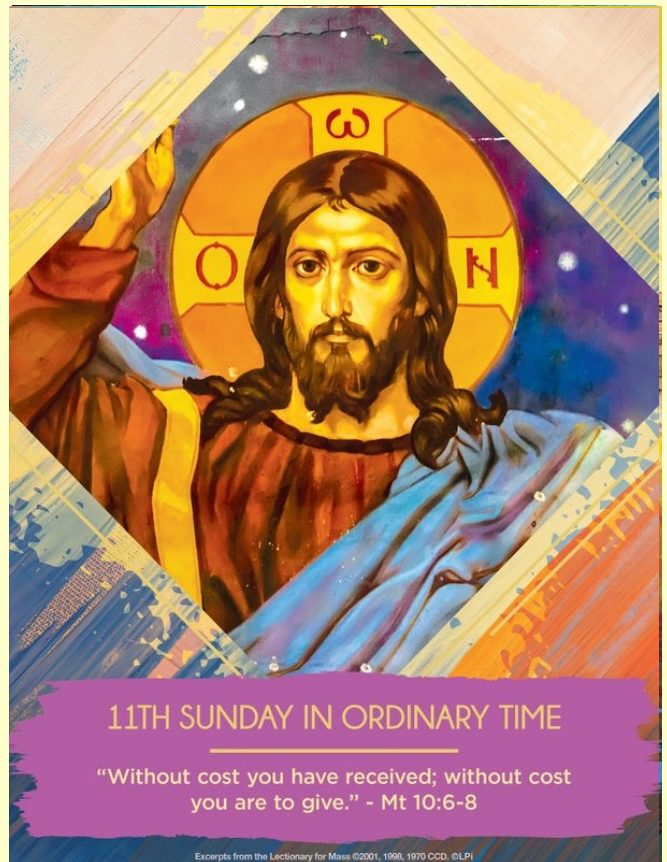

WE WELCOME ALL NEWCOMERS AND VISITORS TO BLESSED SACRAMENT CATHOLIC CHURCH.

If you would like to register at Blessed Sacrament, registration forms are available at the back of the church, in the parish office, or you may register online at blsac.org.

ACTIVE STATUS: Families must be active and maintain active status to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School. Active status must be maintained for families in the schools and in any sacramental program.

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory class is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a wedding.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION: Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please email blsacfaithformation@gmail.com.

Parish Life Center Capital Campaign Update

As we enter the summer months, the Capital Campaign Committee is pleased to share the following update. GBA (architects) met with the city and received new information that should allow us to pivot in our planning to accomplish the *same* goals, at a *lower* financial price point. We are moving forward with GBA to the schematic design phase and will be able to share more realistic plans for the revised Parish Life Center soon.

The Building Committee has selected Hill Construction as the pre-construction contractor. They will be working with GBA during the schematic design phase to confirm revised costs which will determine our new and attainable fundraising goal.

Thank you for your continued prayers of support. We are grateful to our Blessed Sacrament family and look forward to updating the parish after this work is completed (August 2026).

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Romuald



Given Name:	Romuald
Period:	c. 951- June 19, 1027
Place of Birth:	Ravenna, Northeastern Italy
Parents:	Sergius Degli Onesti and Traversara Traversari
Canonization:	1595, by Pope Clement VIII
Feast Day:	June 19
Patron of:	Hermits, monasteries, and those who suffer from eye ailments

The biography by St. Peter Damian, written about 15 years after Romuald's death, is the most reliable source we have. He could have been his parents' only child, as there is no mention of any siblings. He was born in a noble family. In his early life, he indulged in worldly and even sinful pleasures associated with young noblemen. His turning point was witnessing or even collaborating with his father in murdering a relative over a property dispute. Devastated by the tragic incident, Romuald went to the Basilica of Sant'Apollinare in Classe to do 40 days of penance. After spending some time discerning, he decided to become a monk there. Although San Apollinare had recently been reformed, it did not satisfy him for want of strictness in life. His injudicious correction of the less zealous aroused such enmity against him that he applied for, and was readily granted, permission to retire to Venice, where he placed himself under the direction of a hermit named Marinus and lived a life of extraordinary severity.

About 978, Pietro I Orseolo, Doge of Venice, who had obtained his office by acquiescence in the murder of his predecessor, began to suffer remorse for his crime. On the advice of Guarinus, Abbot of Saint-Michel-de-Cuxa, in Catalonia, and of Marinus and Romuald, he abandoned his office and relations, and fled to Cuxa, where he took the habit of St. Benedict, while Romuald and Marinus erected a hermitage close to the monastery. Romuald lived there for about ten years, taking advantage of the library of Cuxa to refine his ideas regarding monasticism. He then spent the next 30 years traveling in Italy, founding and reforming monasteries and hermitages. His reputation being known to advisors of the Holy Roman Emperor Otto III, Romuald was persuaded by him to take the vacant office of abbot at *Sant'Apollinare* to foster a more dedicated way of life there. The monks, however, resisted his reforms, and after a year, Romuald resigned, hurling his abbot's staff at Otto's feet in total frustration. He then again withdrew to the eremitical life.

In 1012, he arrived at the Diocese of Arezzo. Here, according to the legend, a certain Maldolus, who had seen a vision of monks in white garments ascending into Heaven, granted him some land, which later became known as the *Campus Maldoli*, or *Camaldoli*. St. Romuald built five cells on this land for hermits, which, with the monastery at *Fontebuono*, built two years later, became the famous mother-house of the *Camaldolese Order*. Romuald's daunting charisma awed Rainier of Tuscany, who was neither able to face Romuald nor to send him away. Romuald founded several other monasteries, including the monastery of *Val di Castro*, where he died in 1027.

