

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory class is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a wedding.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION:

Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please email blsacfaithformation@gmail.com.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John of the Cross

Given Name: Juan de Yepes y Álvarez



John of the Cross is a Spanish Carmelite saint, mystic and doctor of the Church. He is also one of the best Spanish poets. He, along with St. Mother Teresa of Avila (a mystic poet and doctor of the Church), was responsible for the renovation of Carmelite monastic life. Their efforts to go back to the original Carmelite spirituality of penance, meditation, and prayer created tension with the powerful in their congregations, who wanted to lead a more comfortable life.

John was born into a 'New Christian Family' (a family that accepted the Catholic faith in the recent past). His father was rejected by his family for marrying an orphan. After their marriage in 1529, they had to work as weavers to survive. John's father died in 1545, when John was just three years old. In two years, he lost his elder brother, Luis. Catalina moved to Arévalo in 1548 and to Medina del Campo in 1551, in her search to find a job to protect John and his elder brother, Francisco.

In Medina, John started his schooling among poor children and orphans. During those days, he served as an Altar server. From 1559 to 1563, he studied humanities at a Jesuit school and worked at a hospital. In 1563, he joined the Carmelite Order and accepted the name John of St. Matthias. John got ordained in 1567, after successfully completing his Philosophical and Theological studies from the Salamanca University.

In a short while, John considered joining the Carthusian Order, in search of a more austere life, a solitary life that would help him pursue silent contemplation and a hard life. But his meeting with Teresa of Avila, a Carmelite nun, who was trying to reestablish the original Carmelite rule of 1209, changed everything. She was in Medina to establish the second of her new convents that followed the 'Primitive Carmelite Rule'. At Teresa's request, John put his plan on hold and started working with Teresa in August of 1568. Together with another friar, he started a monastery following the principles of Teresa. They started it in a derelict house donated to Teresa. On 28 November 1568, the monastery was established, and John assumed the new name: 'John of the Cross.' Within the next four years, he established two more monasteries that followed the original Carmelite Charism.



At the invitation of Teresa, John came to Avila in 1572 to become the confessor and spiritual director of Teresa and the other 130 nuns in the convent there, as well as a multitude of lay people in the town. The drawing of the crucifixion by John of the Cross was an image from a vision he had somewhere between 1574 and 1577.

The attempts at renovation created a lot of tension among the Spanish Carmelites. The Pope appointed Canonical Visitors from the Dominican Order to supervise the congregation and arrive at an amicable solution. The new dispensation was called Discalced Carmelites, as they went barefoot, or with open shoes, as they opted for a more austere life. Tension grew between the two factions, and in January 1576, John was detained in Medina del Campo by the traditional Carmelite friars. Although he was released at the intervention of the nuncio, things changed at the death of the nuncio on 18 June 1577.

John was once again caught and imprisoned in 1577. John was brought before a court of friars, accused of disobeying the ordinances of Piacenza. Despite his argument that he had not disobeyed the ordinances, he was sentenced to a term of imprisonment. He was jailed in a monastery where he was kept under a brutal regime that included public lashings before the community at least weekly, and severe isolation in a tiny, stifling cell measuring barely 10 by 6 feet. Except when rarely permitted an oil lamp, he had to stand on a bench to read his breviary by the light through the hole into the adjoining room. He had no change of clothing and a penitential diet of water, bread and scraps of salt fish. During his imprisonment, he composed a great part of his most famous poem, Spiritual Canticle, as well as a few shorter poems. The paper was passed to him by the friar who guarded his cell. He managed to escape eight months later, on 15 August 1578.

After being nursed back to health, first by Teresa's nuns in Toledo, and then during six weeks at the Hospital of Santa Cruz, John continued with the reforms. In October 1578 he joined a meeting at Almodóvar del Campo of reform supporters, better known as the Discalced Carmelites. There, in part as a result of the opposition faced from other Carmelites, they decided to request from the Pope their formal separation from the rest of the Carmelite order.

At that meeting, John was appointed superior of El Calvario, an isolated monastery of around thirty friars in the mountains about 6 miles away from Beas in Andalusia. During that time, he befriended the nun Ana de Jesús, superior of the Discalced nuns at Beas, through his visits to the town every Saturday. While at El Calvario, he composed the first version of his commentary on his poem The Spiritual Canticle, possibly at the request of the nuns in Beas.


