



Saints Joachim and Anne

Feast Day: July 26th

Not mentioned in the Bible, Joachim and Anne are first named as the parents of Mary in the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James, which may date from the second century. In this old story, they are old and childless, like the Old Testament Hannah, mother of Samuel, when angels deliver the news that Anne will conceive a child. Anne was an especially popular saint in medieval England, and her feast was celebrated in the West by 1350; Joachim's feast was authorized or suppressed by various popes, but was joined with Anne's in 1969. They are patrons of married couples; Anne is also the patron of childless women, expectant mothers and miners.

"Mary grew up in the home of Joachim and Anne; she was surrounded by their love and faith: in their home she learned to listen to the Lord and to follow his will. Saints Joachim and Anne were part of a long chain of people who had transmitted their faith and love for God, expressed in the warmth and love of family life, down to Mary, who received the Son of God in her womb and who gave him to the world, to us. How precious is the family as the privileged place for transmitting the faith!"

The unit was shut down and repairs are in the works. This is at best a temporary band-aid.

We are still getting chilly air through the radiators but over the next year or two we will need to consider replacing the Chiller Unit located next to the church in the side parking lot. It is 25+ years old. It is in working order as of now providing the chilly air so necessary in these hot months. The cost will be approximately \$125,000.00.

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 20 ~ Last week's readings encouraged us to consider our response to the neighbor. Today we invited to consider the ways of extending hospitality. In the first reading, Abraham enthusiastically welcomes and provides for three strangers who come to him. In addition to warmly greeting them, he provided them water to bathe their feet and had Sarah, his wife, prepare a meal for them. In the gospel, Jesus stops on his way to Jerusalem to visit Martha and Mary. Martha is intent on preparing a meal for Jesus Mary chooses to sit quietly in Jesus' while company. Hospitality takes many forms, whether at home or in our parish. Often it requires that we step out of our comfort zone to make room for a stranger, or someone we know very well. Pay attention today - God may put a stranger in your path who offers you hospitality or someone may be right in front of you who needs hospitality from you. How will you respond?
