




First Communion Class

Good Friday is a Day of Fasting and Abstinence

Adults from 18-59 are urged to embrace these two disciplines. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding for individuals from age 14 onwards.

Hunger in the United States and Globally

As you embrace the disciplines of abstinence and fasting please pray for those who go to bed hungry. Nearly 800 million people across the globe go to bed hungry each night. A projection from Feeding America says that as many as 1 in 4 children are food insecure. It is estimated that one in three families with children in eastern Massachusetts do not have sufficient or quality food.
