## Diaconal Dan's Deliberation



Friends,

February is Black History Month — a time to remember, honour, and learn from the histories, experiences, and contributions of Black people, while also acknowledging stories that were long overlooked, silenced, or misunderstood. It invites us to tell the truth with care and to listen with humility.

Throughout this month, I will be sharing stories of Black experiences within Canadian churches and communities — stories that help us better understand our shared past and present.

Today's story is about Marie-Joseph Angélique, an enslaved Black woman living in Montréal in the early 18th century. On April 10, 1734, a devastating fire destroyed much of what is now Old Montréal. Angélique was accused of starting the fire, arrested, tried, and executed. This occurred nearly a century before the abolition of slavery in the British Empire in 1833.

Historians continue to debate whether Angélique actually set the fire or whether she was accused within a society shaped by slavery, racial prejudice, and fear of resistance. What is clear is that her story reveals the reality of slavery in what is now Canada and reminds us that Black lives were constrained by colonial systems of power and control. Her story calls us to remember the conditions in which people lived, whose voices carried weight, and whose suffering was often dismissed.

During Black History Month, we remember the struggles, contributions, and achievements of Black Canadians, knowing that as these stories are shared, we come to know one another more fully and are invited to live more faithfully into God's call to justice, truth, and compassion.


## **Knitters Wanted**