In 1579, he moved to Baeza, a town of around 50,000 people, to serve as rector of a new college, the Colegio de San Basilio, for Discalced friars in Andalusia. It opened on 13 June 1579. He remained in post until 1582, spending much of his time as a spiritual director to the friars and townspeople.

1580 was a significant year in the resolution of disputes between the Carmelites. On 22 June, Pope Gregory XIII signed a decree, entitled Pia Consideratione, which authorized the separation of the old and the newly reformed, "Discalced" Carmelites. At the first General Chapter of the Discalced Carmelites, John of the Cross was elected one of the "Definitors" of the community and wrote a constitution for them.

In the following years, he helped found more convents and monasteries for the new Discalced Carmelites, meanwhile serving as the Councilor for the Vicar General of the congregation. Following some differences of opinion, he was removed from the post and was sent to a remote small monastery in La Peñuela in Andalusia. He fell ill there, and was taken to Úbeda for treatment. He passed away on 14 December 1591. He is considered one of the foremost poets in Spanish.

Meditación del Evangelio. 14 de diciembre de 2025.

III Domingo de Adviento

¿Dónde está nuestra esperanza en este tercer domingo de Adviento? ¿En qué se basa nuestra alegría? Este domingo es llamado el domingo de la alegría, porque ya estamos acercándonos a la Navidad. En latín



se conoce como Gaudete, que significa "alegría" o "regocíjense". El verdadero gozo consiste en el nacimiento del Salvador, siendo este nacimiento la causa profunda de nuestra alegría. A veces perdemos mucho tiempo en las tiendas, comprando regalos, sin siquiera darnos cuenta de que el tiempo pasa y se va sin provecho alguno para nuestra alma. Miremos al cielo, de donde nos llega la esperanza y la gracia. Ahí es donde está Dios.

El Evangelio nos narra que Juan estaba en la cárcel y quería saber si era verdad lo que había escuchado sobre Jesús. La respuesta para Juan fue la siguiente: "Vayan y cuéntenle a Juan lo que ustedes están viendo y oyendo: los ciegos ven, los cojos andan, los leprosos quedan limpios, los sordos oyen, los muertos resucitan, y una Buena Nueva llega a los pobres" (Mateo 11:5). Con esta respuesta, Juan quedó lleno de esperanza, seguro de que el Reino de Dios ya estaba presente.

Juan predicaba la conversión, un cambio de mentalidad radical, válido tanto entonces como ahora. Para nosotros, la venida del Salvador es un hecho seguro y esperanzador. Sin embargo, solo los pobres de espíritu logran visualizarlo en el horizonte de la Navidad. Aguardemos con paciencia los regalos de la gracia de Dios: la paz y el amor entre nosotros, que tanto necesitamos. ¡Ven, Señor Jesús!

BLESSED SACRAMENT LES DA LA BIENVENIDA A TODAS LAS NUEVAS FAMILIAS Y VISITANTES

¿Le gustaría inscribirse en la Parroquia Católica Blessed Sacrament? El formulario para registrarse en la parroquia se encuentra en la entrada principal de la iglesia, en la oficina parroquial y también en el sitio de internet, blsac.org.

Celebración de Sacramentos

Bautismo. Los padres que deseen bautizar a sus hijos deben comunicarse con la oficina parroquial por lo menos 3 meses antes de la fecha estimada para informarse del proceso . Una sesión preparatoria es obligatoria para los padres y padrinos. A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe y los adultos a través del programa de Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial <u>al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada</u> de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Si ha estado casado anteriormente, le sugerimos iniciar más de un año antes si no ha obtenido una declaración de nulidad.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de Miembro Activo. No podemos emitir tal declaración si usted no es un miembro inscrito y activo de Blessed Sacrament. (Ver "Definición de Miembro Activo").

DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados "miembros inscritos y activos" cuando:

- 1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
- 2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
- 3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Si está de vacaciones por un tiempo prolongado, por favor, <u>notifíquenos.</u> para mantener su estado activo; igualmente si es por enfermedad, y así, además, lo incluiremos en nuestras oraciones.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo solo se pueden tomar en cuenta cuando se colocan en la colecta dentro del sobre personalizado de la parroquia.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.


