month after Mass, or anytime by request.

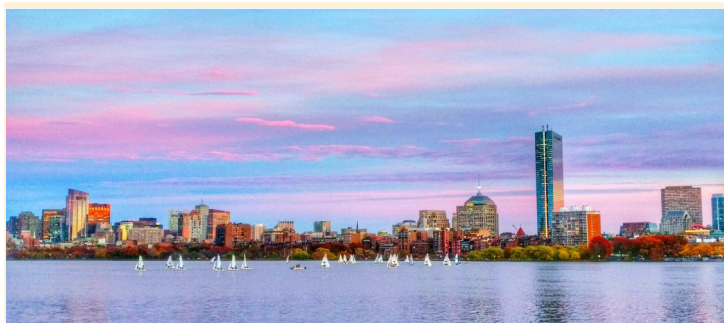
EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: First Saturday of the month

St. Dominic

Feast Day—August 8th

St. Dominic was a great preacher and a worker of many miracles, as his contemporaries attest:

" Brother Reginald, a deeply religious man, who was once a papal penitentiary and afterwards became archbishop of Armagh, tells us that he was present on one occasion at (the Dominican Priory in) Bologna when the procurator went to (St Dominic) complaining that he had only two loaves to set before a large community. Whereupon this faithful imitator of his Lord, taking the two loaves, broke them into fragments, and then full of trust in God, 'who is gracious to all that call upon him, and fills every living creature with his blessing,' he made over them the sign of our redemption, and told the server to go round and put two or three pieces upon each table. When the brother had gone once round the refectory and there was still some bread to spare, he went round it a second and a third time, and yet out of a small quantity in the beginning there was plenty left. What need for further words! The brother continued to supply the tables until all the brethren were satisfied, and more bread was supplied from on high, more than (they) were able to consume."

Emergency Church Repairs

Lower Church Side Entrance on Mother Julia Side

The torrential rain of July 10th came rushing into the church side entrance. Several weeks ago we had requested a quote from our roofer to replace the roof. It cannot be fixed at present because ***"the whole structure is rotted and unstable - it needs significant carpentry work before any roof work is done"***. I have reached out to Ridgemont construction to do the necessary repairs.

Air Conditioning in the Upper Church

The Air Handling Unit in the rear of the main altar in the upper church which sprung a leak with the water cascading from the unit into the ceiling in the lower Church sanctuary has been repaired.

Over the next few years, we will need to consider replacing the Chiller Unit which is 25+ years old. It is in working order but nearing an end to its life. The cost will be approximately \$125,000.00.
