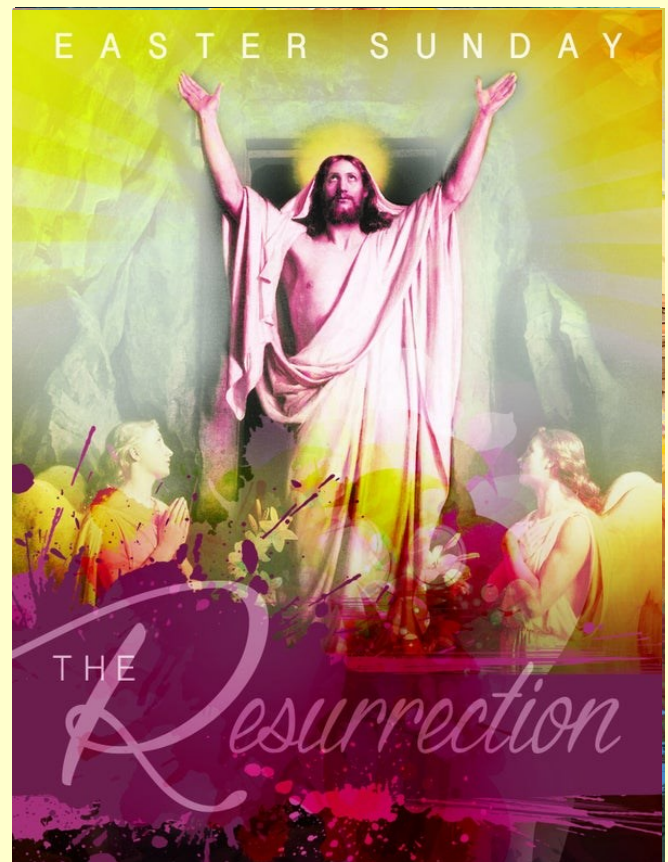

WE WELCOME ALL NEWCOMERS AND VISITORS TO BLESSED SACRAMENT CATHOLIC CHURCH.

If you would like to register at Blessed Sacrament, registration forms are available at the back of the church, in the parish office, or you may register online at blsac.org.

ACTIVE STATUS: Families must be active and maintain active status to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School. Active status must be maintained for families in the schools and in any sacramental program.

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory class is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a wedding.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION: Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please email blsacfaithformation@gmail.com.

VISITING THE SICK: Please inform the Parish Office should a relative/friend who is homebound/hospitalized need a pastoral visit or the Sacrament of Anointing. A priest will administer the Sacrament.

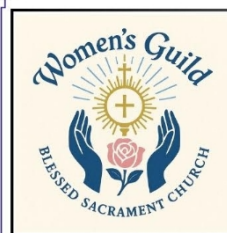

MARY MAGDALENE (THE APOSTLE TO THE APOSTLES)

Mary Magdalene was given the title 'The Apostle to The Apostles' because of her unique role in proclaiming the resurrection of Jesus. She was the first to find the tomb empty (Jn 20:1). Seeing the empty tomb, she doubted body snatching. She ran to the apostles' hiding place and reported it. She returned to the empty tomb along with Peter and the other disciple (John). The disciples returned clueless, but Mary did not leave the empty tomb. Overwhelmed by yet another sorrow, she stayed there crying.

Then she was blessed to see the resurrected Jesus, the first to have such a vision, according to the Gospel of John. It was a dramatic vision. She mistook the man standing next to her for the gardener responsible for maintaining the expensive tomb site. Hence, she requested to see the new site of internment, so that she could anoint the body of her dead master, the purpose of her arrival at the tomb. Although Jesus had prophesied his death and resurrection, neither the apostles nor the disciples, like Mary, had understood it. All she wanted was to give him a decent burial, because Jesus had a hasty burial on that Friday evening. They could not do it on Saturday because it was the Sabbath, and an important one because of the Passover.

Mary was a common name among the first-century Jewish women. There was a group of women who followed Jesus throughout his public ministry and supported him financially; among them were Mary Magdalene (meaning Mary of Magdala) and others (Lk 8:1-3). Whenever this group was mentioned, Mary Magdalene was the first in the list. Luke identifies her as the one "from whom seven demons had gone out." Despite no Biblical or historical proof, she was mistaken as a sinner caught in adultery or even as a prostitute converted by Jesus.

In an era when women's testimony was not counted, Mary Magdalene was chosen to testify to the resurrection of Jesus and was the first to testify to the empty tomb and the first to see the resurrected Jesus. Jesus has a habit of turning the tables. Until Easter, she was one among the many disciples. Easter changed everything. She became a prominent member of the group of disciples. She became the matriarch who woke Peter and the other apostles to the reality of Easter.

Apocryphal writings and later traditions hold that she was a prominent figure among the early Christians and led a life in prayer and contemplation. In Western Europe, there are legends claiming she travelled to Southern France, died, and was buried there.

Mary Magdalene, as a model for all of Jesus' disciples, stood close to Jesus no matter what. Her unwavering commitment to Jesus was a challenge even to the leader of the Apostles, Peter. She stood at the foot of the cross when almost everyone had left. She was chosen to stand beside the resurrected Jesus on the very first day. This Easter, Mary Magdalene invites us to join her at the foot of the cross, and at the feet of the resurrected Jesus.

