For All Young Families Parent Tips Week One

Getting to Know the Mass Parts

Mass can seem long and unexciting for many children. They don't understand the magnitude of what is happening on the altar,

and they certainly don't feel connected to it. We can help them feel more included by explaining the basic parts of the Mass. This can also help them learn the pattern to the Liturgy, anticipate what is coming next, and gain a sense of a beginning, middle and end of Mass. All this can help young children feel more comfortable during weekly Mass. Begin with the first 2 parts- the Introductory Rites and the Liturgy of the Word. Put these into terms that your children will understand. The Introductory Rites is the time we come together and prepare/get ready for the Mass. The Liturgy of the Word can be thought of as "Story Time" for younger children. We will listen to the First Reading (Old Testament), sing the Responsorial Psalm (Book of Psalms), and listen to the Second reading (New Testament). We will then hear the Priest proclaim the Gospel (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John). Ask your children to listen for "who wrote today's Gospel?" Before or after Mass you can help your child find the statue of the day's Gospel writer (these are located in the front 4 corners of the church!). Following the Gospel, the Priest will offer a Homily during which time he may explain the readings or make a connection between the readings and our lives today. Finally, we conclude the Liturgy of the Word with our proclamation of Faith as we recite the Creed together as a community. The new St. Gregory Mass Time Lending Library has a few copies of Children's Missals to borrow. These may help your child follow along during the Mass and begin to understand the beauty of our Catholic Liturgy!
