

### **Celebrating Black History Month**

**St. Martin de Porres** was born as Juan Martin de Porres Velazquez in Lima, Peru in 1579. He was born as an illegitimate child of a Spanish nobleman and an emancipated parent of African descent. His father

abandoned the family when Martin was a toddler, and he grew up in poverty. He was able to attend some schooling and learned to be a barber and surgeon. Martin was unable to become a member of Peruvian religious orders due to his mixed race background but served as a volunteer for eight years before finally being allowed to be a member of the Dominican order. He became known for encompassing the virtues need to carefully and patiently care for the sick, even in the most difficult situations.

St. Martin served in the order's infirmary and was known for his ability and devotion to caring for the sick and poor. St. Martin was canonized as a saint in 1962, and is known as the patron saint of mixed-race people, barbers, innkeepers, public health employees, and those seeking racial harmony. Many modern hospitals in North and Central America bear his name in honor of his medical work. St. Martin's feast day is November 3rd.
