a nuestro lado. Pero no debemos dejarnos engañar dejando pasar el tiempo sin hacer nada por nuestro bien y el de los demás. "El engaño es creernos dueños del tiempo. El tiempo no es nuestro. Del tiempo existe solo un soberano: Jesucristo. No os dejéis engañar en la confusión. El cristiano se mueve por este camino del momento, con la oración y el discernimiento. Pero deja el tiempo a la esperanza. El cristiano sabe esperar al Señor en cada momento; pero espera en el Señor al final de los tiempos" (Papa Francisco).

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Presentación de la Virgen

Honramos hoy la Presentación en el Templo de aquella Niña de bendición.

Los orígenes de esta fiesta hay que buscarlos en una piadosa tradición que surge en el escrito apócrifo llamado el «Protoevangelio de Santiago». Según este documento la Virgen María fue llevada a la edad de tres años por sus padres San Joaquín y Santa Ana. Allí, junto a otras doncellas y piadosas mujeres, fue instruida cuidadosamente respecto la fe de sus padres y sobre los deberes para con Dios.

Históricamente, el origen de esta fiesta fue la dedicación de la Iglesia de Santa María la Nueva en Jerusalén, en el año 543. Todo eso se viene conmemorando en Oriente desde el siglo VI, y hasta habla de ello el emperador Miguel Comeno en una Constitución de 1166.

Un gentil hombre francés, canciller en la corte del Rey de Chipre, habiendo sido enviado a Aviñón en 1372, en calidad de embajador ante el Papa Gregorio XI, le contó la magnificencia con que en Grecia celebraban esta fiesta el 21 de noviembre. El Papa entonces la introdujo en Aviñón, y Sixto V la impuso a toda la Iglesia.

DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados “miembros inscritos y activos” cuando:

1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Una familia sin actividad por un tiempo prolongado se interpreta como que la familia ha dejado de pertenecer a nuestra parroquia. Si está de vacaciones por un tiempo prolongado, por favor, notifíquenos, para mantener su estado activo; igualmente si es por enfermedad, y así, además, lo incluiremos en nuestras oraciones.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo solo se pueden tomar en cuenta cuando se colocan en la colecta dentro del sobre personalizado de la parroquia.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.

Las familias deben ser miembros activos para poder optar a recibir un sacramento. Asimismo, para recibir un descuento en el costo educacional tanto del Colegio Católico Blessed Sacrament como de la secundaria Bishop England.

Las familias con estudiantes en la Formación en la Fe y los colegios mencionados deben mantener su estado de miembro activo, permanentemente.

Celebración de Sacramentos

Bautismo. Los padres que deseen bautizar a sus hijos deben comunicarse con la oficina parroquial por lo menos 3 meses antes de la fecha estimada para informarse del proceso. Una sesión preparatoria es obligatoria para los padres y padrinos. A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe y los adultos a través del programa de Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Si ha estado casado anteriormente, le sugerimos iniciar más de un año antes si no ha obtenido una declaración de nulidad.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

*Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de **Miembro Activo**. 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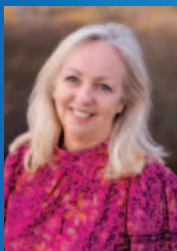
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
