

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Classes begin in October each year. Please contact the rectory for more information.



Emergency Church Repairs

Lower Church Side Entrance on Mother Julia Side

The torrential rain of July 10th came rushing into the church side entrance. Several weeks ago we had requested a quote from our roofer to replace the roof. It cannot be fixed at present because "the whole structure is rotted and unstable - it needs significant carpentry work before any roof work is done". I have reached out to Ridgemont construction to do the necessary repairs.

Air Conditioning in the Upper Church

The Air Handling Unit in the rear of the main altar in the upper church which sprung a leak with the water cascading from the unit into the ceiling in the lower Church sanctuary has been repaired.

Over the next few years, we will need to consider replacing the Chiller Unit which is 25+ years old. It is in working order but nearing an end to its life. The cost will be approximately \$125,000.00.
