Diaconal Dan's Deliberation



Friends,

We are starting a New Year—a new liturgical year in the church, as Kathy Underwood reminded us in worship last week. We begin this year with Advent, a season shaped by waiting.

As Dr. Seuss writes in Oh, the Places You'll Go, waiting is often the most frustrating place to be. People "just waiting"—waiting for a train to go; waiting for a phone to ring, or snow to snow; waiting for a pot to boil, or a better break; waiting for the world to change.

Advent is the church's experience of waiting for the birth of Jesus. And in December, both in the world around us and in our faith life, we often find ourselves preparing. Or, to borrow a term used for expectant parents in the final weeks before a child is born, we begin nesting. It's a natural reaction when something long-anticipated draws near: we want to be ready.

"Be ready" is also the message John the Baptist will soon proclaim. But even as we prepare, we are invited to wait. We do not know the hour, as the Gospel of Matthew reminds us this week. But the time will come. Even in our darkness. Even in moments of war or turmoil. Even in loneliness. The time will come—and with it, the world will change.

So let us enter this new year with readiness and hope, watching for the moment when God's light breaks in again.




