

- ~ If you contribute periodically through the collection, please remember to put in envelopes weekly, even if empty.
- ~ Contributions in cash can only be considered when presented in the parish envelope.
- ~ Multiple envelopes put in at a weekend Mass will be considered participation for that one Mass.
- ~ Envelopes Dropped off or Mailed will not be considered participation at Mass.
- ~ Blank Green envelopes are available in the church if needed.

Families must be Active Members for a child to be eligible to receive any Sacrament.

Families must be Active Members to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School.

Active status must be maintained for families in the Schools and Sacramental Program.





LENTEN MEDITATIONS

SIMON OF CYRENE

We know of Simon of Cyrene for one reason: he helped Jesus carry the cross.

“A certain man from Cyrene, Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and they forced him to carry the cross.” (Mk 15:21). “As the soldiers led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on his way in from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus.” (Lk 23: 26).

He was, possibly, a farmer or laborer returning from the field and heading home after a tough day. He was minding his own business and had little interest in the developments in and around Jerusalem. He took up the cross because he was forced to, with no other choice, just as most of us are; it was not a voluntary act of kindness. We seldom get a chance to choose our crosses; we are given them. Even when we want to discard it, we find it glued to the shoulder.

When the cross was on his shoulder, he might have regretted not choosing a different path home. He had to carry the cross just to stay alive; disobeying might even have cost him at least serious injuries. Carrying a cross was not a noble act. He carried it so that he could go home in shape and meet his sons Rufus and Alexander, and his beloved wife. For him, his family mattered more than the ignominy of carrying a cross for a stranger. Simon is the representative of many who do not know why they carry a particular cross, yet have no other option, and they carry it just to survive the day. He is a representative of the millions of farmers and daily laborers who work in harsh environments and hostile climates just to survive. They carry their crosses for us, too. Just as we owe Simon of Cyrene for carrying the cross for Jesus, we owe them for making our world a better place, owing to their hard work and sacrifices. They are seldom appreciated for their contributions.

Simon of Cyrene is a reminder that how we start our journey is less significant than how we end it. Although he took up the cross because he was forced to, he would not regret it in his later years. We have every reason to assume that it transformed him and his family like never before.

According to Bible scholars, Mark wrote his gospel primarily for Christians in Rome, most of whom had a gentile background. It appears that Alexander and Rufus are well known to the Roman Church. There is a reference to Rufus in Paul's letter to the Romans: “Greet Rufus, chosen in the Lord, and his mother, who has been a mother to me, too.” (Rom 16: 13).

Simon's wife and children became prominent missionary leaders in the following decades, as Paul hinted. The mother of Rufus (the wife of Simon) enjoyed a venerable position in the Roman Church, so much so that Paul affectionately called her ‘my mother’. The cross Simon carried made his family a venerable one for eternity. We live in the shade planted by our forefathers, and we have to pass on the favor to the following generation by protecting the shade and planting more shade trees. It is honorable to be known for your parents' legacy. The best way to honor your parents' legacy is to live up to it. Alexander and Rufus did it. The Church in Rome could easily relate to Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus.

Simon of Cyrene reminds us today to look kindly upon those who carry the cross; they may be carrying it for us. He also reminds us to carry our crosses, even if we do not know why.

“Then Jesus said to his disciples, “Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.” (Mt 16: 24).



Meditación del Evangelio - II Domingo de Cuaresma

La liturgia de hoy está llena de símbolos de gloria y majestad. Si estamos atentos, podremos descubrir el gran amor de Dios hacia su Hijo Jesús y también hacia nosotros, manifestado en su Transfiguración. La gloria futura se presenta en la nube como signo de la presencia de Dios, así como en los vestidos blancos y el rostro de Jesús resplandeciente como el sol. "A la vista de ellos, su aspecto cambió completamente: su cara brillaba como el sol y su ropa se volvió blanca como la luz" (Mateo 17:2). La muerte que Jesús había anunciado previamente a sus discípulos, la que iba a padecer, será transformada en gloria en la Pascua. Sin embargo, para llegar a esa Pascua hay que pasar por el camino del Calvario, hacia la cruz. Pedro propuso hacer tres tiendas; estaba tan bien allí, con sus compañeros y con Jesús. De repente, se escucha la voz del Padre que dice: "Este es mi Hijo, el Amado; éste es mi Elegido, ¡escúchenlo!" (Mateo 17:5).



