Introduction

A Muslim mether attacked and called a "terrorist" while picking up her children from school.1 Graffiti near university campuses calling for Jews to be killed." A Hindu family conducting a peaceful ceremony as a Mississauga park, assaulted by two teenagers and having to flee in their car.1 A synagogue in Guelph, vandalized with images of Adolf Hitler. Dozens of Christian churches vandalized or burned, including some on reserves and counting Indigenous families among their members.5

KEY QUESTIONS

- Where are Canadians today in terms of their engagement with religion? Is it shifting?
- Who is religious in Canada today? Who is not?
- Who is in your congregation? Do they believe and practice what your faith tradition holds to be true?
- How do we see ourselves and how do we see our society in embracing a public faith?

THE GOOD...

- The 18234 age group are still comparatively committed within the Christian tradition. They are attending services, reading scripture, and praying.
- Immigrants, especially in non-Christian faiths, are religiously committed.
- Those who are raised in a Christian tradition and participate in religious ceremonies are more likely to remain in the faith they were raised in.

...AND THE NOT SO GOOD

- While a stable number of Christians in the 18⊞34 age group are religiously committed, there is a growing number who are now non-religious.
- A growing number of Roman Catholics and Mainline Protestants do not believe in God.
- Those who self-identify as Roman Catholics and Mainline Protestants are exiting communal worship and are increasingly among the Spiritually Uncertain.

- Belief in God or a higher power

- How often, if at all, a person reads the Bible, Qur'an, or other sacred text
- How often, if at all, a person attends religious services (other than weddings or funerals)









Totals may not sum to 100% due to rounding. The non-Christian faiths are taken from an oversampling of each faith group and may not be fully representative of each faith group, especially given the lack of available data on their sociodemographic characteristics. Figure 15: Total Christians, Religious Indicators, 2017 to 2022





Figure 11: Spectrum of Spirituality, Mainline Protestants, 2017 to 2022

Figure 12: Mainline Protestants, Religious Indicators, 2017 to 2022






Figure 37: Religion in Public Life, 2022





Figure 38: Religion in Public Life, by Religious Identity, 2022




