



For All Young Families Parent Tips Week Seven

Going to Mass: Plan, Practice, Patience

Rather than being a peace-filled and prayerful experience, Mass time for parents with young ones

can be stressful and chaotic. How can you possibly get a young child who is in constant motion to sit still for an hour? Add other children to the equation and that goal becomes infinitely more difficult! Keep in mind the 3 P's- Plan, Practice, Patience!

PLAN - Don't expect a young child to have the capacity to sit still on their own. Preparing them for Mass (see previous weeks) along with providing them with quiet, Mass related books/activities can help occupy them while keeping the focus on the Mass either on the altar itself or in a book. Keep "Mass Books" separate during the rest of the week so they will be more novel and interesting, as well as reinforcing that Sundays and Mass are so special they even deserve special books! Older children may like to have their own notebook or journal to bring to Mass to jot down words they hear, questions they have or even to be able to sketch something beautiful (windows, depictions of the Stations, etc.)

PRACTICE- As with anything we do in life, the more we practice, the better we get. The same is true for children and Mass. Consistency matters. The more practice a child has, the more comfortable they will become with the routine and the expectations.

PATIENCE- Remember young children are not small adults! No matter how consistent you are, how well you prepare, sometimes it all falls apart. Your children may have had haloes above their heads last week, but this week it seems as though they have never seen the inside of a church before. Be patient. It's not the end of the world, it's just parenthood! Don't give up. Just keep coming! Remember Jesus' words "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them." MT 19:14