The admonition in Romuald's rule, empty yourself completely and sit waiting, places him in relation to the long Christian history of intellectual stillness and interior passivity in meditation. He taught, "Sit in your cell as in paradise. Put the whole world behind you and forget it. Watch your thoughts like a good fisherman watching for fish. The path you must follow is in the Psalms — never leave it. If you have just come to the monastery, and in spite of your good will, you cannot accomplish what you want, take every opportunity you can to sing the Psalms in your heart and to understand them with your mind. And if your mind wanders as you read, do not give up; hurry back and apply your mind to the words once more."

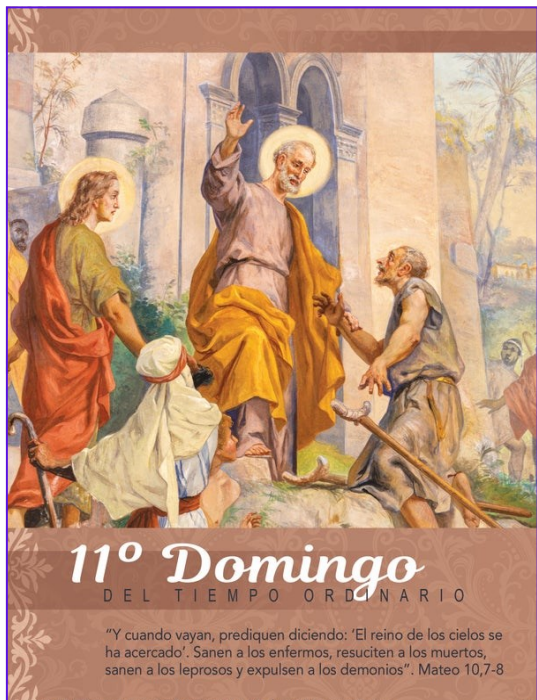

BLESSED SACRAMENT LES DA LA BIENVENIDA A TODAS LAS NUEVAS FAMILIAS Y VISITANTES

¿Le gustaría inscribirse en la Parroquia Católica Blessed Sacrament? El formulario para registrarse en la parroquia se encuentra en la entrada principal de la iglesia, en la oficina parroquial y también en el sitio de internet, blsac.org.

Bautismo. Los padres que deseen bautizar a sus hijos deben comunicarse con la oficina parroquial por lo menos 3 meses antes de la fecha estimada para informarse del proceso. Una sesión preparatoria es obligatoria para los padres y padrinos. A partir de 5 años, los niños deben prepararse en el programa de Formación en la Fe.

Matrimonio. Aquellos con deseos de unirse en el Sacramento del Matrimonio deben llamar o venir a la oficina parroquial **al menos seis meses antes de la fecha estimada** de la ceremonia para comenzar los arreglos.

Visita a los Enfermos. Por favor, informe a la oficina parroquial si un familiar o amigo, que se encuentra hospitalizado o confinado en su casa, necesita una visita pastoral o el Sacramento de la Unción. Un sacerdote lo visitará para el sacramento y, en caso de ser necesario, dispondrá que se le lleve la Santa Comunión a su ser querido.

Sagrada Primera Comunión y Confirmación. La preparación para la recepción de estos sacramentos se lleva a cabo por el ministerio de la Formación en la Fe. La clase para adultos se ofrece a través del programa del Rito de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos (RICA), este programa incluye preparación para el Bautismo, de adultos.

*Los sacramentos deben celebrarse en la parroquia donde se está inscrito. Aquellos que desean ser padrinos o desean recibir un sacramento deben solicitar una declaración que testifica el estado de **Miembro Activo**. No podemos emitir tal declaración si usted no es un miembro inscrito y activo de Blessed Sacrament. Para poder verificar su estado activo, debe usar los sobres personalizados que se le suministran, colocándolos en la colecta cada domingo. La declaración de miembro activo de la parroquia se solicita en la oficina parroquial.*



Memorare o Acordaos ¡Explicado!

El Memorare o Acordaos es una oración a la Santísima Madre en la que el suplicante implora el amor maternal y la protección de la intercesión de María en momentos de una necesidad apremiante. “A Ti acudo, Oh Virgen de las vírgenes, mi madre” se lee en una sección de la oración, que además le ruega fervientemente a “la Madre del Verbo Encarnado” que reciba esas peticiones con amor y

misericordia.

Santa Teresa de Calcuta y San Francisco de Sales fueron dos grandes devotos de esta oración.

El sacerdote francés Claude Bernard, popularizó durante el siglo XVII esta oración derivada de otra oración más antigua y larga denominada “Ad sanctitatis tuae pedes, dulcissima Virgo María” (“a tus santos pies, dulcísima Virgen María”). El nombre de la oración “Acordaos” se tomó de la palabra “memorare” en latín, con la cual comienza la oración. La versión moderna surgió en Raccolta, una colección de oraciones que gozan con indulgencias, recopiladas en 1846.

Madre de Dios, no desechéis mis súplicas, antes bien, escuchadlas y acogedlas benignamente. Amén.

Meditación del Evangelio - 14 de junio de 2026. XI Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario (Mateo 9:36-10:8)

En la sociedad actual hacen falta personas que den testimonio de tu Evangelio en medio del mundo, y si surgen algunos que se arriesgan, tienen miles de trabas para demostrarlo. Las amenazan, las desaparecen y, en muchas ocasiones, les quitan la vida. Y cada uno de nosotros lo debe hacer con un corazón abierto, con una actitud misionera; nuestra oración no debe limitarse solo a nuestras peticiones, a nuestras necesidades: una oración es verdaderamente cristiana si también tiene una dimensión universal” (Papa Francisco, 7 de julio de 2019).