DOMINGO DE PASCUA

Y ENTONCES TODO CAMBIÓ

La experiencia de la Pascua de aquella mañana era, sin lugar a duda, clara y perfecta: se trataba de ver y creer. Al amanecer, muy tempranito, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro para buscar al Señor; sin embargo, ¡qué sorpresa tan grande! Estaba movida la piedra del sepulcro. De inmediato regresó para avisar a Pedro y a Juan, y les dijo: “Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor, y no sabemos dónde lo han puesto” (Juan 20:2). ¡Qué tremenda sorpresa para ellos! Después de ver sufrir a Jesús en la cruz, ahora estaba desaparecido. Sin embargo, ese no era el plan trazado por Dios para comprender la resurrección de su Hijo. Los más cercanos a Jesús —los que habían caminado juntos, predicando, curando a los enfermos y haciendo milagros— ahora tenían que testificar que Jesús había resucitado, que estaba vivo y que era el mismo que había compartido el pan con ellos.

El Evangelio nos dice: “No habían entendido todavía la Escritura: él debía resucitar de entre los muertos” (Juan 20:9). ¡Cristo vive! En verdad ha resucitado: este es el grito de sus discípulos y de la creación entera, entonces y ahora. El gozo y la alegría deben brotar del corazón de cada cristiano. Alegrémonos con este gran regalo de la Pascua; seamos portadores de paz y no de miedo. Seamos heraldos de esperanza en medio de la hostilidad y el odio que tantas veces paralizan la gracia de Dios en el mundo.

Como vivir después del Domingo de Resurrección

(por Sanabria, Adrian. Archidiócesis de Sevilla)

Decía San Agustín que vivir el tiempo de Pascua consistiría sencillamente en imitar con prontitud las virtudes de María. El imitar a María es unirse más a Jesús porque él se complace al ver que en nosotros hay algo de su madre amadísima. Jesús nunca nos daría, como modelo a imitar, ha alguien que nos apartara de él, así que si nos dio a la Santísima Virgen fue porque ciertamente en ella encontramos a una persona humana que se dio a la causa del amor, que resistió el dolor de ver morir a su propio Hijo en la Cruz, que ante todo, respondió a la voluntad del Padre porque no cualquiera se lanza a la misión que María tuvo, no cualquiera resiste los dolores que ella experimentó, en fin, en ella tenemos a una amiga, a una compañera y sobre todo a una madre en quien confiar.

¿Y cómo imitar a María hoy? La respuesta está en su vida, destacaría 8 detalles:

- ◇ Ante un mundo difícil, María nos invita a ser comprensivos.
- ◇ Ante un mundo marcado por el dolor, María nos recuerda la grandeza del amor de Dios.
- ◇ Ante un mundo teñido por la crítica fácil, María nos exhorta a valorar lo mejor del otro.
- ◇ Ante un mundo con tantas prisas, María nos señala el camino del Sagrado.
- ◇ Ante un proyecto de bien, María nos anima a seguirlo, porque en verdad Ella siempre nos está ayudando y en la medida en que la imitemos iremos conociendo los tesoros de Jesucristo
- ◇ Ante un mundo que no cree en Jesús, María nos dice: "haced lo que él os diga"
- ◇ Ante un mundo cómodo, María nos alienta a ponernos en camino para animar a los demás, al igual que hizo ella con su prima Isabel.
- ◇ Ante la incompreensión de los demás, María nos alienta a ir contracorriente y confiar en Dios.

Imitar a María no nos llevará como destino final a Ella misma sino a Dios, todo lo que pasa por María no se queda en Ella sino que va para Dios, la existencia misma de María no es por su poder sino por la gracia del Espíritu Santo. María es camino y no meta. Sugerentes pueden ser estas palabras de san Juan Pablo II: " Si al contemplar, rezar y bendecir a la Virgen, no nos acercamos más a Cristo y nos encontramos con él, no habremos entendido nada".



En eso llegó también Simón Pedro, que lo venía siguiendo, y entró en el sepulcro. Contempló los lienzos puestos en el suelo y el sudario, que había estado sobre la cabeza de Jesús, puesto no con los lienzos en el suelo, sino doblado en sitio aparte. Entonces entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado primero al sepulcro, y vio y creyó. - Jn 20, 6-8

DEFINICIÓN DE MIEMBRO ACTIVO

Una familia o un individuo son considerados “miembros inscritos y activos” cuando:

1. Han estado inscritos formalmente en la parroquia por, al menos, tres meses.
2. Participan en el culto mediante la asistencia semanal a las Misas dominicales.
3. Colocan los sobres semanalmente en la cesta de la colecta en la Misa, aunque estén vacíos.

Un tiempo prolongado sin actividad y sin notificación, colocará a la familia en un estado inactivo.

- Si usted da su ofrenda en línea, por favor, en la Misa, entregue su sobre vacío. Asegúrese de haber marcado la casilla «I give online», previamente.
- Si usted contribuye ocasionalmente por medio de la colecta de la Misa, por favor, recuerde entregar su sobre semanalmente, aunque sea vacío, y marque la casilla «I attended Mass» que indica que asistió a Misa.
- Las contribuciones en efectivo se registran únicamente si se entregan en un sobre debidamente identificado.
- Si coloca varios sobres en una Misa, estos se consideran como participación en esa única Misa, independientemente de las fechas que indiquen los sobres.
- Los sobres enviados a la oficina no se consideran como participación en la Misa.
- En la iglesia hay sobres de borde verde disponibles para su uso, en caso de ser necesario. Estos tienen un borde verde.

Celebración de Sacramentos

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos. Si ha estado casado anteriormente, le sugerimos iniciar más de un año antes si no ha obtenido una declaración de nulidad.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, pondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos. Interesados contactar la oficina parroquial.