Para ser verdaderos seguidores de Jesús, debemos desinstalarnos de nuestras comodidades y de nuestros caprichos. La Cuaresma, que apenas comienza, debe llevarnos a comprometernos con el bien común y con la justicia que tanto necesita la sociedad actual. La dura realidad que estamos viviendo debe ser también un camino para encontrar la luz y la voz de Dios que nos llama a despertar y actuar frente a las necesidades de los demás. También cabe la pregunta: ¿a quién estamos escuchando? ¿A quién, o a qué, le estamos haciendo caso? Recordemos que seguir al Maestro exige esfuerzo y entrega. Bajemos, pues, de lo alto del monte para caminar con Jesús en esta Cuaresma.

Virtudes Explicadas - Serie para vivir la Cuaresma (Artículo 2)

La semana pasada hablamos de las virtudes teologales, que las provee Dios al alma porque no podemos alcanzarlas por nosotros mismos.

Después tenemos las virtudes humanas. Humanas porque se adquieren con base en nuestro entendimiento y voluntad. Las principales son las **virtudes cardinales: prudencia, justicia, fortaleza y templanza**. Todas las demás se derivan de estas cuatro.

El Catecismo dice que estas virtudes "regulan nuestros actos, ordenan nuestras pasiones y guían nuestra conducta según la razón y la fe". Además, nos ayudan a vivir en paz porque "proporcionan facilidad, dominio y gozo para llevar una vida moralmente buena". Y lo mejor de todo es que no se se siente forzado sino que "el hombre virtuoso es el que practica libremente el bien" (CEC 1804). Entre más las realizamos se nos hace más sencillo decir la verdad, ser puntuales, tener paciencia con los demás, etc. Sobre todo porque las llevamos a cabo de manera consciente, pensando en nuestro bien y en el del prójimo.

¡La Justicia, Explicada!

La "justicia original" es lo que el Catecismo llama el estado de armonía que existía entre Dios, la humanidad y toda la creación (CIC 376) antes de la caída. Aunque la justicia original pereció cuando el pecado entró en el mundo, nuestras almas aún llevan su memoria, y estamos orientados hacia esta virtud como una flor se orienta a la luz del sol: "Bienaventurados los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia, porque ellos serán saciados". (Mateo 5:6)

Se diferencia del resto de las virtudes cardinales porque se orienta no hacia uno mismo, sino hacia los demás, en la medida en que consiste en obrar con rectitud en relación a los otros. Tiene que ver con el cumplimiento de nuestro deber para con los demás y para con Dios (la religión es la justicia que le debemos a nuestro Creador). (...) **Consiste en la constante y firme voluntad de dar a Dios y al prójimo lo que les es debido.**

El hombre justo, evocado con frecuencia en las Sagradas Escrituras, se distingue por la rectitud habitual de sus pensamientos y de su conducta con el prójimo. "Siendo juez no hagas injusticia, ni por favor del pobre, ni por respeto al grande: con justicia juzgarás a tu prójimo" (Lv 19, 15). "Amos, dad a vuestros esclavos lo que es justo y equitativo, teniendo presente que también vosotros tenéis un Amo en el cielo" (Col 4, 1)." (No. 1807 Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica)


La justicia puede ser malinterpretada debido a dos extremos opuestos en su definición.

El primer extremo considera la justicia en términos meramente negativos, como castigar a los criminales que lo merecen. Sería un error pensar en ella solo como para repartir un castigo. La justicia es una virtud que es ante todo algo positivo. **En nuestra relación con Dios, le rendimos honor en forma de amor, servicio y gratitud por ser nuestro Creador. Vivir justamente con Dios es hacer estas cosas perfectamente.**

En relación con nuestro prójimo, Romanos 13, 7 resume bien la acción: "Dad a cada cual lo que se debe: a quien impuestos, impuestos; a quien tributo, tributo; a quien respeto, respeto; a quien honor, honor".

El otro extremo es ver la justicia como un vago y sentimental deseo de ayudar a todos. Esto se hace a menudo bajo el disfraz de "justicia social". La caridad, que inspira compasión, debe motivarnos a ayudar al prójimo, no la justicia.

Por igualdad se entiende la correspondencia o ajuste entre el acto de una persona y lo que debe recibir por ello. Por eso sería una falsa justicia dar a todos lo mismo, pues cada uno, de acuerdo a lo que le diferencia o le es propio, de natural o por su obrar, deberá recibir según lo que ha realizado.

Celebración de Sacramentos

A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe y los adultos a través del programa de Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Visita a los Enfermos. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.

Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de Miembro Activo. No podemos emitir tal declaración si usted no es un miembro inscrito y activo de Blessed Sacrament. (Ver "Definición de Miembro Activo").

- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres de borde verde disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.
